

### **CLUB NOTES**

WHEN these Notes were being contemplated a fortnight or so ago it was envisaged that they would begin by saying we hoped this match against Leeds United would result in our first 'double' of the season. We are pleased to say however that although we still hope to pull off the 'double' against Leeds today if we do it will not be our first of the season for that pleasurable event happened last Saturday at Ipswich when we defeated the present leaders on their own ground. It was a well-earned victory aided in the main by a well-knit defence which gave very little away with Ron Bayham showing all the old form which earned him his England Caps in 1955/56. Although he had not one direct shot to save his mastery in the air with high crosses was a pleasure to watch and even the Ipswich supporters, bitterly disappointed though they were that their team were facing their third loss at home this season to jeopardise their chances of promotion were sporting enough to applaud this wonderful goalkeeping. Albert McCann did get the ball into the net after some nice play with Gordon Turner but was adjudged in an offside position when receiving the final pass. It was one of those decisions upon which there could be argument but the referee, who handled the game very well, decided on the signal from his linesman that it was offside and there the matter rests. But if it had been allowed to stand there would have been an even bigger cheer when the final announcement came through on the mike than was given by the stalwarts who stayed behind after the Reserves match to hear the final score. As it was it was well worth waiting for.

Leeds United, as no doubt you all know, were relegated with ourselves at the end of last season and like ourselves have found the different tempo difficult to get used to. Strangely Leeds have one of the best "away" records in the Second Division this season, for they have won no fewer than seven matches on opponents' grounds but their home record has been very disappointing for they have won six only out of the 18 played. The away victories have been at Southampton, Leyton Orient, Sunderland, Lincoln City, Derby County, Rotherham United and at Huddersfield, quite a bag of successes so that we know we shall have to fight all the way if we are to register the 'double' against this strong resolute side. Just two weeks ago Don Revie took over the Managerial reins, and of course it is too early to judge him in his new role. Syd Owen left us at the end of last season and later was appointed Chief Coach at Elland Road where he has been quite successful. Les Cocker, Assistant Trainer here last season also went to Leeds, and so we may see them both here this afternoon. We trust that by now they have both settled down in their new surroundings and find them to their liking.

It was with much regret we learned last week that Les Spencer's career as a footballer has ended. He was just settling down here in Luton and showing the promise which persuaded us to obtain his signature from Rochdale, but a rheumatic complaint in his thigh has proved too far advanced for the medical profession, despite all their skill and splendid nursing, to combat. Les is now trying to adjust himself to the situation he and his young wife have to face so early in their married life, and is soon to take a correspondence course to prepare for a career in the business world. We wish him much success.

While on this position we are pleased to learn from the Hospital that the injury received by Alec Ashworth at Leyton three weeks ago is not as serious as at first feared. We may see him in action before the end of the season but only if there is no possibility of any further damage to the knee. He is itching to get back again. David Brogan is progressing as well as can be expected. He is at his home in Scotland, looking forward to the day when he can walk onto the field again with a number 10 shirt on his back. Mike Tracey we are hoping would be fit in time for the Easter matches but a slight swelling during training has set him back a bit. However we and he keep hoping he will soon be on the field again.

We are sorry the Luton Band, who have done wonderful service these past few years entertaining you all before the match and at half time, are not able to be with us over the Easter Holiday. Quite a few of the members live away from Luton and Easter provides them with an opportunity of being able to spend a few days with their ain folk. Unfortunately we will not be entertained by them again until the last match of the season, on April 29th, for on the day of our next fixture, versus Brighton and Hove Albion, on April 15th, the Luton Band will be defending the Southern Area Championship at Seymour Hall. We wish them every success in their attempt to bring the Trophy back with them from London, in which case of course they will be proud to display it here on April 29th, as they did when they won it last year. This gave us the opportunity of inviting to Kenilworth Road the Heath and Reach Brass Band who performed yesterday at very short notice (unfortunately they are not able to be here today) and the Bradwell Silver Band who will be here on April 15th. Incidentally the Bradwell Band who have performed here before on the few occasions the Luton Band has not been able to appear are celebrating their Diamond Jubilee later this month. Such news makes us all realise the wonderful work up and down the country by the people living in villages and small towns in getting together and keeping Brass Bands in existence, especially in these days of high costs in instruments, music, clothing, use of halls for rehearsals, etc. We trust appreciation is shown by giving generously when the Collectors come round with their boxes for the Collections they make here are we are told most helpful in 'keeping things going.'




