


Pen Pictures of the Luton Town Players

M. O'HARA (goalkeeper). Following injuries to Ron Baynham and Alan Collier, Luton tonight rely on 16 year old Michael O'Hara in goal. A native of Belfast, O'Hara made his debut in the League Game against Stoke recently after only five appearances in Luton's reserve team. He put up quite a promising performance on that occasion.

S. DUNNE (right-back). Despite the many changes made in Luton's team this season, Seamus Dunne has been an ever-present, which speaks highly of his consistency. Signed from Shelbourne in 1950, Dunne, a native of Wicklow, is an Eire international. After a spell of the injured list which kept him out of the Cup Final two seasons ago, Dunne returned to the Hatters' team last season, during which he missed only one game.

K. HAWKES (left-back). With the former Everton player, John Bramwell, not eligible for tonight's game, it is likely that Ken Hawkes will take his place. Born in Durham, Hawkes joined Luton from Shotton Colliery Welfare in 1951. He was not called upon to make his senior debut until December, 1957, however, though afterwards he had a long spell of first team duty before being replaced by Alan Daniel last winter.

A. BROWN (right-half). When Luton visited Anfield in a League match on September 7, Allan Brown was playing at inside-left. He had subsequently turned out as leader of the attack and in both wing-half positions. He was transferred from Blackpool to Luton in February, 1957, after spending seven years with the Lancashire club, who originally signed him from East Fife.

J. GROVES (centre-half). Another of the Hatters' useful utility players is John Groves. The son of a pre-war Derby County and Portsmouth player, Arthur Groves, he was born in Derby, and signed professional forms for Luton in 1951. This winter Groves has played at inside-left, right-half, and more recently in his present position.

D. PACEY (left-half). An England Under-23 international, David Pacey was the scorer of Luton's goal in the 1959 Cup Final with Nottingham Forest. A local product, he joined the Hatters from Hitchin Town in 1956. His first League outing was at right-half at Christmas the following year, and he has subsequently filled all three positions in the middle line, and has played in the attack.

M. TRACEY (outside-right). After a distinguished amateur career, which brought him England honours while with Crook Town, Mike Tracey signed as a professional with Luton on October 31 last year. Born at Crook, Tracey has already played in all five forward positions for the Hatters since making his debut on February 13. He has taken over on the right wing from Billy Bingham.

G. TURNER (inside-right). Luton's leading marksman this season with six goals, Gordon Turner is a Yorkshireman from Doncaster, who joined the professional staff at Kenilworth Road ten years ago. He soon made a name as a prolific goalscorer, and was an automatic first team choice until

1958-59, when he was out of the senior side for most of the campaign. Now he is back and finding the net with something like his usual facility.

J. McBRIDE (centre-forward). Now in his first full season at Kenilworth Road, Joe McBride was signed by Luton from Wolves on February 26. A Scot from Kilmarnock, he was originally with his local League club, from where he was transferred to Wolves in November last year. This winter, in which he has had one outing at inside-left, the remainder being as leader of the attack, McBride has scored three goals in 13 Second Division games.

L. SPENCER (inside-left). A close-season signing from Rochdale, Les Spencer made his bow in Luton's senior side on October 8. Born in Manchester, he is a product of Lancashire junior football, and joined Rochdale three years ago. With the Spotlands club Spencer filled every position in the front line, and was a fairly useful marksman. He netted eight times in 31 Fourth Division games last winter.

D. NOAKE (outside-left). The third player to be tried on the left flank of the Luton attack this season, David Noake was once an amateur with Portsmouth, and also had a trial with Reading. He later joined Dorchester Town, his local club, and it was from there that Luton signed him last November. Within three months Noake was playing in the First Division, making his debut on February 9. He had six further outings last term, and has played in the last two League games of the current campaign.
