

CLUB NOTES

WHAT a wonderful Wembley aperitif!

After the very dull and dismal weather of Thursday afternoon when Mother Nature turned on sun, rain, snow and hail in turn, there was some very settled periods and a bright outlook at Kenilworth Road in the evening!

Our rehearsal with Nottingham Forest warmed everyone's heart right from the word go and if this performance is repeated at Wembley there will be no room for any complaints from anyone.

The Forest left out four of the stars expected to appear at Wembley by resting Thomson, McDonald, Burkitt and Dwight, whilst we had our strongest team on show.

The opening minutes were all Luton and our thrust on either wing coupled with the liveliness of Morton and Brown and the scheming of Cummins produced attack after attack. Nottingham Forest, attempting the offside trap too often, were not in the picture and it was well over ten minutes before Baynham even handled the ball. Even then it was after offside had been given against right winger Gray.

We deservedly took the lead when Allan Brown took a neat pass from Bob Morton and calmly sidefooted the ball into the yawning goal. Morton had beaten the offside trap and six minutes later, after a half-hour of play, Brown was through again to beat goalkeeper Fraser and put us two up.

Just before half-time Billy Bingham rose high to head home our third goal from a Tony Gregory cross. Yes, this was scintillating soccer at its best!

In the second half Allan Brown completed his hat trick with a fine shot and then headed home his fourth from a Bingham corner to bring our total to five. Quigley did manage to score a consolation goal right near the end and give the final result of 5-1.

This was a rout indeed and was a fine lesson of attacking soccer which must have impressed even the England International Team and their Manager, Mr. Walter Winterbottom, who were spectators in the Grandstand.

This afternoon, to delight you all, we welcome Manchester United to Kenilworth Road to provide a most interesting and attractive fixture.

Following so closely upon our encounter last Thursday evening with Nottingham Forest, today's match represents the second successive test of our Wembley prowess. Last Thursday we had our Cup Final rehearsal with Nottingham Forest and today, what better and more fitting visitors could we have than one of last year's finalists at Wembley, Manchester United.

Over latter years Manchester United have built up a reputation second to none and their fame has spread to all the four corners of the world. Football League, F.A. Cup, European Cup, have all had the benefit of the excellent soccer continually served up by this famous team; soccer which draws the crowds and really entertains them. Today we can expect no less than their usual best form from every member of the United team.

The fame which has come the way of this great team has been most richly deserved. They have won the League Championship on five occasions in their history, three of these successes having come their way in the last seven seasons. In the F.A. Cup they have made three appearances at Wembley beating Blackpool 4-2 in 1948 and losing 2-1 to Aston Villa in 1957 and 2-0 to Bolton Wanderers in last year's Final. Such a record should prove that once again our opposition is full of talent to test our Wembley strength.

Last season, the United were also well on the road to overwhelming all the foreign competition in the European Cup when a tragedy befell the Club which stunned the soccer world. When the United team take the field this afternoon we are sure all soccer fans present will recall the tragic return of Manchester United, last season, from their quarter-leg European Cup match with Red Star in Belgrade. On that fateful 6th day of February, twenty-three persons died when their aircraft crashed after failing to leave the ground following a re-fuelling stop at Munich. Matt Busby, their Manager, was among those injured but has since recovered to rebuild the team to its former greatness. Having lost so many international stars in this most unfortunate way was a serious setback to the team building programme. But now, here once again is a Manchester United side right bang back in form and on top of the world challenging hard for their sixth Champion-ship win!

Today they will be without one of their star performers, Bobby Charlton, who is on international duty for England at Wembley. We are sure this will in no measure detract any of the interest in this game, for his deputy and all his colleagues are also of the highest calibre. Prior to the team selection many prominent sportsmen were predicting the possibility of the complete United forward line representing England in today's international. Surely no higher or more worthy praise can be made of the Club than such a prediction.

This afternoon we shall be most anxious to record a win over these new "Busby Babes." We are now in our fourth season in the top division of the Football League and as yet we have still to gain our first victory after seven encounters. In all but one of the games we have been on the losing end, and in the other, on Boxing Day, 1957, we managed a 2-2 draw with a goal in the dying last minutes to gain one point. Last November, at Old Trafford, we were defeated 2-1, so there is every reason to wish for a Luton win and adequate revenge this afternoon for all these past failures.
