**And away points must be won the hard way—by fighting for every ball from the first blast of the whistle until the last.**


Against Birmingham on Saturday I felt that we more or less allowed the initiative to be taken away from us through a lack of challenge, and once that had gone, the end was in sight.

# PAY AS YOU PLAY

**SLIGHT** rumbles of discontent are being heard in one or two dressing rooms of Football League clubs from players who, having lost their places in the senior teams through loss of form have had to accept a reduction in wages.

When the League clubs at their annual meeting in the summer decided to raise the maximum wage in the season to £20, it was recognised generally that this amount would be paid to players in the first team.

In other words—PAY AS YOU PLAY. Now that, to the majority of people, is not only fair . . . it is an added incentive to the younger players to make the first team grade—AND STAY THERE.

It should also be an incentive to the established player to make his position secure until the passing of the years compels him to make way.

In the majority of cases that is how it is being accepted, but there are the odd few who object because they have lost their places.

This minority would do better to accept the decision and go into the reserve team DETERMINED TO WIN A PLACE IN THE SENIOR SIDE.

**A BIG** hand today to old friends of ours and the League leaders, Luton Town. In fact they were the only unbeaten side in the First Division this morning.

And the credit is all the more when it is remembered that no fewer than seven of their recognised first team came from junior or non-League clubs to Luton.

That speaks highly of the Luton talent spotting and coaching schemes. The seven are:—

**Ron Baynham**, an England goalkeeper who joined Luton from Worcester City.

Right back **Seamus Dunne**, who came from Shelbourne, Ireland.

Left back **Ken Hawkes** from that prolific Durham County nursery, Shotton Colliery.

**Bob Morton**, right half and reserve for England at Windsor Park today was an amateur with Aston Clinton.

Left half **David Pacey** arrived from nearby Hitchin Town.

Prolific goalscorer **Gordon Turner** was an amateur in the Doncaster area.

And outside left **Jim Adam**, born in Scotland, arrived at Luton from the Spennymoor club.

The four who had previously been with League clubs are evergreen **Sid Owen**, an England centre half formerly with Birmingham; Irish outside right **Billy Bingham**; Scottish centre forward **Allan Brown**, from Blackpool, and the Irish-born **George Cummings** from Everton.

Quite an array of talent, but the better the opposition the better City play; so without being unkind let's hope that unbeaten tag is only a memory after this afternoon's game.
