Club Notes

WE have made a very nice start to the new Season having obtained four points from a possible six, with two of the matches having been "away." We were undoubtedly the better side in our first match versus Preston North End and fully deserved the four goals to one victory, and in our third match at Plymouth last Saturday again we were worthy winners and in fact the victory at Home Park could have been even more decisive than the three clear goals we enjoyed for there were some very narrow misses on our part and McLaren the Argyle goalie brought off a magnificent save in practically the last kick of the match to prevent Gordon Turner registering a well-deserved hat trick. We were a nicely balanced side at Plymouth, and young Tom McKechnie playing in the Inside Left position in his Football League debut fitted in very well, and endorsed the good reports we had received on this player. The first goal scored by Harry Walden was one of those efforts right out of the book, the ball being passed from man to man right from our own penalty box without an Argyle player being able to get anywhere near it until it was in the back of the net. A wonderful goal, which set the seal on the rest of the match for after that we were always in the ascendancy and finished very worthy winners. We hope we can produce the same brand of football here this evening, for it is football which would certainly fill the ground at every match.

We extend a very cordial welcome to our famous opponents Derby County for this evening's match. One of the "original twelve" when the Football

League was formed in 1888, the "Rams" have had rather a chequered career, having played in the First, Second and Third (North) Divisions but never won the Championship of the First Division although they went mighty close Seasons 1895/96, 1929/30 and 1935/36 when they finished Runners-up on each occasion. They have won the F.A. Cup once, in 1946 when they beat Charlton Athletic at Wembley after extra time by four goals to one, having reached the Final on three previous occasions, in 1898, 1899 and 1903, reaching the Semi-Finals twelve times. Of all the famous players associated with Derby County Steve Bloomer we feel comes first to mind, the scorer of 352 goals from 1892 to 1914. There was Jacky Goodall and Hughie Gallagher, as well as in the later period Raich Carter, Peter Docherty, Billy Steel, Sammy Crooks with of course Dally Duncan who is at present living in Derby and may be present at this match tonight. Wonderful players who will be talked about for a long time to come when football is the subject of discussion. Last Wednesday evening at the Baseball Ground we lost our first match of the season, but somehow our lads did not play together as they did here against Preston or last Saturday at Plymouth. We hope they will continue where they left off at Plymouth and so give you fans something really to enjoy.

It is with much reluctance that we shall see Mr. Reg Cooper for the last time this evening in his official capacity of "The Luton News" photographer. He is retiring after close on forty year's service with the one firm, in fact it would be forty years next December but he has decided to retire now and enjoy

a bit of summer at his leisure before the winter sets in. During the whole of that time he has covered every First team home match apart from when he has been on holiday, every away Cup match and quite a few away League matches. Reg has many interesting anecdotes covering the years to relate—the most memorable match apart from the Cup Final at Wembley was the Newcastle United match when we won by four goals to three after being three down at half time; the day Joe Payne scored his 10 goals against Bristol Rovers—he could not get all ten as he ran out of plates after the first half dozen; the Cup

Tie at Halifax when the ground was thick with snow: the Leicester Cup Tie when Leicester scored in the last kick of the game to make the score 5 goals each, etc., etc. In our opinion his best "shot" was the one he took of Andy Rennie scoring that wonderful goal at the Kenilworth Road end against Coventry City on 13th October, 1928. A wonderful goal and a wonderful "shot." We wish Reg Good Health and Happiness in his retirement, in which we feel sure we are joined by every fan who has attended matches during those forty years.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Ken Oxford (goalkeeper). Signed in December 1957 from Norwich City, but had previously played for Derby County as a trialist in 1948. Representative honours in 3rd Division (South) when with Norwich.

Geoffrey Barrowcliffe (full back). A local boy who signed for Derby County while playing for Ilkeston Town in October, 1950. Played with the Reserve side the same season and made his Football League debut on 1st September, 1951 at the age of 19.

Anthony Conwell (full back). Signed from Huddersfield Town during June, 1959, having previously seen service with Sheffield Wednesday during seasons 1949/54 and Huddersfield Town 1955/59. A Bradford born player with plenty of Football League experience.

John Parry (wing half). A member of a well-known Derby footballing family, and attracted the Club's attention while playing for Derby Boys. Signed amateur forms in 1947 and turned professional in July 1948, making his Football League debut in April 1949 when only 17 years old. Is equally at home at inside forward.

Raymond Young (centre half). A former England schoolboys and Derby Boys' player who made his debut in the

Football League at Doncaster in April 1954. Signed as an amateur in May 1949, turning professional in March, 1951.

Glyn Davies (wing half). Born in Swansea and was spotted while playing in Welsh junior football. Joined the Club in May, 1949, making his senior side debut at Rotherham in December 1953. A forceful and strong tackling player.

Ian William Hall (inside forward). Played as an amateur for Wolverhampton Wanderers and signed professional for Derby County in September, 1959. Is another player who has also considerable success with the County Cricket side.

William Curry (centre forward). Entered League football with his home town Club Newcastle United in season 1955/56. During the following season he scored 25 times in 51 games. Has played for England Under 23 team. Scored 23 goals in 40 games while with Brighton. Transferred to Derby County on 30th September, 1960.

Raymond Swallow (inside or wing forward). Born in London and was transferred from Arsenal in September, 1958. Is a clever, scheming inside forward with a forceful shot. Has played with the Derbyshire County Cricket Club.


