

Let us start by saying that all the followers of the "Lilywhites" that were at the game last Saturday—mingled with the West Ham supporters—must have been quite satisfied, with not only the final result, but with the way our "Boys" steadily but surely beat the methods that the "Hammers" adopted, which in the second half proved that good football does pay dividends.

The attendance was up to 25,715, but we must not over look the fact that the "Hammers" had a very large following. The encouragement they gave to their team was something to be admired. They could not get any points to take away, but they did make sure of something, as one of their supporters won the "Penny - on - the - Ball" Competition.

When a London team comes to Kenilworth Road and gets beaten, one is at a loss to know why so

many excuses are made by some of the "sports writers." We are sure a lot on the field happens that only the writers see, and hundreds of supporters that read all the different reports must wonder if they themselves had been to the game. Some of the press reports are just amusing to read. But it was left to Luton Town to be the first Club to beat the "Hammers" although they had met the 1957-58 Champions, Wolverhampton Wanderers twice.

Our visitors today, Bolton Wanderers, last seasons F.A. Cup winners, had a heavy defeat at Highbury this week, losing by 6 goals to 1, the first time this season they have been beaten. This will make them go all out to try and get two points today. On Wednesday, we paid a visit to Manchester City's Maine Road ground and how valuable that visit was. The draw made a record for us, being the only team in Division 1 still not beaten. So "fans," it is up to you today, to cheer the "Boys" during the whole of the 90 minutes and by so doing you will help them to hold that record.

CLUB NOTES

BOLTON WANDERERS, our guests this afternoon in a League 1 encounter, are the present holders of the F.A. Challenge Cup and until this week's matches were top of the First Division. Added to this our lads have come right through their first six matches of the new season without defeat, so that today's match is one which has all the background of being most entertaining. If Bolton could have avoided defeat at Highbury last Tuesday they would have appeared here in a still more favourable light, but their 6 goals to 1 defeat by the "Gunsners" has to some extent tarnished their halo. The Wanderers however are not the team to allow such a defeat to affect them unduly, and in fact we fully expect them to set about this match today fully determined to prove, if only to themselves, that there is nothing to worry about. This Bolton team doing duty today is the same one which won them the Cup last May, and the point worth mentioning is that each member of the team has graduated through their junior teams, not one of them having cost the Club more than the £10 signing-on fee. Nat Lofthouse, whom we are very pleased to see in action again at Kenilworth Road (despite the fact that he is a bit of a nuisance) scored the two goals which earned Bolton the Cup, has made 31 appearances for his country and scored 30 goals in the process, a record of which he and his Club are justly proud.

Bolton, started in 1874, by the lads of Christ Church in Deane Road under the name of Christ Church F.C. "wandered" from the Church as their headquarters and formed themselves into Bolton Wanderers in 1877, which name they have maintained since. They were one of the twelve founder members of the Football League, and although they have won the F.A. Cup on four occasions they have never yet won the Championship of the First League. The first time they won the Cup was in 1923 (their third attempt in the Final) when they met West Ham in the first match to be played at Wembley. In talking of that match it is sad to relate that David Jack, who died last Wednesday aged 60, was the man to score the first goal at Wembley. When he was transferred by Bolton to Arsenal in October 1928 the transfer fee was £10,890. We wonder what his fee would be these days if he was playing now as he did thirty years ago?

Below are the pen portraits of the Bolton players here today.

Eddie Hopkinson (goalkeeper). Signed for Bolton when 16. Came into the senior team in the early part of 1956 and made such rapid progress that he gained his first full international cap against Wales last season.

Roy Hartle (right back). Although he had to wait three years before becoming a regular member of the league side in 1955, he has held his place ever since. Signed from Bromsgrove in 1952, he played for Bolton in the early rounds of the 1952-53 Cup competition.

Tommy Banks (left back). Graduated through the club's junior teams and succeeded his elder brother Ralph in the League side. Played for England throughout the World Cup. Has played five times for England.

Derek Hennin (right half). Hails from Prescott in the Liverpool district. Joined Wanderers from Prescott Cables, a junior side and took over from the English international Johnny Wheeler. Has been with Bolton for over eight years.

John Higgins (centre half). Became the regular centre half last season having gained his first senior chance four years ago. First played for Buxton, his home town, moving to Bolton after completion of his Army service.

Brian Edwards (left half). A regular member of the side for the past five seasons, he got his chance when Eric Bell broke a leg. Has played in every half back position and occasionally at full back. Comes from Yorkshire and was signed from Poulton Youth Club in 1947.

Brian Birch (outside right). Lancashire born. Joined Bolton from Southport Boys' team and went through the Wanderers' junior sides before becoming a first team player last season.

Dennis Stevens (inside right). Has played for England Under 23's, England 'B' and Football League. A native of Dudley, and a cousin of the late Duncan Edwards. First came into the side at inside left for Harold Hassall but later moved to inside right in place of Willie Moir.

Nat Lofthouse (centre forward). Made his first team debut at the age of 15½ in a war-time league match and is a product of the same school as Tommy Lawton. Has played for England on 31 occasions, the first of them against Yugoslavia in 1951, and has scored 30 goals for his country, a record. Scored the two goals that gave Bolton the Cup last season.

Ray Parry (inside left). Became the youngest player to appear in First Division football, being 15 years 207 days old when he made his debut against Wolves at Molineux in 1951. As a school-boy gained international honours and played for the England Under 23's team last season.

Doug. Holden (outside left). Joined Wanderers from Manchester Y.M.C.A. Made his debut in the senior side in 1951, played in the 1953 and 1958 Cup Finals. Equally at home on either wing, has settled down at outside left.

Following our lads' great win over the "Hammers" here last Saturday when without a doubt we fully deserved the points, another valuable and well-deserved point was picked up at Maine Road last Wednesday when we held the strong City side to a one-goal draw our scorer being John Groves who had a very good match. With a little more luck we could have come away with both points despite playing under the handicap of being a goal down in the very first minute. A flying header by Bingham was adjudged offside—a correct decision we must add—and minutes from the end a Gordon Turner drive intended for the net was deflected on to an upright and in fact it was the City who were the more relieved to hear the final whistle, for we were pressing continuously in those last ten minutes.

You will all by now have been informed that the time of kick-off for next Wednesday's match with Manchester City has been altered to 7.15 p.m. so that the whole of the match will be played under the Floodlights. This will enable all of you who wish to get to the match, where for those of you who cannot get home first from your work tea and refreshments including Brazil's pies will be on sale. We have also taken up with the Police the matter of lights on cars after lighting-up time. The Police have kindly arranged under the circumstances for all those who park under their supervision not to make lights compulsory. They do ask that all car owners co-operate with them in the parking of their cars and so make it easier for all concerned.

We witnessed a very good match here last Wednesday night when we received Dunstable Town in a Metropolitan League fixture. Our lads won by two goals to one, but it was only by a very late goal scored by David Hetherington that we were able to clinch the match.

The B.B.C. cameras are here today making a film of the match to be shown on television Sports Special at 10.15 tonight. Pity they were not here last Saturday to record those four goals!


