

AND RECORD OF THE CLUB

RETURN MATCH WITH LUTON

THIS afternoon we give a cordial welcome to our visitors, Luton Town, whom we meet in the return match for that played on November 14th when they defeated us by the single goal of the match. Our visitors are having an anxious time in Division One, and to-day's match is of vital importance for them as it is for ourselves, with a different objective in view. Luton were promoted to Division One at the end of season 1954-55, and in our encounters with them at Tottenham in the past four seasons we have managed to collect full points. In the present campaign, from their 17 matches away from home, they have collected 10 points, having won 2-1 at Manchester City, and 3-0 at Arsenal, with drawn games at Everton, Bolton, Birmingham, Leeds, Blackpool and Leicester. At Molineux and Newcastle they were defeated by the narrow margin of 3-2 in each instance after a splendid fighting display.

Defensively, Luton have a record which compares favourably with that of most clubs in the League; in 35 matches they have conceded only 62 goals, an average of less than two per match, but at the same time their credit total had been only 41. Outside-right, Irish International Billy Bingham, has scored 14 of these, and is the club's leading goalscorer. The next leading scorer is Allan Brown with seven. Since the end of February Brown has been playing in one or the other of the wing-half positions, but prior to that he had done duty in both inside-forward positions, and also as leader of the attack.

Now playing at centre-forward is Joe McBride who was signed from Wolves on February 26th; in his six appearances to date for Luton he has scored three goals, including a penalty which gave his side a point from their match last Saturday with Birmingham City.

At inside-right Gordon Turner has been showing in recent months something of the form which made him such a consistent goalscorer a few seasons ago. George Cummins and John Groves have been contesting the inside-left

position, while among those tried at outside-left have been the ex-England Amateur International, Mike Tracey, from Crook Town who joined the professional staff at Kenilworth Road on October 31st.

Right-back Seamus Dunne has been a stalwart in the defence, and he is the only "ever-present" in the side this season. Also playing consistently have been English International goalkeeper, Ron Baynham, and David Pacey, the latter at centre-half in the last few matches after having played at left-half and inside-right. He has been flanked by Allan Brown and Bob Morton, another of the club's utility men who is now back at right-half after spells as leader of the attack and in the inside-forward positions. At right-back, Ken Hawkes, who made 40 appearances in the League side last season, is partnering Dunne.

OLYMPIC GAMES FIXTURE

On Wednesday, April 13th, our ground will be the venue for the fixture between Great Britain and The Netherlands in the Qualifying Competition of the Olympic Games. The winners of the 15 groups, and Italy, the host country, will go forward into the Competition Proper to be held in Rome next August. The other two countries in Great Britain's group are Eire and The Netherlands. Great Britain has defeated Eire in both matches, and to-day they play the Netherlands in Zwolle. In the only other match played to date Eire and Holland drew 0—0.

The kick-off on April 13th will be at 7.30 p.m. Tickets are now on sale for reserved seats at 7/6 and 5/- and unreserved seats 4/-. Admission to the New Stand will be by payment (4/-) at the turnstiles. Admission to the ground will be 1/6.
