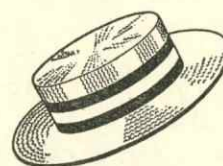

CLUB NOTES

CUP TIE time is with us again, proving once more that there is no Competition which sets the enthusiasm pace as high as the Football Association Challenge Cup. As soon as our opponents became known last Monday the telephone became busy by people from near and far making enquiries as to how they could obtain tickets. Judging by the interest shown already in our clash with Northampton Town there are not going to be many tickets unsold (if any) by Saturday, January 7th, the day of the match. Northampton inform us that enthusiasm there is as great as when they were drawn to play Arsenal, in 1958, when it is reckoned they had a following of over thirty thousand. To help meet the demand as fairly as possible it was agreed at the Board Meeting held this week that this Cup Tie with Northampton will be an All-Ticket Match, the prices for which are as follows:

The arrangements made for distribution of our share of these Tickets are:—

Season Ticket Holders will be able to obtain a ticket for their own particular seat by applying at the Office any day (except Sundays) between 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. until 31st December, or applying by post enclosing stamped addressed envelope—Pink Slip for Round 3 together with 7/6 for each seat in either case. It is regretted that it is not possible for any Season Ticket Holder to obtain more tickets than the number of Season Books held.

Rest of Ground Tickets can be obtained by personal application at the Office as from December 9th until sold out the times stated above, or by postal application. Tickets for Enclosure, Bobbers Stand and Terraces will also be on sale at the Bobbers Stand Club at Club hours as from December 9th.

Southampton, our opponents to-day, are very welcome to Kenilworth Road where a struggle of the highest order can be expected. Since we last met in Season 1952/53 we have travelled diverse ways, for at the end of that Season Southampton were relegated whereas two years later we won promotion. At the end of last Season the reverse was the order for we were relegated for the first time in our long history whereas Southampton were League 3 Champions and so came up into the Second Division. They certainly set a very hot pace in gaining that promotion for they obtained 61 points, Norwich City the Runners-up obtained 59 points and the team which finished in third place obtained 52 points, so that long before the Season ended it was a foregone conclusion that Southampton would be playing Division 2 football this Season. They scored 106 goals in obtaining their objective, the only Club in the Third Division to pass the century figure. They have so far this

Season proved their entry into the higher sphere was worthy for to-day after playing 19 matches they occupy fourth place and again are the leading scorers in the Division with only one short of the half-century. Last week at home to Swansea they rattled five home, their best win of the Season although they have come very close to it on two other occasions when they beat Portsmouth and Derby County at The Dell by five goals to one in each case. Curiously they lost at Middlesbrough by five clear goals last September, whereas we beat the lads from Ayresome Park by six goals to one when they played here a fortnight ago. This fine win, incidentally, must give our lads great confidence for the struggle which lies ahead. It is a long time since we had the pleasure of seeing our own lads hit the ball home so many times in one match, and was a great tonic. It was a very fine all-round performance, the score in no way exaggerating our lads' superiority.

The trip to Leeds last week was a big disappointment for having made the long journey it was only to find that the weather was even worse than it was here and there was no alternative for the Referee but to call the match off. It was a great pity that the same decision could not have been made here in our Combination match with Aldershot for when the match had been in progress about fifteen minutes our very promising young forward David Brogan broke a leg which will almost undoubtedly prevent him from playing again this season. This is a great pity not only from David's point of view but from the Club's for he had settled down very well indeed during the short time he had been with us and in the fifteen minutes play last Saturday he had shown a nice understanding with Jimmy Fleming, signed from Partrick Thistle only the previous day. We extend to you our Good Wishes for a quick and perfect recovery, David, and look forward to the time when we see you coming onto the field again. We also take this opportunity of welcoming Jimmy Fleming into the Club, trusting his stay will be a happy and successful one. Certainly his debut here was a most encouraging one for the future.

Next Wednesday evening, kick off 7.15 p.m. our Youth will be playing Fulham Youth in the Second Round of the Southern Junior Floodlight Cup. In the First Round we met Watford here, winning by two goals to nil, playing very well to do so. If we get through this next hurdle we will be in the Semi-Final of this Competition. We hope for a fine evening and look forward to a nice attendance to encourage these footballers of the future.

While on youth we mention the Schoolboys' Match which will take place here on Saturday morning next, kick off 11 a.m. when the Luton Schoolboys play Reigate and Redhill Schoolboys in Round 4 of the English Schools' Shield Competition. Round 2 with Harpenden Schoolboys was arranged to be played here but the weather was so bad the match had to be played on one of the Schools' Grounds. We trust the weather is kinder to us next Saturday. If our boys win this tie they are due to play away to either Swansea or Aston (Birmingham). We look forward to seeing their further advance in this Competition, and if they can produce the form they showed in the previous round we can confidently expect them to do so.

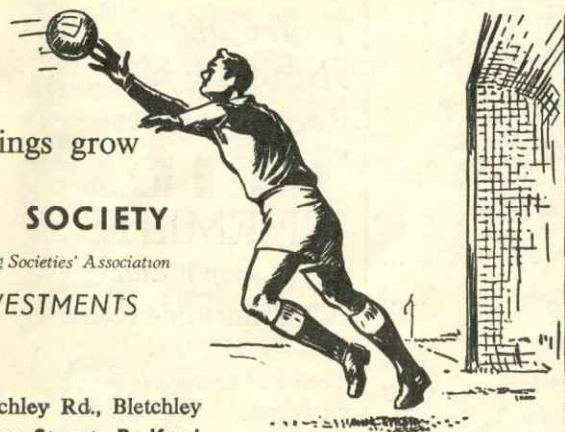
