Club Notes

SINCE we last played here we have obtained four valuable points in our two matches at Middlesbrough and at Charlton. The manner in which we were defeated by Southampton ten days ago did not give us much hope of getting any reward in our next two matches, especially as both were away from home. But the way our lads tackled their job at Middlesbrough last Wednesday evening made us forget quickly our previous inept display and although the Teesiders scored first our lads were playing so well that we felt goals must come, as they well did. In fact we played above Middlesbrough just as Southampton had played above us, and it was very difficult to reconcile oneself to the fact that we fielded the same team in those two matches, with the exception of the right back position, so utterly different did our lads play. Having thus wiped out the defeat by Southampton we went to The Valley last Saturday with more assurance and expecting to come away with at least a share of the spoils. We played badly, there is no getting away from that fact, for our forward line never throughout the match played together, but we came away with both points, thanks to a goal by Gordon Turner (his 201st goal for Luton Town) and some sterling work by our defence with Ron Baynham at his very best again. It is a long long time since we played so badly and yet won the match.

Middlesbrough will undoubtedly come here this evening very determined to prevent us obtaining a double over them this season, as well as to show us that in our win over them last Wednesday we had caught them on one of their off

days. They certainly did not allow the defeat to make them too despondent for they went to Vetch Field last Saturday and brought away with them a well-deserved point with each side scoring three goals. Those of us who remember the Middlesbrough of pre-war days recall the scoring feats of their great centre forward, George Camsell, who is still with the Club in an Official capacity. Like our own Joe Payne he had the distinction of scoring 59 goals in one season. Another Teesider of that era was George Hardwick, one of the great full backs. His classic displays in the England colours will long be remembered. Middlesbrough have now another full back, Mick McNeil following in George's footsteps and representing his country.

Our Reserve team here last Saturday gave their best performance for some little time when inflicting upon Plymouth Argyle their first defeat of the season. It was a very enjoyable match, full of incident and good play by both sides throughout. It was not until a very clever goal by Freddie Jardine in the second half did we manage to crack open the Argyle's strong defence. A well-taken hat trick by Alwyn McGuffie ensured us victory. We were very pleased to see Dave Pacey on his return playing at his very best again. Young Mark Lownds is also playing much better this season, he is now a player of very good promise.

While talking of good football we saw an excellent match here last Wednesday evening when our youngsters played Oxford City in the Preliminary Round of the F.A. Youth Cup. We have been drawn at home again in the First Round against Barnet Youth, which will be played on Wednesday, October 11th, kick-off 7.15 p.m.

Robert Appleby (goalkeeper) 5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. 1 lb. Born Workworth. Signed amateur at 16. Worked on ground staff. Signed professional at 17. Graduated through Junior teams to first team in the 1959/60 Season. Injury last season kept him out of Senior side for a long spell.

Derek Stonehouse (full back) 5 ft. 7 ins. 11 st. 1 lb. Born Lingdale. Signed amateur 1949 turning professional (part time) 1951. Has made regular appearances since 1953, when he began as full time professional. A tireless worker in defence.

Gordon Jones (full back) 5 ft. 7½ ins. 10 st. 10 lbs. Born Sedgefield. Joined Ground Staff in 1958. Soon recognised by selectors—being selected for England Youths against Switzerland last season, also made his first team debut.


