

CLUB NOTES

THIS afternoon we have as our guests our near neighbours from Upton Park, the team which has certainly caught the eye so far this season. Undefeated in the four matches played to date, including three points taken from the Champions, the "Hammers" are certainly finding their return to League I, which they last experienced in season 1931/32, an experience very much to their liking. Having scored twelve goals against four in obtaining seven points they have given their fans something to shout about and to encourage an enthusiastic following wherever they play. No doubt their efforts this afternoon will receive as much vocal support as our own lads, which is a tremendous encouragement when playing away from home. This match is certainly one of the outstanding ones of the day, a match when anything can happen. Our lads may find the form which obtained them three points in their last two away matches or they may play just as badly as they did last Wednesday; on the other hand the "Hammers" may have their first bad match of the season or they may again reach the heights they experienced at Molineux last Wednesday. Who can tell? We shall be very surprised however if it does not prove to be one of those matches which those who witness it will remember for a long time to come.

The West Ham United Club, formed as a Limited Company in 1900, commenced as Thames Ironworks in 1895. The nickname "Hammers" came from the clanging of "hammers" as the workers of the Thames Ironworks helped to make the warships of that day, and their Ground, known as the Boleyn Ground (Boleyn Castle Grounds in those far-off days) was derived from the fine old mansion next door in which Anne Boleyn, that unfortunate wife of Henry VIII, once resided. The Castle, we are sorry to say, is now almost a complete ruin, but its name lives on in connection with the football club, a situation never envisaged we are quite sure, by anyone connected with the castle in those early days.

The following pen portraits were kindly sent to us by the West Ham Club.

Ernie Gregory. Born at Stratford, London. Schoolboy: West Ham (English Schools Final), Essex, England Trial. Amateur: Leytonstone and West Ham United. Signed pro for Hammers in May 1939, and is the longest-serving pro on Hammer's books. Has made 351 League appearances up to May, 1958. Honours: London F.A., London Combination, F.A. XI, England 'B' v. France 'B' in May, 1952, League Division II winners 1957-58.

John Bond. Born at Colchester, Essex. Schoolboy: Colchester. Amateur: with Colchester United and West Ham United. Signed professional for Hammers in March 1950 and played First League game in 1951-52. Honours: F.A. tour of South Africa 1956; Football League v. League of Ireland; England 'B'; League (Division II) winners 1957-58. 163 League appearances up to May 1958 (41 last season, during which he scored 8 goals).

Noel Cantwell. Born in Eire. Previous club: Cork United. Transferred to West Ham United in 1952, he went from the Third Team to the First XI in one season. Honours: 11 caps for Eire, being the present captain of the national side; Football League (Division II) winners 1957-58. Has played 152 League games up to May 1958 (33 last season, during which he was captain). Also an excellent cricketer he has played for Ireland v. M.C.C., Scotland and New Zealand. Qualified F.A. Coach.

Andy Malcolm. Born at Upton Park, London. Schoolboy: captain of Romford, Essex and England. Amateur for West Ham United whilst on office staff, during which time he played for Essex Youth and England Youth. Honours:

Division II winners 1957-58. First played in League side in 1953-54 and had 154 League appearances up to May 1958 (being ever-present in 1957-58).

Ken Brown. Born at Forest Gate, London. Schoolboy: Dagenham. Junior soccer: Neville United. Signed pro for West Ham in October 1951, and first played in the League side in 1952-53. Honours: London v. Barcelona 1958; two L.F.A. Cup winners; Division II winners 1957-58. 70 League appearances up to May 1958 (41 last season).

Bill Lansdowne. Born at Shoreditch, London. Schoolboy: Hackney. Amateur for West Ham whilst on National Service in R.A.F. Signed pro for West Ham United, February 1956. Honours: League (Division II) winners 1957-58. 47 League appearances up to May 1958 (17 in 1957-58).

Michael Grice. Born at Woking, Surrey. Amateur: Lowestoft Town, Suffolk County junior and senior. Signed pro for Colchester United and transferred to West Ham in March 1956. Honours: British Army, Third Division (South) v. Third Division (North) in 1955; Division II winners 1957-58. 40 League appearances up to May 1958.

John Smith. Born at Shoreditch, London. Schoolboy: East London, Middlesex and London; toured Germany with London Boys. Amateur with West Ham, signed pro in January 1956. Honours: England Youth; F.A. Youth Cup runners-up 1957; L.F.A. Cup runners-up; League (Division II) winners medal 1957-58. 63 League games up to May 1958 (32 last season), scoring 15 goals.

Vic Keeble. Born at Colchester, Essex. Signed pro for Colchester United and transferred to Newcastle United for £15,000; transferred to West Ham United in October 1957 for £10,000. Honours: F.A. Cup winners for Newcastle United v. Manchester City in 1955; League (Division II) winners 1957-58. 29 League appearances for Hammers up to May 1958 (19 goals).

John Dick. Born at Govan, Scotland. Junior: Maryhill and Scotland. Amateur: Crittall Athletic (Essex) and West Ham United whilst on National Service. Signed pro for West Ham in May 1953. Honours: Scotland v. England 'B'; Division II winners 1957-58. 190 League appearances in five seasons up to May 1958, scoring 76 goals.

Malcolm Musgrove. Born at Newcastle-upon-Tyne. Schoolboy: played rugby for Northumberland. Amateur: soccer for Lynemouth Colliery and West Ham. Signed pro in November 1953 after being demobbed from the R.A.F. Honours: League (Division II) winners 1957-58. 109 League games up to May 1958 (scoring 25 goals).

Next Wednesday we have a League I encounter at Maine Road, Manchester, kick-off 7.30 p.m., and next Saturday, here at Kenilworth Road we take on Bolton Wanderers. Then on the following Wednesday, September 17th we have the return mid-week fixture with Manchester City, kick-off 5.40 p.m., which is our last mid-week match until Christmas is once more with us. The opening four weeks of the season with a mid-week match every week great deal of strain is put on the Training Staff working hard to get their players as fit as possible. In talking of Trainers we are very pleased with the appointment we made during the close season of Frank King as our Head Trainer. Frank has settled down remarkably well, already he has 'got' the confidence of his players, despite being such a strict disciplinarian. We feel that Leicester City's loss is our gain.

Next Wednesday evening, September 10th, we have arranged a Metropolitan League fixture with Dunstable Town, kick-off 6 p.m. This match always, as with Bedford Town, creates some excitement as both teams seem to play better in trying to beat us on our own ground. Bedford Town have already beaten us. Come and see what Dunstable Town can do.




