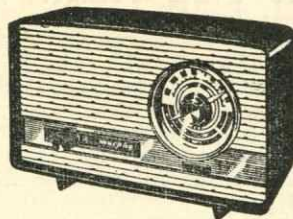

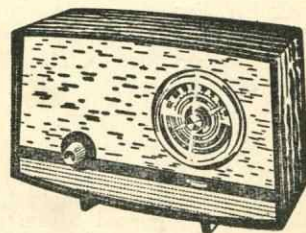

CLUB NOTES

We very nearly came away from St. James' Park last Saturday with a share of the spoils, and no doubt on the run of the play would have done so at least if Gordon Turner had not suffered an injury after only a quarter of an hour's play which left him a passenger for the rest of the match. Even then until Newcastle scored their third goal we more than held our own with only the ten men, despite the fact that we were a goal down after only three minutes' play. Why we were not awarded a penalty when Turner was so unceremoniously brought down by the goalkeeper when right through we do not know. We have had quite a few penalties against us for incidents no where near a violation of the Laws of the Game as this one, and yet nothing was done. This incident was, we feel, the turning point of the game for it came not many minutes after the very clever goal scored by Billy Bingham with his head from a well taken free kick by Ken Hawkes just inside the Newcastle half. The goal which won both points for Newcastle was scored by George Eastham, a wonderful goal but even more wonderful if he intended the shot as produced. Ron Baynham had his goal well covered, and only about ten minutes earlier had saved a shot from Ivor Allchurch under almost the same circumstances with consummate ease although it could quite easily have beaten many other goalkeepers. The shot from Eastham had some power behind it and was rising, yet after passing over Baynham's upstretched arms it zipped suddenly and dropped just underneath the crossbar into the net. As we say, if it was so intended it was a wonderful goal, but we have our doubts that it was so. However it was the effort which cost us at least a point, and so we came away from St. James' Park still further pressed into the relegation ooze. When your luck is out it is out with a vengeance.

We have as our opponents here this afternoon our near neighbours in distress Birmingham City. Three weeks ago the 'Blues' beat Notts. Forest at St. Andrew's by 4 goals to 1 while we were losing at Chelsea by three goals to nil. A week later Birmingham went to Fulham and drew two goals each, Fulham being very fortunate in salvaging a point after being two goals down. Birmingham no doubt were feeling a lot happier following these three points but last Saturday at home to Bolton all their hopes of a revival were smashed when they succumbed by no fewer than five goals to two, thus leaving them at the bottom of the Division next to ourselves, but with a better goal average and one match in hand. Today's match therefore is a very important one for us, for if we lose it there would seem very little hope indeed of avoiding the drop with only seven matches left to play, four of them away from home and all seven very hard matches. We shall keep pegging away but it is going to be a very near thing if we do avoid the big drop. A point last Saturday would have kept the lamp burning a bit brighter for us.

Although our Junior teams continue to do well, the Metropolitan League side winning their match last Saturday at Haywards Heath to continue as leaders of the League, our Reserve side leaves room for thought for they dropped another point at home to Southampton Reserves last Saturday to leave us rather badly placed in fourth place from the bottom. Our forwards had the chances to have won this game comfortably but again bad finishing, on two occasions with open goals, meant that the opposition had only to score one goal to obtain some reward. With only five matches left to play we could be in relegation trouble here if an improvement in finishing is not immediately forthcoming. The postponed fixture with Arsenal

Reserves has incidentally been arranged for Wednesday evening, April 27th, kick-off 6.30 p.m.

So far we have not received any further news regarding a Dutch team playing at Kenilworth Road in connection with the World Refugee Year effort. We are told that about half a dozen First Division Dutch Clubs are at present fighting for the leadership and are at this stage reluctant to break their concentration by coming over to England. We are therefore waiting the next move from that direction.

On Monday night next our Metropolitan League side play West Ham United at Upton Park in the Semi-Final of the Metropolitan League Cup. If we win, the first leg of the Final will be played at Kenilworth Road on Easter Saturday afternoon. On Good Friday we have been pleased to grant permission for the use of our ground to the Luton and South Beds. Football League to stage their Final Tie for the William Pease Jubilee Trophy. The two Finalists are Stockwood Athletic and Belle Vue Rangers of Dunstable, both teams having played very well to reach this stage, and an entertaining match with good football can be anticipated. The Centre Stand at 2/-, and the Wing Stand and Enclosure at 1/6 (Boys 1/-) will be ticketed, rest of ground pay at the turnstiles. Tickets will be on sale as from Saturday, April 2nd, at the Co-operative Stores, Manchester Street, where a display of the trophies and medals, etc. can also be seen. Tickets can also be obtained from any of the Luton Leagues Clubs or from the two Finalists. Mr. John Lake, Manager of the Savoy Cinema, takes a great interest in these boys' activities and is kindly advertising the match on his screen at all performances.

At the beginning of Easter Week, the Luton Schoolboys will be playing another team yet to be announced for the Seaward Trophy. Although the donor of this trophy has passed on his memory is still with us for the very good work he did, particularly for the Old Folks, and we are pleased to see that the Officials of the Luton Schools' F.A. intend to continue the good work. More details of this and the other matches will be given in our next programme in a fortnight's time when we have Manchester United as our visitors.

We received a very pleasant surprise last week when a cheque for £2000 was handed to us on behalf of the Bobbers Stand Club. In view of the fact that many improvements have been carried out lately at the Club we did not expect another Donation at this stage so that was all the more pleasurable to receive as it was so unexpected. We were hoping to use the money to help buy another player before the closing date for transfers on March 16th, but despite great efforts by our Chairman and Manager to bring the player to Luton they have had their sights set on for some little time he would not agree to the move, having just been demobbed and wishing to live at home after being away for the two years. It was a great disappointment for we are certain this player would have completed our forward line at Outside Left which position has caused us some worry for a long time. However although the Donation was not used after all in the way we had hoped it is nevertheless none the more acceptable, and we do wish to thank all of you who took part in getting together this sum for your continued valuable and generous support. Those of you who have not visited our Bobbers Club are invited to do so for it is a very homely Club, with facilities for most games, and a bar second to none. 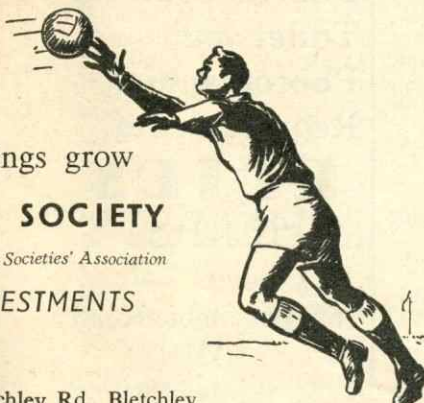
