

CLUB NOTES

WE are again experiencing that mysterious run of lost matches, just about the turn of the year, which has been our misfortune these last few years. Each season we commence with a splendid run of success, building up hopes that this year we will really put Luton Town on the map, but somehow no matter how hard we try to avoid it, this break in our fortunes occurs. The galling part of the matter is that apart from last week at Blackpool each of the matches lost recently has been by the odd goal and on each occasion we played well enough to at least avoid defeat. The football has been there right up to the point of putting the ball into the net, and in this final effort the run of the ball without a doubt makes a very big difference. The three goals against us at Blackpool for instance would in normal circumstances have all been prevented but the rub was against us and so we lost. The third goal for instance scored by Eddie Perry was one of those attempts which more than likely would not have found the net if that goal was required to decide the match. The ball could have gone anywhere but it was not our lucky day and it found the back of the net. Before Blackpool had scored there were three reasonable chances of scoring but more by good fortune than good play the ball was prevented from entering the Blackpool net. In the end of course the Seasideers were worth their win, there is no gainsaying that, but we would have been the masters if our better football in the first 30 minutes had materialized in goals.

This lack of success in front of goal has given us much thought these last few weeks, and following last Saturday's match we decided something definite must be done to try and break the spell. No doubt many of you have also given the matter much consideration, and no doubt thought out a team which you feel would bring success. In comparison with the recognised team which has done duty this season the formation of the forward line today appears strange, but it has been done with much thought and with good reasoning, and is a genuine attempt to get Luton back on their winning ways. Let us say at once however that because Jimmy Adam is not in the team he is the one at whom any finger is pointed. Jimmy came to us during the week asking to be played in the Reserve side for two or three weeks as he felt he was going through a patch of staleness—which every footballer experiences to some degree during a season—preferring to play in a side during this period where there is not so much at stake. We all remember his splendid game against West Ham United for instance and we are quite sure Jimmy Adam will soon be back showing us those brilliant runs up the left wing.

Today Blackburn Rovers are our guests, now managed by our old friend and Manager "Dally" Duncan. Blackburn began the season like a house on fire, scoring fifteen goals in their first three matches, but then came a spell of in and out successes which saw them gradually drop in the table. Since "Dally" took over in mid-October they have suffered only one defeat, and find themselves with a three points advantage over us at the commencement of today's proceedings. Blackburn Rovers have undoubtedly a very good side, and at this stage of the season's programme only five points behind the leaders are in a very handy position for honours. In Bill Eckersley, who joined the Club as an amateur, in October 1947 and who has played for his country versus Scotland in 1951, versus Ireland, 1953 and 1954 and against Wales, 1954, they have a very experienced player and a very handy man to have in defence. Ronnie Clayton, another International in the side and

captain, is playing very strongly and worthy of his place in the England side. Brian Douglas, we are sorry to say will not be here today due to injury, but we are pleased to note that Peter Dobing, a youngster of whom great things are expected, is selected to play although at one stage recently he was certain not to play at Luton, for if fit he had been selected to play for the Army against the French army, in Paris tomorrow, and so would not be given leave to play for his Club today. But injury has kept him out of the side recently and we can only assume that the Army have decided not to pick him because of this. He scored 20 goals for the Rovers last season, a very useful bag and so a player to be watched. We notice that Tommy Johnston, the centre forward, transferred from Leyton Orient, in March last year, scoring 8 goals in those few weeks and so playing a very large part in gaining promotion at the end of last season, is in the side again today after a lapse of a few weeks.

Our Reserves put up a most commendable show here last week when they beat a by no means inexperienced Portsmouth side by 4 goals to 1. When it is considered that of our side there were six part-time players and another two in the Services, Brendan McNally, at 23, being the father of the side, then the performance appears even more satisfactory. It was a very good game, with quite a lot of good football, and well worth watching.




