

CLUB NOTES

THE SEASON'S GREETINGS to all you Soccer Fans! Did you have a nice Christmas Day with plenty of turkey, Xmas pudding and mince pies? We hope that here at Kenilworth Road this Boxing Day afternoon you will be treated to another feast—football this time—that will make your Christmas holiday complete.

And what better opponents could we welcome to Kenilworth Road this afternoon to serve-up such a match than Manchester United? Yes, the fabulous Manchester United of F.A. Cup, European Cup, Football League and calypso fame! We consider it a great honour to have been granted such worthy opposition for our Christmas fixtures and although this column went into print before the score of yesterday's encounter was known, we are sure the outcome of the match at Old Trafford will not distract us from our expectations of a really great game here today. It is our hope that none of you will be suffering any ill-effects from over-eating yesterday or too engrossed in the traditional Boxing Day procedure of smoking cigars at the match to raise an extra cheer for our lads who have spent so much time this Christmas travelling over half the length of England and back again with a hard match in between.

Our previous meetings with Manchester United in Division One have not been very fruitful for us in the way of points. At the time of writing this column we had not managed to squeeze one single point from the "Busby Babes."

One thing in our favour today is the thought that United have not so far been as effective this season as they were last, and their League record is not quite as impressive despite their recent success in the European Cup. In fact, with the turning point of the League programme just past, they have already lost more matches than they did throughout the whole of last season.

While considering our opponent's record it is as well to look at our own position just prior to Christmas compared with last year.

Although not top of the League as they were on the occasion of their last visit to Luton, the "Busby Babes" are still a great team with many of last season's stars still in form. We are glad to record that this has been fully realised by Town supporters and for the first time this season all Grand Stand seats have been sold a week in advance.

Those of you who by-passed Kenilworth Road a week ago last Saturday, to go and do your Christmas shopping, missed what was a real pre-Christmas cracker!

West Bromwich Albion, our visitors on that occasion, had a record of no away defeat this season to uphold, while we had to make amends for our 5-0 failure at the hands (or should it be the feet?) of Portsmouth, the previous Saturday.

The match presented one of the most sparkling and entertaining displays of soccer seen here for many Saturdays and our lads ran out worthy winners 5-1. This was truly a team triumph, every member pulling his weight, and this allied to the undoubtedly skill of the players made the Albion side look a very average team.

Besides bringing us two points for victory the match brought three other points worthy of recording. The first, and most important, was the 300th League appearance of Bob Morton, a local

player who has rendered such sterling service to the Club. Congratulations Bob! The second is the fact that the first goal of our nap hand was scored by Jimmy Adam and this is his first League goal of the season. Lastly the five goals our lads obtained is itself something of a record.

The completion of our double over Bolton was a grand achievement for we were shocked by their very early goal but fought back magnificently. Ron Bayham did very well to see us through the difficult period following this early setback and the way in which he cut out high crosses from either flank was an inspiration to the team and once they had settled down our half-backs took control.

Our first goal scored by John Groves was richly deserved and he was unlucky with a later shot which shook the crossbar. However, justice was done when Gordon Turner scored his twentieth goal of the season to give us victory.

The match had a double effect. In being the second team this season to beat Bolton on their own ground we gained two well-earned points, and our victory also gave ex-Bolton player Billy Moir, now Manager of Stockport, a real Cup-tie headache!

Those of you who were here last Saturday saw our "Stiffs" attack in a merry Christmas mood against Plymouth Argyle Reserves. Being 4-0 up at half-time they eased up in the second half and finished the match winners by 5-2. Had our forwards been a little more steady in front of goal, the score would surely have been much higher.

We are unlucky this Christmas in that we have two of our Irish full-backs out of action. Brendan McNally has been in hospital for a cartilage operation and is now on the long road to recovery. A week ago last Monday, Bud Aherne sustained facial abrasions when the car in which he was travelling to coach Amersham Town F.C. was involved in an accident. We are, however, in the very happy position to report that Bud left hospital last Saturday afternoon looking quite well again. We are sure we echo your own thoughts when we wish them both a speedy recovery to full fitness.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you that we still have some tickets available for each part of the ground for our Cup-tie at Stockport. Prices are: Grandstand 7/6, Enclosure 4/- and Terraces 2/6. British Railways have announced that there will be a special excursion train for this Cup-tie which will leave Midland Road Station at 8.40 a.m., arriving at Teviot Dale Station (just 10 minutes from the Ground) at 1.5 p.m. The return train leaves Teviot Dale at 5.20 p.m., arriving back in Luton at 10 p.m. The return excursion fare is 25/- and British Railways have stated that there will be a Buffet Car in each direction.

Our Manager, "Dally" Duncan, was confident of our chances after watching Stockport last Saturday. They did very little to impress even their own supporters and went down at home 4-0 to Bradford City, but we shall take no risks for the F.A. Cup is a great leveller (if there is such a word) which makes this competition so attractive.

Should the match at Stockport end all square, the replay will be held here at Kenilworth Road, on Wednesday, 8th January, 1958, kick-off 2 p.m.

Wishing you a continuance of the happy Christmas cheer and goodwill, and two more points in the bag!




