FROM THE BOARDROOM

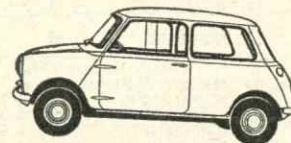
SOME OF our very loyal supporters made the long journey to Sheffield last Saturday to see the match against the United on their famous Bramall Lane ground. This was a very important match for Sheffield United and although they won by 2-1 I think the supporters who were present would agree it was a good game. The Saints were trying hard for the whole of the ninety minutes, the defence played well with Cliff Huxford probably having his best game since he was badly injured in the match at Derby last September. Wesley Maughan scored a good goal and Terry Paine very narrowly missed with a shot taken at the end of a spectacular run when he beat three defenders in quick succession.

After the match at Sheffield the Saints party travelled on to Seaburn, which is a very pleasant suburb of Sunderland who we played on Monday evening. This was the Saints first visit to Roker Park for a league match, and after the much improved performance at Sheffield we were expecting to come away with some of the spoils. We were beaten 3-1 but the Sunderland Chairman told me after the game that a 2-2 draw would have been a much fairer result and I don't think many people would have disagreed with him. Sunderland were a very attractive young side with an average age of only twenty-one. They played with great enthusiasm and plenty of skill, and the Saints accepted the challenge in great style. The Sunderland goal had at least four amazing escapes and for the whole of the match the Saints played their part in one of the best games I have seen for some time. Harry Penk was brought into the team in place of John Sydenham and with Brian Clifton formed a very effective left wing which gave our forward line the balance which we have missed in recent games. Clifton scored our only goal with a well-taken shot and with the slightest luck could have had two more in the net. Paine, O'Brien and Maughan each had very narrow misses. The referee for this game was the well known Arthur Ellis who has refereed in seventy-four international matches all over the world. What a difference a good referee can make to a game! Ron Reynolds said afterwards that it was a pity we couldn't have him for every game!

It was a happy coincidence that we had Director George Reader with us for he was able to meet Arthur Ellis for the first since the World Cup Final in Rio de Janeiro in 1950, when Mr. Reader was the referee and his two linesmen were Arthur Ellis and Reg Leafe. Mr. Ellis was extremely complimentary about Mr. Reader's refereeing on that occasion, with a world record crowd of 200,000 present in the huge Brazilian stadium.

We were also able to renew acquaintances with three ex-Saints players—George Curtis who is of course trainer-coach at Sunderland, Bill Rochford who is now farming in the district and Jimmy Shields who is now playing for South Shields.

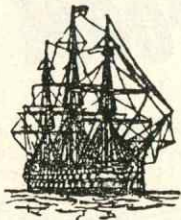

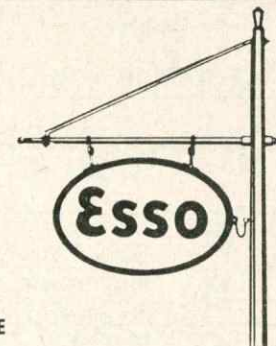

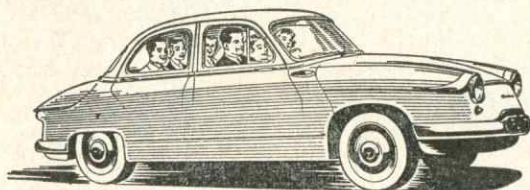
