Club Notes

After a very nice opening to the new season when we obtained six points out of a possible eight we have suffered rather a setback in that in our last two matches we have suffered defeat by the odd goal in each case. We should certainly have won our match against Huddersfield here a fortnight ago for mid-way through the second half we were enjoying a three goals to one lead which should be good enough at any time particularly before one's own crowd, and last week at Swansea we feel that if we had been allowed to field a full side for the whole ninety minutes we would have returned with at least a share of the spoils. Even with these two defeats however we have seen a satisfactory beginning and there are high hopes that we shall be enjoying a successful season, for the First team is playing very well and there are several players in the Reserves side just waiting the opportunity to show their paces with the seniors. The Reserves rather blotted their copy book last Saturday here against Leicester City Reserves who, with Derek Hines prompting from the Outside Right position, proved in the end too experienced for our lads although the second and third goals by Leicester we feel should both have been prevented. Although Alan Daniel played well Hines always seemed to have that little extra in reserve to be a menace. We feel that if it had not been for Hines our youngsters would have won the day. Their six goals to one victory over Notts. County Reserves here the previous Wednesday evening was a very good performance and was a tonic for all who saw it.

Our match here last Wednesday evening against Northampton Town in the First Round of the Football League Cup had all the excitement of a Cup Tie particularly in those last five minutes, when the 'Cobblers' drew level after being in arrears almost the whole match. Only for Gordon Turner to pull one right out of the bag in practically the last kick of the match. It was a magnificent goal, coming just at the right moment when we had all resigned ourselves to a Re-play at Northampton. If a Re-play had been required we do not know when it would have been played for the Second Round is due to be played during the week October 2nd to 5th, and as we have to meet Middlesbrough in two mid-week fixtures between now and then and particularly with Northampton also being engaged in mid-week fixtures, we would have been hard put-to to arrange a date. Fortunately Turner's goal put an end to such a quandary. The draw for the Second Round takes place on Sunday. We shall soon know therefore who our next opponents will be. We trust that if we are drawn at home again we shall have a better response than we had last Wednesday evening. It was most disappointing, particularly to our visitors who said they would have had at least twice our attendance if the match had been at Northampton.

We have the lads from Southampton providing the opposition to-day in this League II encounter, when we hope to see a match more on the classical lines than has been our experience lately. The Saints began the season in very disappointing fashion, losing their first two home games, to Plymouth and Leyton Orient, by two goals to one in each case.

Their hopes brightened when they beat Swansea at The Dell by five goals to one, but went back into the doldrums again when they were held to a 1-1 draw at home to Walsall the following Wednesday. Last Saturday however they went to Bury, winning by two clear goals, a very fine performance by any standard for Bury are playing very well and will not lose many matches at home this season. This win will undoubtedly have given our opponents fresh heart so we can fully expect a match full of incident.

The Luton Band under their Conductor Mr. Albert Coupe is playing at Belle Vue, Manchester, to-day in the National Brass Band Championship. We wish them well

in their endeavours to bring further honours to Luton. Their place is being taken to-day by the Bradwell Silver Prize Band, no strangers to Kenilworth Road, and we have no doubt you will all thoroughly enjoy their playing. We hope you will respond very well when their Collectors come round with the boxes, for it is only by such collections that these Bands are able to carry on.

Next Wednesday evening, kick-off 7.15 p.m., our youngsters will be playing Oxford City in the F.A. Youth Cup. Our First team will be playing at Middlesbrough, so we hope to have good news for those of you who come to see these youngsters in action.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Godfrey, Tony (Goalkeeper). Born in Newbury. Tony has just completed his National Service. Signed professional in 1958.

Davies, Ron (full back). A native of Merthyr Tydfil. Ron signed for Cardiff City at the age of 18. A versatile player, whilst with Cardiff he played at full back, wing half, inside forward and centre forward. Joined Southampton in March 1958.

Traynor, Tom (full back). A regular member of the side since he joined Southampton from Dundalk, his local club, in June 1952. Represented Eire against Luxembourg, in 1954.

Clifton, Brian (Inside forward/wing half). Born at Whitchurch in 1934. Brian is a product of Hampshire Schools Football. He signed professional forms in 1953.

Knapp (centre half) signed from Leicester City in August, 1961, for a five figure fee.

Huxford, Cliff (Wing half). Signed for Southampton in 1959 and appointed captain. A native of Stroud, Gloucestershire he signed for Chelsea as a youth. A very strong, determined player.

Paine, Terry (wing forward). Born at Winchester in 1939. Terry is a former N.A.B.C. and Southampton Boys player

who signed professional forms in February 1957. Since turning pro. he has gained representative honours on six occasions with the England Under 23 XI. Scored 25 goals from the right wing position in 1960/61 season.

O'Brien, George (inside forward). Born in Dunfermline, George first played for his local team in 1952 before his transfer to Leeds United in 1957. He joined Southampton in 1959 and has since held his position in the League side. Scored 27 goals in 1960/61.

Reeves, Derek (centre forward). A former Hampshire League player, Derck signed professional forms for Southampton in December 1954. A regular member of the team, he helped gain promotion in 1959/60 when he also scored 47 goals — a club record.

Mulgrewe, Tom (inside forward). A native of Motherwell, he first signed for Northampton Town. He signed for Southampton in August 1954 after a period with Newcastle United.

Penk, Harry (wing forward). A native of Wigan, Harry started his professional career with Portsmouth in 1955. He joined Plymouth Argyle, with whom he gained a Third Division Championship Medal, in 1957, and in July 1960 he signed for Southampton. A useful cricketer.

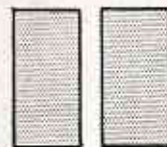
