

History in brief. They were founded in 1885 and were the first Southern club to employ professional players. In the Southern League from 1894 to 1896 and were elected to Division II in the following year. "The Hatters" play at Kenilworth Road and were promoted to Division One in 1955.

Cup record. Luton have not got a great Cup reputation behind them—in fact they have never reached the semi-final of the competition. Last season they were knocked out in the Third round on their visit to lowly Stockport County.

Ron Baynham (goalkeeper). He displaced Bernard Streten in the Luton team in the 1952-53 season and two years later won England caps against Denmark, Spain and Ireland.

Brendan McNally (right-back). He had only made occasional appearances for Luton before Dunne was injured last month. Joined Luton from the Irish League club, Shelbourne.

Ken Hawkes (left-back). He was spotted when playing for Shotton Colliery Welfare and has made a big impression.

John Groves (right-half). Originally an inside-forward, Groves has filled both the centre-forward and wing-half berths with equal success since joining Luton from school.

Syd Owen (centre-half). Since joining the club from Birmingham in 1947 Owen has won England caps against Hungary, Yugoslavia and Belgium.

Dave Pacey (left-half). Joined Luton as a professional in August, 1956. He gained a regular first team place when Reg Pearce moved to Sunderland.

Billy Bingham (outside-right). Luton paid a five-figure fee to Sunderland for the transfer of this Irish international last July. He has represented Ireland in every international since 1952.

Allan Brown (inside-right). A Scottish international with 14 caps, Brown was transferred from Blackpool during the 1956-57 season. He was formerly with East Fife.

Bob Morton (centre-forward). He was chosen as reserve for England against Russia at Wembley this season.

George Cummins (inside-left). An Eire international who was formerly with Everton.

Tony Gregory (outside-left). A local lad who played for Bedfordshire's team in the Southern Counties Amateur Championships. He has recently become a full time professional.


