

## CLUB NOTES

TODAY we are on the threshold of another season, the seventy third since we were formed, with high hopes that this will be the most momentous in our long history. To be members of the First Division of the Football League is indeed a great honour, but so far the chief honours of being League Champions or F.A. Cup Winners have so far eluded us. We feel today we have with the acquisition of Allan Brown recently, and Billy Bingham making his first appearance for us today, a team probably the best we have ever chosen to take the field. Strong in defence with Syd Owen playing as well if not better than ever and the king-pin of the whole defensive plan, with each forward capable and ready to score goals and to play brilliant football, this team is confidently expected to have some success in putting Luton Town among the honours this season. Each year of course every Club starts out with high hopes that 'this is their season', and looking at "Sportsview" the other evening showing several of the leading Clubs in the country going through their pre-season training brought home to many of us the efforts put in by Clubs and players alike to try and bring the few honours there are to that particular Club. And so it must always be, for to approach a season in a pessimistic mood is bound to result in a position far away from any honours. We are therefore approaching this season with great hopes that Sid Owen, in his last season with us as a player, will have the great satisfaction of leading his players to a wonderfully successful season.

We have the pleasure of receiving West Bromwich Albion as our first guests of the 1958/59 season, a name which stands among the foremost of British football. Joining the Football League as one of its twelve founder members in 1888, they have never been in the Third Division—not even Wolverhampton Wanderers can boast this—and have been League Champions (Season 1919/20), F.A. Cup Winners 4 times (1888, 1892, 1931 and 1954), Finalists five times (1886, 1887, 1895, 1912 and 1935). A remarkable record is that of taking part in the F.A. Cup Final three years running, winning it for the first time at the third attempt. Not many people living today will remember those great days, but those who do will perhaps like to be reminded of the players who took part in that memorable match when they beat Preston North End by two goals to one—Roberts; Aldridge, Green; Horton, C. Perry, Timmins; Bassett, Woodhall, Bayliss, Wilson and Pearson. In addition they have been Semi-Finalists of the F.A. Cup on 15 occasions, sharing this great honour only with Aston Villa and Blackburn Rovers. We wonder which of these three will be the first to beat that record, and will it be this season?

A great welcome, we feel sure, awaits Billy Bingham as he takes the field for the first time for us today. We were interested in Billy in 1950 when a Glentoran player, but unfortunately for us Sunderland were also keen on his services and he agreed to join them. Chosen each year to play against England, Scotland and Wales for his country since his first Cap in May 1951 versus France, and having been seen on television playing in Sweden last June in the World Cup series, Billy comes here with a big reputation, one which we feel has been justly earned. He fitted in very well with the scheme of things during our pre-season training at Hanover recently, and we shall be very surprised if we find this capture is not up to our expectations.

When we toured Germany this last close season we stayed at a Sports School in Barsinghausen,

just outside Hanover, except for the few days we spent in Berlin. We were all very impressed with the facilities provided for the sportsman at this School, built amidst a beautiful pine forest, so that when we were invited to carry out part of our pre-season training there we decided to accept, the first time, we think, that an English Club has carried out part of its training on foreign soil. Everybody enjoyed the experience, and we hope it has helped to build up our players ready to carry out the strenuous programme which faces them this coming season. We felt it was an honour to be invited to train at Barsinghausen, the first ever to be given. We are grateful to the President and Officials of the Lower Saxony Football Association for so kindly inviting us and for all they did to make our stay with them so very pleasant and enjoyable.

We welcome the Luton Band again to Kenilworth Road for this coming season for we thoroughly enjoy the music they play. The Band just now finds that the instruments they are using require a thorough overhaul, which will cost in the region of £600. This is a lot of money to find, and so an appeal has been launched to the townspeople to help meet this cost. The Band are very grateful for the collections made on this ground, and we appeal to you supporters to continue making your contributions, putting in just a little extra at times in appreciation of the splendid service the Luton Band renders to us as supporters and to Luton in general.

The Hospital Commentaries' Scheme we are pleased to note goes from strength to strength, thanks to the really splendid efforts of the members of Toc H, Round Table and Officials of the two Hospitals. The Scheme, now in its sixth year, is being extended to the Old People's Centre in Park Street, and just before the match today Mr. Ken Hickman, Chairman of the Old People's Centre (for which he has worked very hard indeed) and our Chairman Mr. P. G. Mitchell, will have the honour of officially opening this extension. We are very pleased indeed that the Scheme has proved so successful and may it continue to be so.

It will be seen that much hard work has been carried out both inside and outside the ground during these last few weeks, and particularly is this noticeable on the playing pitch. Tom King has been a very busy man these last few weeks, ably supported by his assistants, and we think you will agree the turf has never looked better. The practice match held last Tuesday evening, rather left its mark but Tom was soon on the job trying to rectify the damage and today all looks well again. It is surprising what can be achieved in those thirteen weeks for there was not much grass when the last match was played last season.

We have been advised by the Football Association that the International Match between England and U.S.S.R. will take place at Wembley, on Wednesday, 22nd October next. Application for tickets must be received at Wembley, by 1st September, prices (seats) at 50/-, 25/-, 15/- and 10/6, standing 3/6. Anyone wishing to purchase tickets please write to the Secretary, Luton Town F.C., Luton, stating requirements and enclosing a stamped addressed envelope. DO NOT SEND ANY MONEY for we may not receive all we ask for. You will be advised as soon as we hear from the F.A. how many tickets have been allotted to you. Any applications received after August 31st cannot be entertained for it is fully expected that tickets will be over-applied for in the first instance. The England v. Wales match will be played at Aston Villa Ground, on Wednesday, 26th November. Kick-off 2 p.m. Further details of this match will be given in a later programme.
