### CLUB NOTES

AS this season progresses so our injuries list gets longer and consequently more worrying. Last Saturday at Middlesbrough, on top of the already long list comprising Tracey, Kelly, Fleming, McGuffie, McCann, Fairchild in addition to the two players Brice and Walker out for the whole season and Spencer and Brogan out for the greater part of it, Turner our main goal scoring forward receives an injury to a knee which will prevent him being seen in action again this season. When Dr. Crarer came down to the Ground last Tuesday morning he had eleven players to attend to, all requiring urgent treatment in addition to those with normal knocks and bruises. We have never known a season like it. We envy those Clubs which seem to be able to call on their regular first team week after week. We are sure that if we had enjoyed such a happy state of affairs these last two seasons we would not be in the position we now find ourselves in wanting two points to make sure we are not relegated from the Second Division at the end of the 1960/61 Season. The number of changes the Manager has had to make because of injuries has affected the teams right through, and the team finally selected to play here against Peterborough Reserves last Wednesday evening was the best we could call upon out of a playing staff of thirty two professionals in addition to the two Apprentice players O'Hara and Kerr, and the two Service players Dixon and Jenkins. We feel sure that such a spell of bad luck cannot continue much longer, and that next season we will be enjoying better success. We wish to thank the 14/15,000 stalwarts who have continued to support us these last two seasons despite our declining fortunes, not forgetting the season ticket holders many of whom have wondered if the outlay at the beginning of each season is worth it. We can assure you all that every effort has been made and will continue to be made to improve the play, and plans are already in hand for just that next season.

We are hosts to-day to Brighton and Hove Albion in a League II fixture, the first time we have met at Kenilworth Road since our year of promotion to the Second Division in Season 1936/37. Brighton joined the Third League (South) when it was formed in 1920/21, continuing to play in that League until their promotion in 1957/58. In their two seasons in Division II they have finished just below the half-way mark, and this season like ourselves they have since Christmas been playing with the feeling that relegation could be a reality. Last Saturday they beat Lincoln City at Hove by one goal to nil, and over the Easter Programme obtained four points out of six, all at the expense of Plymouth. Although still in the anxious position of only four places from the bottom the one point advantage we enjoy over them raises us four places in the Table. A win therefore by Brighton to-day, which incidentally if it happens would be their fifth away victory of the season would place them one point above ourselves and therefore fairly safe from the drop. This is therefore a most important match to them,

as indeed it is to us, so that we can expect a very hard-fought battle for those points.

Our Reserves missed a great opportunity last Wednesday evening of occupying second place in the Football Combination Table when they were most surprisingly beaten by next to bottom Peterborough United.

Next Saturday the First team is away at Southampton and the Reserves at Coventry. We have therefore arranged for the Luton Schools' F.A. to have the use of our Ground to enable them to stage their Annual Seaward Trophy match, this year Tottenham Boys providing the opposition. Kick-off will be at 2.30 p.m., and play will be 35 minutes each half. At 4 p.m. our South East Counties' team will kick-off against Charlton Athletic, who are next place above them in the League. No extra charge will of course be made for this second match, the whole of the Admission money will be handed to the Luton Schools' Football Association after deduction of expenses. It will be quite a thrill for these schoolboys to play at Kenilworth Road on a Saturday afternoon, and we hope quite a nice crowd will be here to enjoy their play.

Next Monday evening, kick-off 7.15 p.m. we will have the pleasure of receiving the Scottish Division I Club Partick Thistle in a Friendly Match. This is the Club to whom Joe McBride was transferred last November in exchange for Jim Fleming. Both players have settled down well with their new Clubs, and we are quite sure Joe will be given a great reception as he comes onto the field. At present Partick hold eighth position in the Table, but early in the year there were hopes they would be fighting near the top, but such hopes have not materialised. However they are a very strong and skilful side, and it will be most interesting to compare the two different styles of play. We hope to see a good crowd to give our Scottish visitors a most cordial welcome.

The members of the Heath and Reach Band wish us to thank on their behalf all those of you who made a contribution to their Funds when they played here on Good Friday. They enjoyed playing to you, and hope to have the opportunity of doing so again in the not too distant future. We congratulate them on their smart turn-out and for the nice and appropriate selection of music so well played.

The Luton Band is to-day playing at Seymour Hall, London, in the Southern Area Championship and we wish them every success in their efforts to bring the Trophy back with them to Luton. This has given us the opportunity of inviting the New Bradwell Band to play for us again which they have done these last two years when the Luton Band has not been able to attend. We give them a warm welcome again to Kenilworth Road and we trust their efforts will be nicely appreciated when the Collectors come round with their boxes. To place a few coppers or so in the box as the Collectors come round is a nice way of saying Thank-you to these performers for their efforts and we can assure you that a nice collection is a wonderful incentive for all connected with the particular Band.


