GOOD afternoon everybody! Once again it's Cup-tie day at Leeds Road, and Town have been favoured with yet another home draw against First Division opponents—this time, Luton Town, last year's defeated Wembley finalists.

Let's hope that Town manager Mr. Eddie Boot has brushed up his "H" plan this week; certainly, when we saw them in training a few days ago, his players were rarin' to go and mete out the "H-atters" the same brand of knock-out treatment they administered to the "H-ammers" in Round Three.

One of the things which Mr. Boot will no doubt have impressed upon his men in their Cup-tie preparations is that while today's opponents are having to fight such a desperate rearguard action to preserve their First Division status it's

vital that they should not be underestimated.

The soccer history books, of course, are full of stories of how lowly First Division clubs generally do well in the Cup.

Indeed, our Kenilworth Road rivals provided a typical instance last time when, although they won through to the Cup Final, they were never out of the last half-dozen places in the table in the closing weeks of the League campaign.

Again, it's worthy of recall that when Town last made the Wembley trek in season 1937-38 they finished up seventh from the bottom of the First Division ladder.

No! there must be no "half measures" today. Town need to win. Despite the glory of Upton Park,

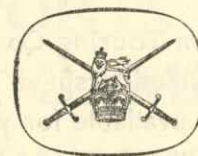

the Leeds Roaders cannot afford to risk their Cup livelihood on replays on First Division opponent's grounds.

What splendid news it would be to learn tonight that Bradford City, Rotherham United, Sheffield United, and Sheffield Wednesday have also won through to the Fifth Round. Make no mistake, this could well be Yorkshire's Wembley year—certainly the Tykes have rarely had it so good in the Third Round for a long time.

Town's new manager (a Yorkshireman, of course) is also firmly intent to do something about Town's unimpressive Cup record of recent years. Last Saturday, he was down at Kenilworth Road to see Luton hammer Fulham 4-1, but since Hill, the Fulham inside-forward was an injury victim from the sixteenth minute it must have been somewhat difficult to make an accurate assessment whether Luton are really on the upgrade again.

Similarly, of course, the visit of Lincoln City to Leeds Road last week-end provided few pointers. City, frankly, were rather disappointing after all the stories we had heard of their much-improved form and particularly their fine performances against Burnley in the F.A. Cup Third Round. All the same, it was good to see Town's attacking machine settling down at full pitch so briskly and once again proving that they're capable of cultured soccer in all sorts of conditions.

Let's hope they keep it up today. And next week, when they visit Second Division leaders Aston Villa—another tussle likely to be as tough as any cup-tie.

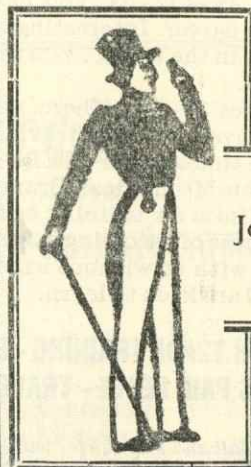

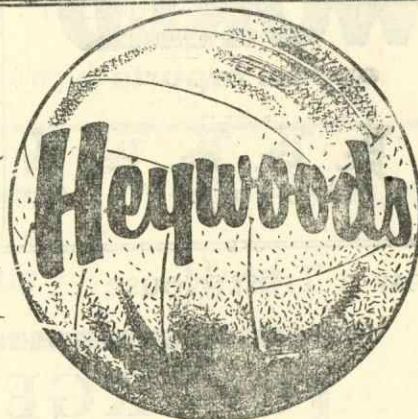

TOWN, having drawn at Portsmouth in the third round of the F.A. Cup, lost the replay and as a consequence a fourth round tie at Leeds Road against Third Division Bristol City. So while Pompey were entertaining the City, Town travelled to Grimsby for a First Division game. Their journey, however, was wasted. Snow and sleet storms overnight and during the morning had left their mark on the pitch and Referee J. E. Williams, of Bolton, called the match off forty minutes before it was due to begin.

Meanwhile in a Central League game against Bolton at Leeds Road, Town tried out a young full-back named Bradford, from Birley in the N.E. League.

Town, with a strong wind at their backs, were a goal up in ten minutes when Anderson (inside-right) crashed in a left-foot shot from a pass by right-half Allen. A chance made by Anderson for Beech was lost because the inside-left tried to walk the ball in, but Town increased their lead after half an hour when centre-forward Parmley converted a centre from Beaumont at close range.

Hesford held a shot from Powell in a Bolton move and Campbell saved brilliantly at the other end from the lively Anderson.

The visitors' attack was more in evidence after the interval but Town's backs and half-backs covered so well that Hesford was not often troubled. The only goal of the half was scored by Parmley in the 65th minute when he bundled Campbell and the ball over the line after the goalkeeper had gathered a centre from Beaumont.

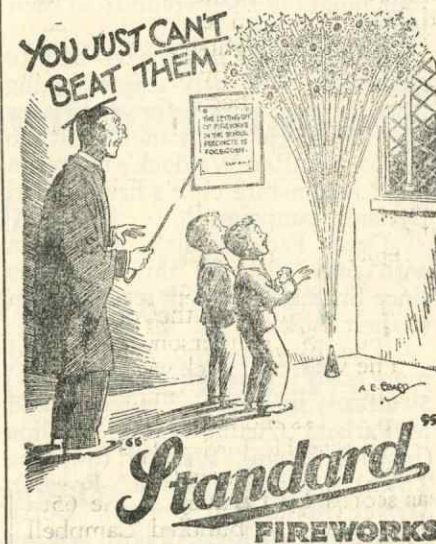

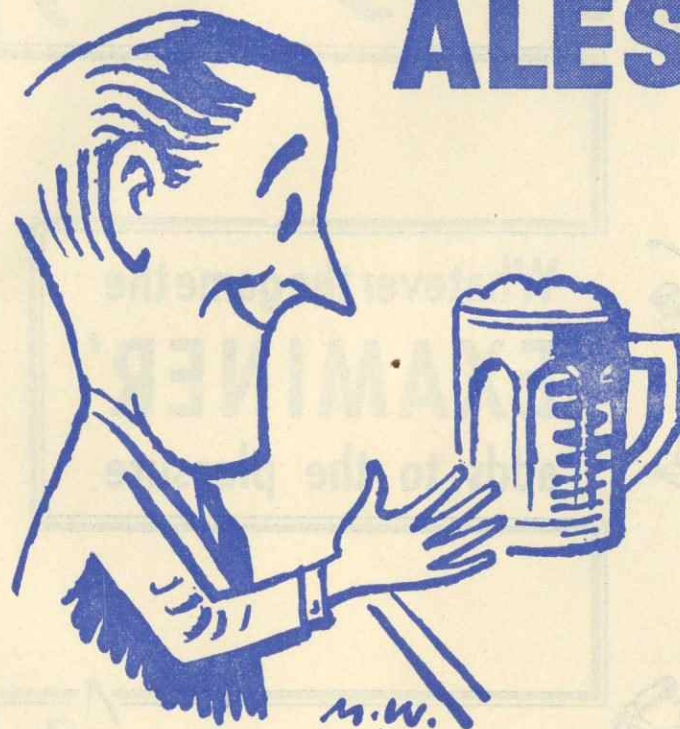
