Denis Foreman was expected to be fit to resume activities this afternoon but unfortunately after a try out he was unfit.

Charlie Holcombe is making continued progress and it is hoped he may commence training in a fortnight's time.

Adrian Thorne twisted an ankle in the match with Swansea and appeared to be out of today's match. However, at the time these notes go to the press there is a possibility of him being fit for this afternoon's match.

Tony Nicholas also appeared doubtful during the early part of this week owing to an injured thigh muscle. He has responded to treatment and will be leading the forwards.

Football League match v Swansea Town. Saturday, 5th November, 1960

A great win at Swansea took us off the cushion at the foot of the table, and when one analyses the position in the League table it would be possible if we had a run of two or three wins to find ourselves well clear of the bottom. There are only ten points separating Ipswich who are second, to Lincoln who are bottom, and the individual points run in consecutive numbers from 11 to 21. Although on the receiving end during the first ten minutes and during the last quarter of an hour, the lads played with great enthusiasm and spirit which won them the match, but one most important factor which may have cost us a point was that we were prone to fall back on defence too many times when we were in the lead: attack is always the best means of defence.
