CLUB NOTES

WE very nearly made Tottenham Hotspur, the present League leaders bow to their first double defeat of the season when we met them at White Hart Lane last Saturday, and as it is we have taken three points from them, which gives food for thought. Our defence was magnificent last Saturday, thwarting every move and trick the Spurs' attack could muster, and it was galling that the only semblance of a mistake made throughout the whole ninety minutes should result in the goal being scored against us to bring the scores level and so earn the Spurs a point which kept them at the top of the Table. The ball, shot in at great pace with the very strong wind behind it seemed to rise unexpectedly high after hitting the ground which resulted in Ron Baynham not being able to gather it before it broke away from him. The ball could have gone anywhere, but such is our luck that it went straight to the feet of Cliff Jones who had followed up. He promptly hit it into the back of the net. This goal set the home crowd, which had been fairly quiet until then, very much on their toes for they could smell a victory after all, but our lads weathered the next few minutes magnificently and then Gordon Turner, after beating the right back and goalkeeper very cleverly, hit an upright with a rasping shot when it looked odds-on he would score. Had he not been so anxious to get the ball into the net and so win the match he would no doubt have made a better job of it, but with so much at stake all the time it is difficult to remain cool and collected under such circumstances. It was a most deservedly won point to bring away from this stronghold — but it could so easily have been two!

Our Reserve team hit the high spots during the second half here last Saturday against West Ham United Reserves when, after a goalless first half we rattled in five good goals to win the match by five goals to one. Mike Tracey, who began the scoring with a well-taken lob over the advancing goalkeeper's head, seems to have found his true position in professional football out on the wing, and if he can continue the advance he has shown these last few weeks we need not worry if Billy Bingham is unable to take the field sometime. Billy has been playing very well this season, being our most consistent and effective forward, and so his selection to play for Ireland against Wales at Wrexham last Wednesday was to us a foregone conclusion. This incidentally was Billy's thirty-ninth consecutive cap, a marvellous record but which we feel has been fully justified. George Cummins too was selected to play for his country against Chile at Dalymount Park recently, and fitted in so well in a two-nil victory that he has been selected to take part in the two International matches to be played at Dusseldorf on May 11th and Malmo (Sweden) on May 18th. Our congratulations to them both.

We have the pleasure of the visit of the Manchester United team here today, in search no doubt of two more points to help them get amongst the Talent Money at the end of the season. With six matches to go they are only three points behind the present holders of the fifth position in the Table, and over the strenuous Easter matches it is the Clubs with strong capable reserves which can gain an advantage. The United are one of these teams for their reserve strength is very strong even down to their third and fourth teams. We have never beaten them in the nine encounters we have had to date with them, but if ever a win was needed the occasion is today and we are hoping the tenth meeting proves the

successful one. The United are without a doubt still feeling the effects of that terrible disaster they experienced, and it is to their credit that they have done as well as they have, last season for instance finishing in second place only to the Wolves, with a five point lead over Arsenal in third place. In their last three away matches they have won twice with an aggregate of thirteen goals to four (wins at Blackpool 6-0 and at Fulham 5-0 helping in this) so that they can be as formidable away as at home, in fact they have scored 43 goals on opponents' grounds this season, the highest in all four Divisions. It is a pity that Bobbie Charlton will not be on view here today, but he has a very important appointment at Hampden Park, where for those of us who are Sassenachs, we trust his presence has been most useful.


