

Our Visitors

TODAY we are opposed to Luton Town and to all our visitors we extend a hearty welcome. The Club was formed in 1885 but did not achieve League status until 1897 when they were elected to Division II. Finishing next to the bottom in 1900 they did not apply for re-election until 1920, when they joined the newly formed Division III. In 1936 they had a good year, finishing second in the table to Coventry City. During that year supporters will remember centre-forward Joe Payne scoring ten goals against Bristol Rovers. Season 1955 they won promotion to Division I, finishing runners-up to Birmingham City who had a superior goal average—both teams totaled 54 points. They reached the Cup Final in 1959 but lost to Nottingham Forest, 1-2. Syd Owen, the Club's centre-half, was appointed manager in succession to Dally Duncan, but only remained manager for one season. He resigned when the Club was relegated last season and was succeeded by Mr. Sam Bartram who joined them from York City.

Their team today will probably be selected from the following players:—

A. S. COLLIER, Goalkeeper. Former Youth and Schoolboy International who joined Luton Town Ground staff immediately he left school. Signed professional at the age of 17.

S. DUNNE, full-back. Came from the Eire Club, Shelbourne and has been with Luton since May, 1950. Has played for Eire on numerous occasions since 1953. A very strong and hard tackling player.

K. HAWKES, full-back. A rugged type of defender who waited six years for his first League chance. A whole-hearted player who always gives of his best. Recommended to us by our north-eastern Scout while playing with Shotton Colliery Welfare.

A. DANIEL, full-back. A youngster of considerable promise who has had many games in the first team. He signed professional for Luton in January, 1958. Became a regular member of the Bedfordshire Youth team when he moved to Luton with his family.

R. MORTON, half-back. Local born player who has been with the Club since

1948. Played for the England 'B' Team and the Football Combination (on two occasions). Was chosen as Reserve for England at Wembley in 1955 and again when they played Ireland in 1958. A wing-half who has made numerous appearances at centre-forward.

A. BROWN, half-back. A Scottish International secured from Blackpool in 1957. Has been extremely unlucky with injuries missing two Cup Finals whilst with Blackpool. Was, however, fortunate enough to be in the Cup Final Team for Luton. Has recently taken up the wing-half position although he was bought as an inside- or centre-forward.

J. GROVES, half-back. Won Derbyshire Schoolboy honours and was signed by Luton when only 15. He uses his height to great advantage and is an accurate distributor of the ball.

D. PACEY, wing- or centre-half. First signed for the Club in 1956 whilst doing his National Service. Since his demob, he has made exceptional progress, receiving his first honour when selected to play for the Football Association versus the R.A.F. in October, 1958. Has been a regular member of the first team for some time. Was chosen as a member of the England 'under-23' team against Germany and Italy.

M. TRACEY, forward. An English Amateur International, now a full-time professional player. Played for his county (Lancashire) from 1954 to 1956. In 1958 he played for Crook Town with whom he won an F.A. Amateur Cup Final medal. His last season as an amateur he played for England on three occasions, against Western Germany, Holland and Scotland.

W. BINGHAM, outside-right. Luton paid their highest ever fee for this player from Sunderland during the 1958 close season. He is the shining light of his country's forward line who has played in every International match for his country since he was first chosen in 1952.

G. TURNER, inside-right. Came to Luton as a wing-half upon his demobilisation from the Navy, but found his true position at inside-right. Represented the English League versus the Scottish League in 1955 and also played for the F.A. XI versus the Army in 1958.

J. McBRIDE, centre-forward. Came from Kilmarnock to Wolverhampton Wanderers, but due to the brilliance of Booth (their centre-forward), he was unable to establish a regular place in the Wolves first team. When approached by us he decided to come to Luton.

L. SPENCER, inside-forward. Signed for a four-figure fee from Rochdale in the close season. Made his league debut against Bristol Rovers on October 1st.

D. NOAKE, outside-left. Born in Dorchester. Had a short spell with Reading Football Club, but signed for Luton whilst playing for Dorchester Town during last season.

J. J. S. IMLACH, outside-left. Born in Lossiemouth, first Club was Bury, then to Derby County and Nottingham Forest before joining Luton Town last close season. Has filled a gap in our forward line, which has not been adequately filled since the days of Bert Mitchell. Has very good ball control and a deceptive body swerve.

POLICE NOTICE

LIGHTS ON VEHICLES—NIGHT MATCHES

It was with great reluctance that the Chief Constable, Mr. R. A. Noble, G.M., has given instructions that vehicles parked for night matches should be properly lighted. He points out that police responsibilities during these evening matches differ greatly from those during the day-time hours, especially insofar as experience has shown the high incidence of serious accidents in the streets, especially to young children and old people, due to unlighted vehicles.

It should be borne in mind that vehicles parked in streets under such circumstances during the hours of darkness present a grave hazard to pedestrians of all ages, especially if they are unlighted. Children will always play, and for them and old and infirm persons an unlit vehicle is an additional hazard to negotiate.

Evening matches are few, and the Chief Constable hopes that the football-following public will bear with him in coming to this decision.

However, in the light of experience, he will probably review the situation in the near future.




