### Club Notes

EACH season we begin with hopes anew that it will be a season where all our previous records will be surpassed and that we will be able the following May to look back on all our achievements with a high sense of pride. Three years ago we started with such hopes and indeed we did achieve a most wonderful result by appearing at Wembley for the first time in our history, but since then very little has seemed to go forward and we have had to be content with being able just to hold our own. This new season however we feel we can confidently expect it to be a successful one for the players are all most anxious to get on with the game and each one of them is in expectation of being chosen for the First team. This is a very good state of affairs for it means that those in the First team know there is someone waiting to take their place and of course it helps to keep them on their toes. Since the close of last season we have brought several new faces to Kenilworth Road, these being in order of sequence Thomas McKechnie from the Scottish Junior Club Kirkintilloch Rob Roy, Freddy Jardine from Dundee, Barry Reed and John Lornie both from Leicester City and lastly Ron Cope from Manchester United. We welcome them all very warmly and sincerely hope their stay with Luton Town will be very happy for them as well as successful. We had been hoping to increase the staff still further by signing an Inside Forward in time for to-day's match, Brian Orritt of Birmingham City being the player in mind but after much discussion we decided not to sign him. It had been hoped that young Tommy McKechnie would be filling the

No. 10 position but an injury during a practise game has not responded to treatment and the opportunity of making his debut goes to John Lornie at centre forward, Gordon Turner resuming at his former position of inside right. Whilst on this position we have heard from David Brogan this week saying his leg is now out of plaster and is attending the Rehabilitation Centre in Glasgow. We hope it will not be long before he is down here among the lads again. He is rarin' to get back.

As well as having some new players we are also starting the season with a new style Official Programme, which we hope will meet with general approval. We have been thinking for some little time to print one such as this but the cost of doing so has rather dampened the thought. However as the great majority of Clubs now have a 4d. Programme we decided to fall into line and so have the bigger and more informative publication.

We have much pleasure in receiving Preston North End to open the season here at Kenilworth Road, and they can be assured of a very warm welcome as they enter the field. They had a most disappointing time last season, finishing in bottom place in the First Division. No doubt the influence and skill of Tom Finney was missed upon his retirement from League football at the conclusion of the previous season, for whereas the defence conceded only 71 goals, (only four teams in the First Division conceded less) they scored only 43, the lowest in the four Divisions. Tom's scoring power and ability to create openings for his colleagues would undoubtedly have staved off for them the big drop if he had been playing. At the present time Tottenham

Hotspur are basking in the limelight of fame, and rightly so considering their recent successes, but Preston North End set up a record in 1888/89 which is most unlikely ever to be broken. That was when they won the League Championship without losing a single match and winning the F. A. Cup without conceding a single goal. That was the season, the second of five glorious years when they were either Champions or Runners-up, when they were known as 'the Old Invincibles,' as well as their other titles of 'Proud Preston'—so called so it is said because before a Cup Final at that time they were so sure of winning it they wanted to be photographed before the match

holding the Cup—and 'the Lily-Whites, their colours being the same as ours they have to change to-day of course as they are the visitors.

We have arranged that all our Saturday matches to be played at Kenilworth Road will kick-off at 3 p.m. throughout the season, except for evening matches when the time of kick-offs will be at 7 p.m., with the one exception when Mansfield Town Reserves play here next Wednesday the kick-off being timed for 6.30 p.m.

So on with the game at the start of yet another season, our 76th, and may it prove a very happy one for us all.

**Alan Kelly** (goalkeeper). Born Dublin. Joined North End from Drumcondra with John O'Neill in April, 1958. His League appearances have been limited due to the consistency of Fred Else.

**Willie Cunningham** (right back). Born Hill o'Beath, Fifeshire. Joined North End from Airdrieonians in the summer of 1949. Eight times chosen for Scotland and had the honour of Captaining his Country in the World Cup Series in 1954.

**Bob Wilson** (left back). Born Liverpool. Joined North End from Burscough Rangers in April, 1950. Has had limited opportunities in the first team but a consistent and reliable player.

**David Barber** (half back). Born Barnsley. Joined North End in the Summer of 1961 from Barnsley at a fair fee. Played for England under 23s and a wing half of great promise.

**Tony Singleton** (half back). Preston born player who has reached the first team through the Junior ranks. Signed as a part time professional May, 1955, turning full time pro. on leaving the Forces in June, 1959.

**John Wylie** (half back). Signed from Huddersfield Town in May, 1957. Made his League debut against Leeds United at Deepdale in September, 1958.

**Alec Alston** (forward). Preston born son of a former well known local Boxer. Preston Schools player in 1952 and joined North End in 1955. Came full time professional after National Service in August 1957 and has occupied many positions in the forward line.

**David Wilson** (forward). Born Nelson and came to North End as a schoolboy. Had an excellent record in our Youth Team, a clever ball player, but not much 1st Team experience as yet.

**Alf Biggs** (forward). Born Bristol and joined North End from Bristol Rovers F.C. in June, 1961 at a considerable fee. Big and strong, and a player of marked football ability.

**David Sneddon** (forward). Born Kilwinning, Scotland. Joined North End from Dundee F.C. in April, 1959. Played for Scotland Under 23s and made his League debut for North End against Tottenham in April, 1959.

**Peter Thompson** (forward). Born Carlisle. Joined Ground staff from School. Played for Carlisle, Cumberland, England Schools football and Lancashire F.A. Youth Team. Was an ever present in the Youth Team which reached the Final of the F.A. Youth Cup. Made his League debut against Arsenal in August, 1960.

The Mayor of Luton has very kindly consented to honour us by 'drawing' the first winning Ticket Numbers during half-time today.


There will not be a distribution next Saturday, but thereafter at every Saturday
