



From Bristol City, they have secured wing-half or inside-forward Tommy Cavanagh, who joined Town from Stockport County in 1952 after earlier service with Preston North End; Brian Tickell, who led the Town attack at Brighton in 1959, has moved from Carlisle to Gateshead, now a non-league club.

Conway Smith, former Town and Q.P.R. inside-forward, opens his fifth Halifax Town campaign with a career League record of 153 goals. He and his father, the late Billy, represent the only instance in the history of the game of father and son scoring a century of goals in League football. But another family will join them this season if the son scores 26 goals . . . guess which!

Bill Carter introduces . . . LUTON TOWN

BAYNHAM, R.—Goalkeeper.

This England international, who played against Ireland in 1955-56, took over from another representative player, Bernard Streten. Born in the Midlands, he joined Town from Worcester. Last term Ron made 37 First Division appearances.

DUNNE, S.—Right-back. One of the most experienced defenders in the game, Seamus played here in the previous Huddersfield-Luton Second Division meeting in 1952-53. An Eire international whom the club recruited from Shelbourne, he missed only one League match in 1959-60.

HAWKES, K.—Left-back. One of several players tried in the position to succeed Aherne, Ken, who stands 5ft. 8ins., was signed from Shotton Colliery Welfare, and is a native of the North-East. His First Division opportunities last season totalled twenty-two.

GROVES, J.—Right-half. The son of a former Halifax Town and Derby County inside-forward, John began his career in the attack. Derby-born, he is with his first professional club, and figured in thirty-three of their First Division engagements last season, scoring one goal.

KELLY, T.—Centre-half. A local. Terry has moved into the spot vacated a year ago by Syd Owen, who is on the Leeds staff after a spell as Luton's manager. Was signed from Vauxhall Motors and appeared in more than thirty Football League matches in 1959-60, when Luton were relegated.

BROWN, A.—Left-half. Leeds Road is a ground of which Alan has

unhappy injury memories. We hope he is more fortunate this afternoon. This former Blackpool and East Fife inside-forward switched to the middle line last season. Was second top scorer with seven First Division goals.

BINGHAM, W.—Right-winger.

This hard-shooting ex-Sunderland type re-signed for the club recently. An Irish boy, he missed only two of Town's forty-two League fixtures last season, and scored 16 of their 50 goals. Gained twenty-one international caps with Sunderland, and has six to his credit with Luton.

TURNER, G.—Inside-right.

Gordon, son of a member of Doncaster Rovers 1934-35 Third Division promotion team, was Luton's match-winner here in 1955-56. A highly experienced player and a consistent goal-getter on their behalf until last term when his output dropped to six goals in thirty-one matches.

Although Joe's transfer from Wolves in February was not enough to keep Luton in the First Division his form indicated that he will be an asset in their revival bid this time. Completed the campaign with six goals in thirteen matches. Born Kilmarnock.

CUMMINS, G. — Inside-left.

Injuries handicapped this ex-Everton inside-forward last term. Is expected

to be a valuable forward this time, although he will have to hold off a first-team challenge from Joe Spencer, summer signing from Rochdale.

IMLACH, S. — Left-winger. Luton's major close-season signing, Stewart, a Scot, was formerly with Nottingham Forest, and a member of their 1959 Wembley-winning team against Luton Town. In First Division football last term he made 30 appearances and scored four goals.

TOWN opened the 1935-36 season with newcomer Len Butt from Macclesfield at inside-right and Mountford at left-back for the injured Roughton. Preston's line-up included Bill Shankly at right-half.

North End's new left-winger from Celtic, O'Donnell, H., was prominent at the start but Craig removed the danger and then collaborated with Willingham to put Town in an attacking position. Holdcroft twice cut out high balls and Richardson shot over after Lythgoe had won a heading tussle.

Both centre-halves distinguished themselves after this and when Craig fouled H. O'Donnell Turner fisted out the free kick. Shankly was spoken to after a foul on Butt. Turner did well to keep out a curling shot from F. O'Donnell and Town replied with a swift raid which ended with Lang testing Holdcroft.

In subsequent exchanges both attacks were repeatedly pulled up for offside but in one Preston move Turner had to go full length to save from Maxwell.

Town began the second half in spirited style and Willingham and Lythgoe went close. Holdcroft also held a high shot from Richardson and then saved at the foot of the post from Lang.

Town were now doing most of the attacking and after 64 minutes went ahead through Richardson, who crashed in a fine shot after Lythgoe had pushed the ball back to him. In the later stages Holdcroft made splendid saves from Lythgoe and Luke, and Lang missed two good chances created by Luke.

Close Season Transfer Activity at Leeds Road

Since the 1959-60 season ended, Town have signed two forwards, transferred two, and appointed a new coach.

Derek Stokes was transferred from Bradford City in a deal which took **Stan Howard** to Valley Parade in June; **Willie Sinclair** joined Tranmere Rovers; and, twelve days ago, **Jimmy Kerray** was recruited from the Scottish First Division club, Dunfermline.

Johnny Short, former Leeds United and Millwall inside-forward and wing-half, was appointed coach to fill a vacancy created in January when Mr. Eddie Boot became manager.

Stokes, South Yorkshire-born, began his League career with City as a winger, switching to centre-forward soon after Leeds United signed **Johnny McCole**, City leader, last September. He completed the campaign with 25 goals, making his Third Division record 44 goals in 123 games.

Kerray is a 24-year-old Scot, whose transfer was completed after our manager had watched him in a trial game. Dunfermline secured him late last season from Raith Rovers, and he scored four goals for them in eleven matches. With Raith in 1959-60 his record was 10 goals in 23 games. And his overall Scottish League record in 1957-58, 1958-59 and 1959-60 was 32 goals in 87 matches.

Short was an Elland Road player before the war when the United forward line included Dave Cochrane, George Ainsley and Eric Stephenson. Had a distinguished playing career

with United and Millwall before switching to coaching.

Howard's debut was made in an away game against Liverpool in 1957-58. Made 40 Second Division appearances in 1958-59, scoring 8 goals. His career record at Leeds Road was 62 League games and 13 goals. Occupied all five forward positions at one time and another.

Sinclair, who was recruited from Falkirk in 1958, made his debut against Bristol Rovers at Eastville on March 28th, 1959. Completed the campaign with two goals in eight League matches, and scored three goals in seven matches last term, all his goals being against Swansea Town (two at home, and one away.)


