CLUB NOTES

FOLLOWING our splendid and we feel well-
deserved win over Northampton Town here last
Saturday in the Third Round of the F.A. Cup,
we eagerly awaited the Draw for the Fourth
Round on the Monday, to see who our opponents
would be. Even today however we do not know
for certain who they will be as they drew again
in the Replay held last Wednesday. The two
teams, Manchester City and Cardiff City, play
again at Highbury next Monday evening when,
we hope, as no doubt they do too, a definite
decision can be reached so that the winner can
go ahead making preparations for the visit to
Kenilworth Road a week next Saturday.

Northampton began very strongly against us,
and indeed would have scored before we had
settled down if Brendan McNally had not moved
onto the goal-line quickly and saved a shot which
had looked bound for the back of the net. It was
the one chance the "Cobblers" had of scoring,
and of course if the shot had registered who
knows how the game would have ended. Gordon
Turner's first goal a real peach of quick thinking
which completely deceived the goalkeeper, took
quite a bit of sting out of the "Cobblers" attack,
and then when he scored again seven minutes
after the resumption it became a matter of just
how many the Northampton defence could keep
us down to. It was typical Cup Tie football,
especially during the first half, and it is not
surprising on this showing that the "Cobblers"
are so well placed for promotion in their Division.

We have decided for our next match in the
F.A. Cup that it is to be an All Ticket affair

As today's match with Plymouth Argyle is
the last First team match here before our next
Cup match and there will be only one more
announcement in next week's "Luton News"
giving details of how to apply for tickets we
advise you all who are interested to make early
application, particularly the season ticket holders,
who will not be able to obtain the ticket for their
usual seat if they leave their application until
after next Saturday, January 21st.

We welcome once more to Kenilworth Road
the Green Shirts of Plymouth in a League II
encounter. When we played at Home Park at the
beginning of September we surprised everyone by
holding the Argyle to a draw of one goal each,
for Plymouth had already before meeting us
beaten at home Stoke City by 2-1 and Sheffield
United 2-0 as well as beating Swansea at Vetch
Field 2-1, and therefore doing quite well. In view
of the many changes in our team today compared
with the one which played for us at Plymouth
only those five months ago we thought it would
be interesting to show it, as under—
Baynham; Dunne, Daniel; Morton, Kelly, Pacey;
Bingham, Turner, McBride, Brown and Imlach.
Scorer: Brown.

The last time we met the Argyle here was in
October 1954 the season of our promotion, when
we won by three goals to one. Our team was—
Streten; Dunne, Aherne; Morton, Hall, Shanks;
Davies, Turner, Kelly, Watkins and Adam.
Scorers: Adam, Davies, Turner.

Plymouth about that time were going through
a sticky patch, finishing third from bottom that
season with Hull City fourth, and the following
season both these teams finished in the two bottom
places and so were relegated to Division 3. Season
1957/58 however the Argyle finished in third place,
and the following season were Champions and so
won their way back to the Second Division.
An interesting point worth mentioning here is
that Plymouth were Runners-up in Division 3
(South) for six consecutive seasons, from 1921/22
to 1926/27, and in fact in 1921/22 season they
finished level pegging with Southampton eight
points clear of Portsmouth in third position (we
were fourth with 52), but with a poorer goal
average and so had to remain where they were.

Last month the Argyle were involved in three
matches of heavy scoring which certainly kept the
fans talking. On December 17th they went to
Stoke City succumbing by nine clear goals. On
Boxing Day they went to Charlton losing by six
goals to four. At Plymouth the following day
(Tuesday) in the return match with Charlton the
Argyle exactly reversed the score—six to the
Argyle four to Charlton, a remarkable coincidence.
Last Saturday at home to Bristol City in the F.A.
Cup 3rd Round Argyle lost surprisingly one goal
to nil, so now they must go all out to try and
improve their quite respectable position in the
League. They have won away at Swansea, Hudders-
field and Bristol Rovers and drew at Rotherham.
They are therefore a team which cannot be taken
lightly, and our lads will have to fight all the way
if they are going to continue their recent splendid
'home' successes. Hope to see you all in a
fortnight's time.

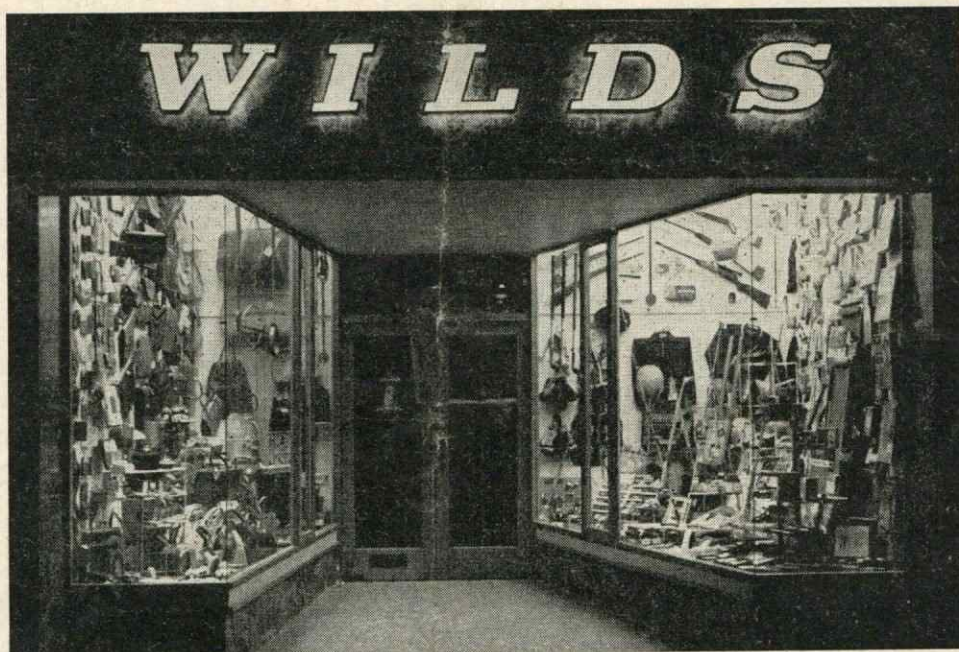
