



WELCOME . . .

To Luton who are the pioneers of professional football in the south of England. They were founded way back in 1885, and employed paid players as early as 1891. They were elected to the Football League Division Two in 1897 but failed to gain re-election in 1900. They came back into Division Three in 1920. They hit the headlines in 1954-55 when as runners-up in Division Two they joined the elite in the First Division.


Nicknamed The Hatters they are remembered by the old school because of the great goal scoring achievement of Payne who made the record score of 55 goals in the Third Division (South) in 1936-37 a record that stands today for the Third Division (South).

They play to crowds of no more than around 25,000 yet are a great side and one that can be relied upon to provide a good game.

It was from Luton that Sunderland signed Reg Pearce and in Gordon Turner they have an inside forward of top class whom United badly wanted a few seasons ago. He played at Gallowgate for the Football Association XI against The Army on Tuesday, October 21.

United will be all out this afternoon to make amends for the failure against Arsenal and if they stage the soccer they did at Highbury, even in defeat, especially during the final fifteen minutes they are favourites indeed to win.



Looking Around . . .

Although Newcastle United went down at Highbury they delighted the 62,801 crowd that included many Geordies sporting the famous colours with a fighting finish that shook the very foundations of Arsenal.

The team for the greater part of the game found the ball running perfectly for the Gunners but shockingly for United. But when this advantage was switched it was the Magpies who were the team of the day.

On the 90 minutes, however, Arsenal were worthy victors and they played with skill and thrust to suggest they will challenge United for honours this season.

It was unfortunate but just one of those things that Len White who has been playing so wonderfully well should have an off day but the truth is Len had little of the right support.

The attendance was the highest this season at Highbury a tribute to the crowd pulling power of the Magpies today.

The third goal scored by Henderson was a doubtful affair and the real turning point. Bobby Stokoe and several other United players up with the play are convinced Henderson scored from an offside position and they did all possible to challenge the referees decision.

Even in defeat United remain well placed for League championship and they can be well satisfied with their late display that was loaded with match winning enthusiasm.

Highbury lights are not to be compared with those at Gallowgate. The arc lamps are just on the top of the stand, no towering pylons and present a glare to players and spectators. They had to go on for the last minutes of the game.

Highbury, however, is a great ground with cover for over 50,000. They also boast an outsize clock which is indeed a useful asset. For the first time, too, they introduced another novelty. At the interval the voice from the loud speakers called out the teams and their respective positions.

We can look forward to a thriller at St. James's Park on March 21 when the return game is played and United on present form should readily take revenge.

In London on a scouting mission was former United skipper Joe Harvey now with Workington. Joe called to see the old team at their hotel before the match and after the game. There are more than one of his old colleagues not in the team at present that Joe would like to sign. He rocked the boat in conversation with Manager Mr. Charlie Mitten but without success at present.

That disputed goal of the 1932 final was very much alive again for in the official programme much space was devoted to it. "The famous over the line incident" the writer said "will long remain a memory".

1.—Manchester City—for their left-back, Clifford Sear. He was an amateur with them when he turned professional with Oswestry Town, to whom City had to pay a fee to get him back.

2.—That when Swansea Town played John King, their Welsh international goalkeeper, at centre-forward throughout a Second Division game against Rotherham United on September 29th, 1956.

3.—Jeffrey Whitefoot, the Nottingham Forest half-back. He was only 20 when he received the then maximum £750 benefit from Manchester United on September, 1954.




