They come to Carrow Road full of confidence after winning their last two matches so we should witness an interesting and keen game.

On Saturday last it was just not our day at Swansea and the "Swans" ran out on the day's play worthy winners. It was pleasing to note that George Waites made a promising debut. The reserve team after being a goal down at the interval did well to beat Portsmouth by three goals to one at Carrow Road and so gain two valuable points in their effort to consolidate a higher position in the Football Combination (Div. I). The "B" team did well to beat Costessey by five goals to two at Boundary Park in an East Anglian League game.

It was in the summer of 1958 that manager Archie Macaulay signed Irishman Jimmy Hill, for a modest fee, as an outside right from Newcastle United. He wanted United left winger Bill Puntun too, but had to wait another year for him. Hill's early games for City on the wing were not a success and, demoted to the Reserves, he was within an ace of a transfer to Mansfield when he was switched to inside left. He never looked back. As the "brains" of the famous "Cup" attack he formed, with Bobby Brennan, a devastating all-Irish left wing. He has now played 105 League and Cup games, and scored 35 goals. One of the cleverest ball players City have had, "Tiger" Jimmy Hill's qualities were soon spotted by the Irish selectors when he developed as an inside forward. Supporters will hope he has many more "caps" ahead of him.

WELCOME TO LUTON TOWN

To the present-day Norwich City supporter the name of Luton Town means only one thing—the Cup semi-final draw and defeat that cost the Canaries a trip to Wembley in the spring of 1959.

These memories were partly wiped out last September when City won 2-0 at Kenilworth Road. Honour will be even more satisfied if the Carrow Road return completes a City double.

Fortunes have changed for both clubs since their Cup clashes. For the Canaries the intervening season has brought promotion, for Luton relegation. And while City have firmly established themselves in the Second Division the Hatters, under the management of popular Sam Bartram, have had an uphill fight.

They come to Norwich with the unenviable distinction of being the only team in the Second Division not to have won away from home this season. Yet at Kenilworth Road they have now had seven consecutive victories and the worries of further relegation have eased considerably.

In fact, Bartram, by infusing a lot of his own spirit and personality into the team, by some shrewd transfer moves and by experiment, has done a lot to raise hopes at Luton that a return to the First Division is not so far off after all.

Playing a big part in the Hatters' recovery are ex-Arsenal goalkeeper Jim Standen and two men from Everton—John Bramwell and Alec Ashworth—who went to Kenilworth Road in the deal that saw Billy Bingham move to Goodison Park.

City will be glad that they will not have right winger Bingham to contend with this time, but they will need to keep a close watch on Gordon Turner, who has been scoring consistently since being switched from inside right to centre forward.

The Luton line-up, therefore, has changed considerably since September; but so far as City's supporters are concerned they are still the same Hatters who put the Canaries out of the Cup and on that score alone they can be sure of a big welcome.

Luton were founded in 1885 and were the pioneers of professional football in the south of England. They had three years in the Second Division at the turn of

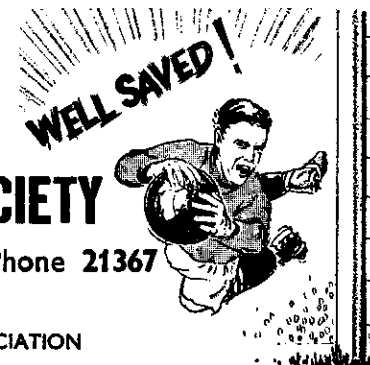

the century but then had to wait until 1920, when they became founder members of the Third Division, for further league representation. In the meantime they and City became close acquaintances in the old Southern League and there were some fine matches between the clubs both at Norwich and Luton.

It was not until 1937 that the Hatters again found themselves in the Second Division and greater glory came in 1955 when they gained promotion to the First.

Although they are not a "glamour" club, Luton have a proud list of international honours. Among the Hatters who have appeared for their country are Sid Owen, the man who did so much to prevent City getting to Wembley, Ron Baynham, Bernard Streten, "Ten-goal" Joe Payne, Allan Brown, Mike Cullen, Bingham and George Cummins.

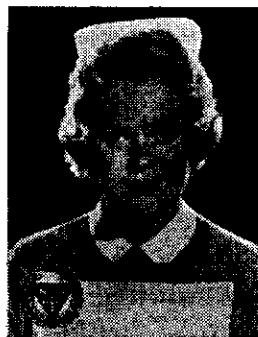

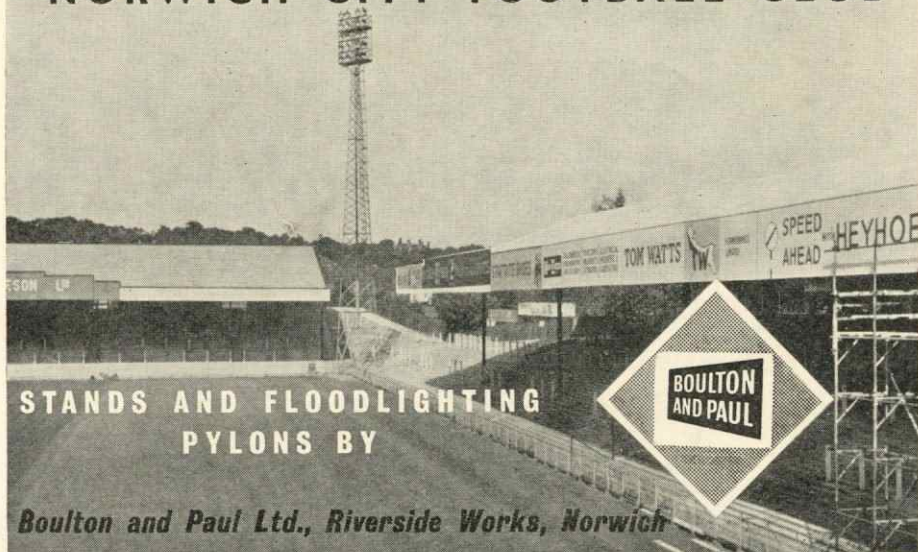
