CLUB NOTES

We came as near as the thickness of a coat of paint to avoiding defeat at Scunthorpe last Saturday when from a very good cross by Alwyn McGuffie from near the corner flag Gordon Turner sent in a header which hit the inside of the far post and came straight across to the goalie beaten to the wide standing on the line in the middle of his goal. We had maintained almost continuous pressure during the last twenty minutes which should have resulted in at least one goal being registered, and when this header from Turner also failed to succeed our lads just felt that it was another of those days they have experienced so many times lately that no matter how hard they try there is just to be no reward for their efforts. We must just keep pressing on in the sure hope that the luck will change one day, but it is a mighty long time in doing so.

Today we have the pleasure of a visit by the lads of Ipswich Town in a League II encounter, the first time we have met in a League match since 1954/55, and in fact that was the only occasion we have ever met in a League fixture. The Ipswich Club, although Founded in 1880, did not become a professional Club until 1936, and it was not until 1938 that they were elected to the Football League, Division 3 (South). We had won promotion to the Second Division at the end of Season 1936/37, Ipswich doing likewise Season 1953/54. We therefore met in Season 1954/55, the year we won promotion to the First Division whereas Ipswich found the going rather hard and were at the end of the season back in the Third Division after only one season in Division 2. Two years later however they were back in Division 2, which company they have since enjoyed. In the season of their last promotion Ted Phillips, still playing for them and going very strong, was the League's top scorer (1956/57) with 47 goals. It is noted also that John Elsworth, in whom we showed much interest a few years ago when playing at inside left, has been converted to the wing half position, and we shall be seeing him play with the Number 6 shirt today. In our previous League encounters we lost at Ipswich, our second away match of the 1954/55 Season by three goals to one, while here at Kenilworth Road on New Year's Day, 1955 we won by three goals to two, the two teams being — Baynham, Dunne, Aherne; Pemberton, Owen, Shanks; Davies, Turner, Morton, Cummins and Cullen. Scorers — Davies, Morton and Cummins. Ipswich's team was Perry, Malcolm, Feeney; Fletcher, Rees, Parker; Reed, Grant, Phillips, Brown and McLuckie. Scorers — Phillips and Parker. Nicely placed in second position in the League 2 Table Ipswich are certainly setting a hot pace at the moment. Their defeat at home to Swansea last Saturday by three goals to nil was about the biggest surprise result of the day for the previous Saturday they had gone to Stoke to win most convincingly by four goals to two following victories at Charlton by two goals to nil and at Leeds by five goals to two. In between these splendid away wins they lost their first match at home to Sheffield United by an only goal. Having five victories to their credit so far this season as well as two draws in the eight matches they have played away from home, they come here today with much confidence and also no doubt a great desire to even the score when we beat them at Portman Road two years ago next February when we knocked them out of the F.A. Cup in the Fifth Round by 5 goals to 2. Weather providing, this match today should keep everybody at fever pitch until the final whistle.

We welcome Jim Standen to his first home match in our colours, and may he have as good

a game as he had against us here last Boxing Day (actually it was Monday, December 28th) when he saved everything we could shoot at him, one save in particular when the ball had actually passed him was of the miraculous class. He had a very good game last Saturday at Scunthorpe, and although young Mike O'Hara has done exceedingly well for one so young we feel that having a player of Jim Standen's experience at the last ditch will add much confidence to our defence. We are pleased that Ron Baynham is progressing nicely and is in fact having a try-out with the Metropolitan League side at Stockingstone Road today against Guildford City. We are afraid though that Allan Collier, who broke the bone in his left arm in exactly the same place as in August last, will be out of action for another few weeks yet.

Our Youth team will be playing Oxford United Youth here on Saturday morning next, kick-off 11 a.m. in the Second Round of the F.A. Youth Challenge Cup. Our lads will no doubt find Oxford a tougher proposition than Icknield whom they met in the First Round, and a very good match can be anticipated. Oxford United is the old Headington United Club, now Managed by Mr. Arthur Turner, late Manager of Birmingham City.

It was a great pity that the Schoolboys' Match Luton versus Harpenden on Saturday morning last and the County Championship Match Bedfordshire versus Berks. and Bucks. on Thursday evening last could not be played here as arranged due to the unfit state of the pitch following the recent very heavy rains. The Luton Boys won their way through to the Third Round after at one time being three goals to two in arrear, but the County match has had to be postponed until later in the season, probably February or March.

We are very pleased to record that Mr. and Mrs. Joseph (Joe) Collier celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary on Monday last. Mr. Collier has been Honorary Treasurer of the Bobbers Stand Club for many years, being one of its pioneers and indeed he helped to build the present Club. Although retired he still takes a very keen interest in the Club's activities, which have been recognized by the Football Club for he is a Life Member. Ill-health unfortunately prevents him from attending all matches, but whenever the weather allows "Joe" will be seen in his usual seat in the Directors' Box. We wish both he and his dear wife many years together of Happiness and Contentment with their family and many friends.


