Club Notes

THOSE of you here this afternoon who were not able to see the match last Wednesday evening against Derby County missed one of the most scintillating games ever played on this ground. The Derby team for twenty minutes simply had no answer to the skill and effectiveness of the game played by our lads, and in that time three of the sweetest goals ever to enter a net were hit passed the luckless County goalie, a very good player but just not being able to do anything to prevent the ball entering his net. Again late in the game when Tom McKechnie, with all the skill of an experienced player waltzed past three Derby defenders to put in an unstoppable shot from just outside the box Oxford was left standing. It was a magnificent goal, and was the talking point after the match, together with the rejuvenation of the Luton side. A splendid start to the season—let us hope it continues.

Few clubs, if any, in the Football League can claim a history more interesting than that of Huddersfield Town, whom we welcome to-day. In 1908 Town started out in the North-Eastern League, from which they joined the Midland League a year later. In June 1910, they were admitted to Second Division membership of the Football League.

Ten years later, when the team were setting out on a Cup campaign which was to take the club to the first of its five finals, there was the threat of removal "lock, stock and barrel" to Leeds.

But playing success enabled financial difficulties to be overcome. Although beaten in extra time in the Final by

Aston Villa at Stamford Bridge, Town were promoted with the record number of points for runners-up—64. They held First Division status for 32 years, being relegated for the first time in 1952.

Their record includes:—

First Division Champions 1923-24, 1924-25, 1925-26 (the first club to win the title in three successive seasons).

First Division Runners-up 1926-27, 1927-28, 1933-34.

Second Division Runners-up 1919-20, 1952-53.

F.A. Cup winners 1921-22.

F.A. Cup Finalists 1919-20, 1921-22, 1927-28, 1929-30, 1937-38.

Eddie Boot their Manager is an old friend of Sam Bartram for they have played together many times for the Managers' XI. They look forward to meeting again.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Fearnley, H. (goalkeeper). After figuring in exactly half of Town's League games in 1956-57, Harry's first team opportunities were limited until he was preferred to Wood for the away match against Middlesbrough last December. He held his place, playing in 23 consecutive games. A Penistone boy, he has been at Leeds Road for nearly nine years and has made 64 League appearances.

Parker, R. (right back). Recruited from Seaham (Co. Durham), established himself last season when his Second Division appearances totalled 30. Frequently partnered Ray Wilson, the club's England defender, and crossed to left back when

Wilson had a couple of games at centre forward in March. Debut in 1959-60.

Wilson, R. (left back). After being one of the successes of England's 1960 close season Continental tour. Ray, who had gained his first cap in April, 1960, was unfortunate last season with injury. The first of the 165 League appearances, with which he greets the new campaign, was in a First Division away fixture with Manchester United in October 1955.

Saward, P. (right half). Huddersfield signed Pat from Aston Villa in March. An Eire international, he was with Millwall until Villa recruited him in 1955. Was Villa's left half in 1957 when

they defeated Manchester United in the F.A. Cup Final, and missed only two of their Second Division matches when they won the championship in 1959-60. Has 281 games to his credit with three clubs.

Coddington, J. (centre half). John, the new captain, made his debut in the same match as Wilson, but at right half. This Worksop born six footer has settled in recent years at centre half, and had missed only seven League matches out of 129 before the 1961 season. With five successful shots out of seven in 1959-60 he became Town's penalty expert.

Dinsdale, P. (left half). This Bradford lad made a splendid recovery from a broken leg in his teens. Made his League debut at Ipswich two years ago on the wing. Had a first team chance in the No. 6 spot at Stoke on Christmas Eve 1960, and he retained the place, except for an injury lay-off, until the end of the season.

McHale, K. (right winger). On his League debut against Leyton Orient in August 1956, Kevin, Darfield born, was the youngest player to have turned out for the club. He was 16 years, 328 days old. Completed a century of Second Division appearances before his 21st birthday last October. Went into 1961-62 with 153 games and 27 goals to his credit.

Kerray, J. (inside forward). Jim was transferred to Huddersfield from Dunfermline a few months after Law's

departure. With Dunfermline and Raith Rovers, he scored 32 goals in 87 matches. Most of his 28 Second Division games last season were at inside right, although in a spell at centre forward he scored four goals in as many games.

Stokes, D. (centre forward). This is Derek's second season at Huddersfield, after being recruited from Bradford City at a reported record fee for both clubs. With 16 goals was the club's top scorer last season. With City he switched from left wing to centre forward after Johnny McCole's transfer to Leeds in 1959-60, and operated on a goal-a-match basis.

Massie, L. (inside left). From the Aberdeen junior club, Banks o'Dee, Town signed Les in 1953, when he was 18. League debut at Fulham on September 1st, 1956. In 1959-60 was the first Town inside forward in post-war League Soccer to score 20 goals. Greets 1961-62 with a personal record of 67 goals from 179 Second Division appearances, the last 71 consecutive.

O'Grady, M. (left winger). The Leeds born lad with the Irish name is 18, and already an England under 23 international — he played against Scotland at Middlesbrough last season. Mike made his League debut in a home game against Bristol Rovers in April, 1960. Scored the winning goal in the F.A. Cup Third Round Replay against Wolves, the first game to be played under the club's floodlights.
