

CLUB NOTES

AT LAST we have done it. At one time we thought we never would beat Birmingham City, even on our own Ground for whenever they came here they always seemed to have the rub and returned home with a share of the spoils if not the lot. It was not until we met them here in 1953 that we recorded our first victory over them, when we won by two goals to nil, a remarkable match and one that we still remember well for in the first five minutes Mike Cullen dislocated a shoulder. We all felt that with the City always being victorious we would have to wait at least another year before we had any hope of beating that bogey in view of the fact that for the rest of the match we would be playing with literally ten men. But our lads rose magnificently to the occasion, and first Johnnie Downie from a penalty and then George Cummins scored to bring down the house and to record our very first win against them. The following season we beat them again, by an only goal scored by Jimmy Adam and again last season by three goals to nil, but never had we been able to win at St. Andrews. We can now boast that we have done so for last Saturday our lads came away with victory ringing in their ears after a match in which they played some delightful football, and we were without a doubt the better all-round side. Gill Merrick is still a great goalkeeper, showing class in all he does, but how he managed to prevent Allan Brown scoring half-way through the first half only he himself can tell you. It was nothing short of the miraculous. Following this our lads felt that this was one of those days when we just would not be able to score, especially when just previously a cracking first-time shot by Gordon Turner, from a nice pass by Billy Bingham, struck the top corner of the post with Merrick well beaten. But John Groves managed it for us in the end only three minutes before the final whistle, a very fine effort which even the gifted Merrick could not prevent going past him. The Birmingham side, which seemed to have lost heart due to the splendid play of our defence, suddenly came to life following this goal and indeed they struck an upright with Ron Baynham (another splendid goalkeeper of world class without a doubt) vainly trying to get to the ball. Fortunately for us the ball rebounded into play, and the City's last chance had gone of keeping intact their home record against us. A very good victory, thoroughly deserved.

We, tonight, have the pleasure of receiving Leeds United again at Kenilworth Road in a League 1 fixture. This is the team we have never had the satisfaction of beating on our own ground, yet we can boast that we are undefeated at Elland Road. Having come away from Leeds, last Tuesday evening, with a point after a very hard-fought match, the goal scored against us from a penalty which we all felt was a very harsh decision and even then the ball entering our net via the underside of the crossbar, the match this evening should prove an interesting struggle to see if we can at last claim a win over the 'Peacocks,' as they are popularly known, on our own ground. In the two matches played at Kenilworth Road since the Town have been in the First Division both have ended in draws, and one can even go back to the two previous games played in the Second Division which were again drawn, so therefore the records of both Clubs is somewhat similar in that neither Club can manage to be successful on its own ground. Let us hope that tonight will prove the turning point as Saturday did at St. Andrews. This match will also be an opportunity for Billy Bingham to meet his Irish International wing partner, Wilbur Cush, who now captains Leeds.

Our Reserve side started the season well with a magnificent win at Bristol Rovers where after finding themselves 4-1 down, scored four goals in rapid succession and came away with a 5-4 victory. Since then however there was a poor performance at Leyton Orient where they went down by 5 goals to 1 and they again lost on Saturday 2 goals to nil to Birmingham. The team on Saturday was much changed from Thursday evening's team and we had the opportunity of again seeing our young pair of full backs, Tommy Brice and Alan Daniel, in action. Alan Daniel stuck to his task of marking the far more experienced ex-international outside right Gordon Astall and Tommy Brice made a more than adequate partner. It is particularly encouraging to see these youngsters improving with every match. In the two previous matches, Terry Kelly had been tried at right back but in this game he was changed back to centre half and appeared to find the position much more to his liking. Alwyn McGuffie had a fine game at right half and it is disappointing to the Club that we shall most probably be losing him for a time as he has to commence his National Service this week. Whilst on the subject of National Service, we can soon expect the return of Alan Collier and Barry Hawkes. When the Town were in Barsinghausen for their pre-season training both these players were granted leave by their Army Units so that they could join the party. They both proved very useful members and it is hoped that when they return and are able to have more complete training they will develop their already very promising talents.

The newly promoted West Ham United team are our visitors on Saturday and in view of their tremendous success in their opening matches, we feel sure we can expect them to bring a vast following with them. Needless to say we are anticipating a large gate especially if we should prove to be successful in tonight's encounter with Leeds United. The ground record established when we played Arsenal in the Cup some years ago still stands and it may very well be that this will be approached or even exceeded on Saturday. Can we therefore recommend to all supporters that they endeavour to take up their places on the ground as early as possible as when a big gate is achieved, late arrivals nearly always find it difficult to get a good position. The West Ham supporters will certainly be here early.

We apologise to those who turned up to see the Metropolitan League game between our Colts team and Chelsea on Saturday morning. It was decided late in the week to play this match on our Stockingstone Road ground in view of the very heavy rain which fell during the week. The result of this match was that the Town lost 2-nil, but our youngsters played very well and were holding their own until Bud Aherne received a nasty gash on a leg which necessitated nine stitches. He will soon be in action again however, we are pleased to say.

We have received many applications for tickets for the International Match—England v. U.S.S.R. as mentioned in our last programme and cannot say at this stage whether or not we shall be able to satisfy all requirements as we do not know what allocation we can expect. Applicants who have sent stamped envelopes with their applications will be advised as soon as we know the position.






