

Editorial

The Dell has become our 'Hoodoo' ground

AFTER our record-breaking run of nineteen games without defeat, the sequence came to an end in the home match with Preston North End. It was disappointing from our point of view in that we had sufficient chances to have sewn the game up in the first half.

While we have no wish to take away any credit from Preston's success, it must not be overlooked that we had to introduce two new wing halves because of the injuries to Roy Saunders and Peter Davies, who have been strong links in a sound middle line. Happily Peter is back, but Roy's knee injury is likely to take much longer and it may be at least a fortnight before he resumes.

Our heavy defeat at Southampton for the second consecutive year was not as serious a set-back as the score might suggest, but for all that a little worrying, an own goal and a penalty gave Southampton a 2-1 lead at half time which certainly flattered them after Colin Webster had opened his scoring account with a welcome goal.

LITTLE WENT RIGHT

In the second half, however, during which little went right for us, the defence cracked badly and the Saints added three more goals—two in as many minutes. The Dell seems to be our "hoodoo" ground, for we were beaten 5-0 there last season.

There was one bright feature and that was the form of Herbie Williams, playing in the side for the first time since March.

In the unaccustomed position of left half, he served up a standard of football which found much admiration from his own colleagues as well as from the home supporters.

Unhappily he suffered a foot injury and when these notes were written it was doubtful whether he would be able to play at Derby.

COLLECTED SIX POINTS


This afternoon we welcome Luton Town, who though losing at home to Huddersfield Town last week end, had collected six points from five games. Last Easter when we met Luton we took three points out of a possible four—winning at home 3-1 and drawing at Luton 2-2. The Bedfordshire club found it none too easy settling down to the second division last season, but they have done reasonably well this term to indicate that we can be prepared for a stiff struggle for maximum points today.

More information concerning our East German opponents in the European Cup winners cup, Motor Jena, has reached us. The facts point to their being a formidable combination.

GREATEST AMBITION

Average age of the side is 24, and it includes a number of young players for whom a bright future is predicted. Apparently their greatest ambition is to win the League Master Title.

Their best performance in the League was in 1958 when they finished second. They were fourth in 1957, fifth in 1959 and eighth last year when they had a crop of injuries.

Luton Town may not have achieved as many honours as some clubs who have enjoyed First Division membership, but they have one claim to distinction in the fact that they were the first club in the south to embrace professionalism. That, of course, was way back in the early days, around 1890 to be precise, and at that time professionalism was regarded as not being quite "the thing." We have progressed a lot since those days.

Another distinction, with which Luton would cheerfully have dispensed, was established at Wembley a couple of years ago, when the Hatters were the first team to lose in the Cup Final at Wembley against a team which had been reduced to ten men. On that occasion, of course, their opponents were Nottingham Forest, who emerged victorious despite having to play without outside-right Roy Dwight for three parts of the game after he had had the misfortune to break his leg.

That match was the last in which Syd Owen played for the Hatters. After over ten years spent as the backbone of their defence Syd Owen announced his impending retirement a little while before the Cup Final, and naturally was extremely hopeful that the Cup would find a resting place at Kenilworth Road, to make his last game for the club doubly pleasing. But he had some consolation in being elected "Footballer of the Year" that winter. The following season he took over the management of Luton, but resigned that position when the Hatters finished bottom of the table and were relegated. He took over a coaching position with Leeds United, being succeeded as manager at Luton by Mr. Sam Bartram, the former Charlton Athletic goalkeeper, who at the time of his appointment to Kenilworth Road was managing York City.

Luton Town's only championship success was when they topped the Third Division (South) in 1937, two points ahead of Notts. County. That was the winter that Joe Payne set up a record-scoring achievement for the Southern Section by getting 55 goals out of Luton's total 103 in League matches. The season before Payne had scored no fewer than ten goals in one game, against Bristol Rovers at Kenilworth Road, which still remains the highest by any player in a Football League game.

Luton first became Football League members in 1897, when elected to the Second Division, but after three years they finished next to bottom and did not seek re-election, owing to high travelling expenses and other financial worries. Instead, they joined the Southern League, remaining there until becoming founder-members of the Third Division in 1920. Following their championship success in 1937 they gained promotion to the First Division, for the first time in 1955. That season Birmingham City, Luton, and Rotherham United all finished with 54 points, Birmingham taking the title on goal average, with Luton runners-up.

A Ashworth (Inside Forward). The player who, with Bramwell, joined Luton when Bingham was transferred to Everton. A very progressive player always looking for the ball.

R. Baynham (Goalkeeper). Has been with Luton since 1951. Secured from Southern League Club, Worcester City. Has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League versus the League of Ireland on two occasions and also for the England "B" Team versus the Yugoslavia "B". Was a member of the F.A. Touring Party to South America.

J. Bramwell (Full Back). One of the two players who joined Luton from Everton when Billy Bingham, the Irish International, was transferred to that Club during the middle of last October. Is a very capable player and we are very surprised he has not been considered for International honours.

R. Cope (Centre Half). Signed from Manchester Utd. just before the opening of the season. Has spent all his footballing career with Manchester Utd., signed as an amateur with them in 1950, turning professional in 1951. Was an England Schoolboy International. Has made 150 appearances for Manchester Utd. in the First Team.

J. Fleming (Outside Left). Came to Luton from Partick Thistle when we transferred Joe McBride, in November, 1960. Is a very capable player with a tremendous shot and good turn of speed.

J. Groves (Wing Half or Inside Forward). Won Derbyshire Schoolboy honours and was signed by Luton when only 15. Uses his height to great advantage and is a most accurate distributor of the ball.

T. McKechnie (Inside Forward). Born Glasgow and came here direct from Rob Roy at the end of last Season. Has shown excellent promise in the trial games and is undoubtedly a player of the future.

B. McNally (Full Back). Can occupy either full back position. Came from the League of Ireland Club, Shelbourne and has been with Luton since May 1956. Played for Eire "B" versus Rumania in Dublin in 1957 and also for Eire versus Czechoslovakia.

R. Morton (Wing half or Centre Forward). Local born and has been with the Club since 1948. Played for England "B" versus Switzerland "B" team, the Football Combination versus the Dutch XI (on two occasions) and also for the Football Association versus the Army. Was chosen as Reserve for England at Wembley in 1955 and again when they played Ireland in 1958. Usually a wing half but has made numerous appearances at Centre Forward.

G. Turner (Centre or Inside Forward). Came to Luton as a wing half upon his demob. from the Navy but found his true position in the forward line. Represented the English League versus the Scottish League in 1955 and also played for the F.A. XI versus the Army in 1958. The Town's leading goalscorer for seven seasons out of the last eight. Has a tremendous shot.

H. Walden (Outside Right). Joined Luton from Kettering last January and stepped straight into the first team at Norwich. An elbow injury prevented him from playing in the final weeks of last season, but he is now fully fit.
