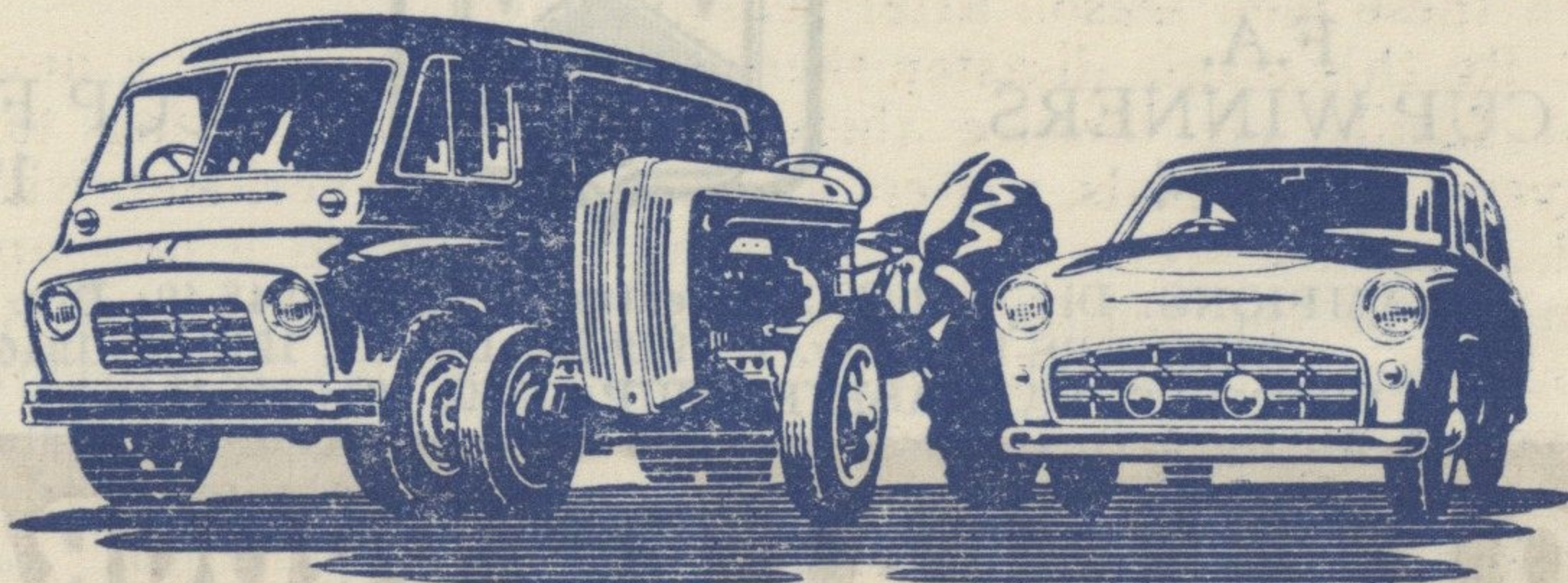

### TURF MOOR MIRROR

Nothing has stunned the public mind in such widespread fashion as did the terrible consequences of the air disaster in which the Manchester United players and officials and so many well-known sports writers were victims ten days ago. Its impact was felt everywhere because the men who died were such intimate people to almost everyone else in this country no matter whether football followers or not. They were men whose names were ever before the public notice by reason of their prominence in the Press in their respective spheres. It is a dreadful thought as we think, and think, and think again of these men, that we shall not see them again. How difficult it is to comprehend of personalities, all of whom seemed destined to be in their familiar places for a long time to come. In the brief moments of that terrible catastrophe at Munich these figures were swept from our midst. Incredible, unbelievable, yet all too true. No wonder such a loss should have caused such universal sorrow, such universal sympathy for their relatives.

What a loss to the game of football. What a loss to the community as a whole and what an intimate loss to all those of us who have mixed with these men season after season.

By this tragic disaster there surely has emerged a new sense of the real family significance there is in football linking together clubs, players, club officials, writers and public. This accident, with its shocking toll, somehow seems to bring us up sharply to a new appreciation of football in the matter of its loyalties, its merits and its true social significance; a reminder that it is something in which everyone can serve to better purpose if goodwill has its true place in the minds of all concerned. Surely the disaster of last week has demonstrated that goodwill is there if only it can be harnessed in its true strength. Could there be a better way of honouring those who died in the service of our great game than to unite in that common endeavour? Surely those Manchester

Manchester United: We shall miss those of your stars who have passed from the scene in such distressing circumstances.

And the **Sports Writers**: We shall greatly miss them, too, for they, even more frequently, have appeared at our headquarters praising our strength, criticising our weaknesses, and, whether their pens discharged tonic or medicine, always welcome guests of whom we shall think with happy recollection.

We are left with very sad thoughts as we think of these fine personalities lost to our company. May those of their ranks for whom the surgeons and nurses are still fighting the battle to restore them to health win through. What wonderful efforts those German surgeons and nurses have made. Always shall we be great admirers of their magnificence and grateful for their work.

As Manchester United bravely carry on, they set the pattern for their associates and may it be that out of the dreadful tragedy that beset their club their courage and example will stimulate the right note for club officials, players and supporters everywhere to play the game with all the virtue they can command. Then will be built a fitting memorial to those who died, those who suffered great physical trial, and those who have been left to mourn their dead.

On Monday evening we shall have here the German team, **Offenbach Kickers**, in a floodlit friendly (kick-off 7-15). Here, surely, is a wonderful chance for us in this area to pay tribute to that wonderful service their fellow-countrymen and women, working day and night in the hospital at Munich, have rendered and continue to render to our fellow-countrymen.

The Offenbach Kickers are over here on a short tour of Britain, and we feel honoured that we have been asked to provide them with a fixture, and more particularly because we have met them before in Germany. That they should wish to renew associations with us is evidence of the friendship our previous meetings with them have created.

Need we state the German side is a very experienced one. Their players are football craftsmen and we feel sure those who attend the match on Monday evening will feel they have been fully rewarded for their effort to be there. We are looking forward to a stylish game with a team that must be proud to be in England at this time when honour to the doctors and nurses of Munich is being spoken in such high terms.

Today we welcome to our headquarters Luton Town, who are putting up some highly impressive performances. They are fifth from the top of the First Division just now and apparently in the mood for notable conquests. Like ourselves, they received a shock in the Cup, but it seems to have stimulated the very best in them. Their 7-1 victory last week suggests they are right in top form.

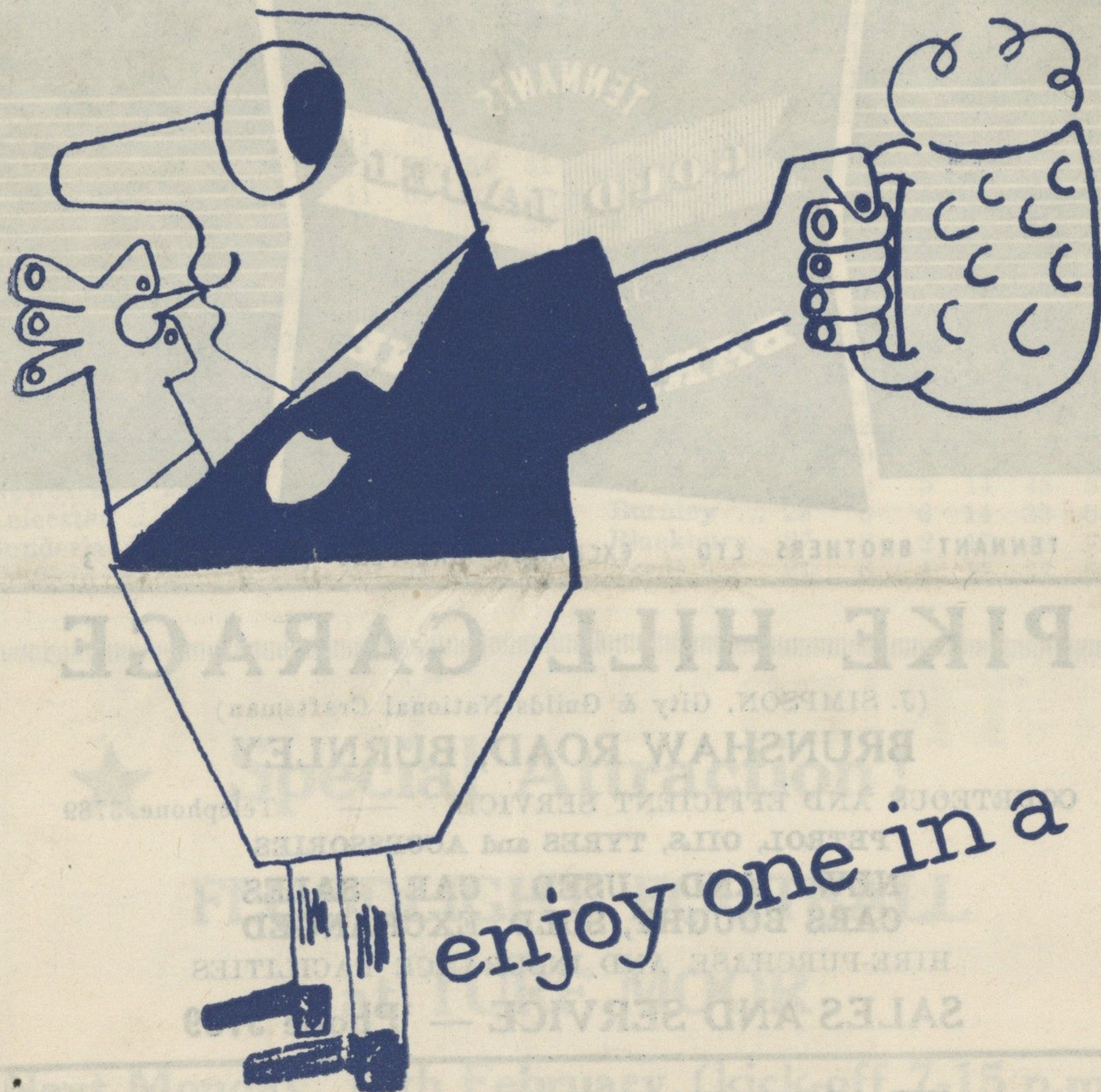
