

HARRY POTTS calling . . .

ONE cannot refer in this programme to what happened in the Football League yesterday, but whatever the results, our visitors, Luton Town, come to Turf Moor with a heavy responsibility on their shoulders. Before they appeared at Blackburn yesterday they were four points below the safety line. If they met with any success there they will probably feel more at ease in their efforts this afternoon. Otherwise they must face this game with a still greater sense of desperation, for time and opportunity are running low for them.

So that as we approach our task of maintaining our challenge at the other end of the table we must expect opposition that has absolutely nothing at all to spare and is committed to an all-out last bid for salvation.

On successive Saturdays we have met the teams who were at Wembley on Cup Final Day last May. It is strange how both find themselves struggling for their status so soon afterwards. How football fortunes can change!

Our programme is certainly proving all the harder by reason of the majority of our opponents of this month being involved in the relegation battle. But if we can successfully overcome this strenuous spell, then all the greater will be our credit and satisfaction.

The capabilities of Luton should not be read from their unhappy League position. A club with players of the calibre of Ron Bayham, Seamus Dunne, Brendon McNally, Ken Hawkes, Bob Morton, John Groves, Dave Pacey, Billy Bingham, Gordon Turner, Allan Brown and George Cummins would not be expected to fare at all badly and must be capable of rising to considerable heights. And bearing in mind what they were doing only a year ago makes nonsense of their present plight. But such is football. Somebody has to be down in the cellar at the end of a season and one feels sorry that in his first season as manager Syd Owen should be finding it Luton's danger.

Syd was a wonderful player for Luton Town right up to the time when he hung up his boots and turned to management. I am sure that although

his early experiences in his new role have been so disappointing from the results point of view, he will experience many years that will delight him. In management, as in his playing days, there will be no lack of spirit or enthusiasm. He is not the sort to lose heart if this season does not end better than it appears likely to for the team in which he was such a bright star and in which he has so much pride.

Our Reserves got two more points last weekend and in more convincing manner, I understand, than the score line indicated. I hear they played some very good football in approach but did not complement it with the goals they should have had. Maybe they were contending with the sort of conditions our senior team had to cope with at Nottingham. It is only when one is on the field in such conditions that it is possible to realise the handicaps and the problems that arise, especially when it comes to controlled finishing. At Nottingham we had the most fantastic capers from the breeze that I have noted over a long time and from information I have, I gather that there was a great amount of frustration in a similar manner here at Turf Moor. It would appear to have been the case at a large number of grounds up and down the country.

And now I would like to draw your attention to a very interesting match here next Wednesday evening when we have been invited to stage the England-Scotland International match between the Public and Grammar Schools teams of the two countries. The England team for this game is chosen after the Boys' Week at Oxford University. All who take part in the week's activities are considered with a view to selection for the international encounter and there is, naturally enough, keen competition for places in the team. I strongly recommend this game for your patronage. I am sure you will find it well worth while.

A very pleasing invitation has come the way of our chairman, Mr. Lord. He has been invited to attend the annual meeting and dinner of the Football Writers' Association which takes place in London on the evening of the Thursday before the Cup Final. Also in connection with the invitation he has been asked to propose the main toast of the occasion—that of THE FOOTBALL WRITERS' ASSOCIATION. It is on the same occasion that the Footballer of the Year is usually named by the members of this Press organisation.

You will all be familiar, I am sure, with that now interesting annual occasion, Bob-a-Job Week, organised by the Boy Scout Movement to raise money for good causes. We are pleased to announce that the Scouts are taking the opportunity of doing one of their stints here at Turf Moor and on Monday they will have a party of about 24 Scouts sweeping up the terraces of the litter left after today's match.


