

Last Saturday, at Burnley, our boys played a great game, and it was a pity that only 2 minutes were between them and two points. Nevertheless it is something that quite a number of clubs will fail to do, in bringing a point from Turf Moor, and as Fulham won on Saturday, they join us as the only two teams without defeat in all four Leagues.

To assist the boys today, it is up to you, all around the ground, to give the encouragement they rightly deserve. If a bad game should be played don't let us forget seven good ones, and grumble like a suppressed volcano. Preston will demand from our boys all that they can give, if we are to get two points, so, wherever you may be watching the game, do your part, and at the end of 90 minutes, we may be able to say: "PROUD LUTON."

CLUB NOTES

ONCE again we are called upon to meet the team standing at the top of the Table, and on this occasion no less a team than Preston North End, the Club which finished second only to Wolves last season. In the nine matches they have played so far this season they have lost only once, surprisingly at home, Leeds United being the team to have spoilt an otherwise very fine record. In their four matches played "away" to date they, like ourselves, have won one and drawn three, so that today's match has quite a lot at stake in that we could go to the top again if we win or Preston can continue their unbeaten away record and by so doing almost certainly retain their present position on the top rung. When West Ham came here three weeks ago they came as leaders—we wonder what fate is in store for the present holders of that position? Mention of Preston North End would not be complete without reference to their great player Tom Finney, the Preston lad born and bred, holder of twenty-five full home International Caps and goodness knows how many against foreign countries. Preston scored exactly 100 goals last season, 26 of them by Tom, so that with the 34 scored by Tommy Thompson, 60 of those 100 were scored by these two players between whom there is a very fine understanding, which can be a serious menace to any defence. It will be interesting to see how our defence, which so far this season has conceded only eight goals, will cope with this forward line which so far has scored twenty goals this season.

Our lads brought home a very acceptable point from their visit to Turf Moor, last Saturday, but it would have been the maximum if fate had not entered into the fray only two minutes from the end when a long high kick into our goalmouth by the Burnley right half Seith from fully thirty yards out suddenly swerved from Ron Baynham at the very last split second to enter the net just inside an upright, thus gaining for Burnley a point which they had given up all hope of obtaining when all their previous attacks had foundered against our very fine defence. We have received a letter from a Burnley supporter, who sent us a cutting of the match from his local paper, and stating 'in appreciation of your football team which is the best and cleanest I have seen for many a season. I have been watching football this last 45 years, ending by wishing us Good Luck and a Prosperous Season.' Thank you, Burnley supporter, for that appreciation. We always try to play good football, and as our Manager "Dally" Duncan always says to the lads, "Continue to play good football and the results are bound to come." It is gratifying to know that it is appreciated away as well as here at Kenilworth Road. What better value for money could anyone wish to have in the entertainment world than to see the football displayed here a week last Wednesday when Manchester City were our opponents. It was football at its best, by both teams, plus the excitement for until we scored that fourth goal, despite being two goals in the lead, the way the Mancunians fought back when three goals down kept everybody on tenter-hooks and wondering just what was going to happen. It was alright in the end for us, especially when Gordon Turner had turned in one of his specials, but it was a most entertaining match, the kind of football which, if played all over the country, would surely bring the fans rolling back in their thousands.

We are very pleased that Seamus Dunne, George Cummins and our latest recruit Billy Bingham have all been honoured this week by being chosen to play for their country in a full

International match. The two former are playing for Eire against Poland, at Dublin, on Sunday, October 5th, and Billy is playing for Ireland against England, at Belfast, on Saturday, October 4th. This latter honour will unfortunately deprive us of Billy's services at Leicester, but we are pleased to give permission for him to play as we do not like to prevent any player from receiving any honours his country wishes to bestow on him. Seamus and George have to 'show a leg' after the match at Leicester for they have to get to Birmingham Airport only three hours after coming off the field to catch a plane to Dublin. We wish all three an excellent match thus thoroughly justifying their selection, and may it lead to many more for all three.

We have not yet received tickets for the England versus U.S.S.R. match to be played at Wembley, on October 22nd, kick-off 2.30 p.m., but we do know that all tickets we asked for have been allocated to us. Those of you therefore who have already applied for tickets for this match can send your remittance to the Club if you wish without waiting for us to write to you. The tickets would then be sent to you immediately we receive them.






