### Club Notes

TO-DAY we have the pleasure of a visit by last season's Division 3 Winners, Bury. The last time they played here was on Wednesday evening, 1st September, 1954 in our last League match with them when we won by three goals to two. At the end of that season we went on to win promotion to the First Division while Bury continued as members of the Second Division until season 1956/57 when having obtained only 25 points they were relegated with Port Vale. Last season however 'The Shakers' as they are called set a cracking pace throughout, finishing six points above Walsall who came up with them and scoring 108 goals against 45 in the 46 matches played. At the moment they are level pegging with us having obtained twelve points from the eleven matches played to date, although we have played six matches 'away' to 'The Shakers' five. They have away wins to their credit at Brighton and Bristol Rovers. However only four goals have been scored on opponents' grounds which shows a lack of scoring power when not playing before their own crowd. Our defence to-day will have to see to it that that figure is not materially increased while our forwards proceed to put our goal average on a better footing.

Our visit to the North East last Saturday did not turn out as we had hoped for after a promising start we were one down on Newcastle's first visit up the field due to a mistake which seemed to seal our fate for the match. Our forwards had one of those days when nothing would go right, quite different from the visit to Middlesbrough only a matter of ten days earlier and

it was most difficult to reconcile the fact that it was the same team with the single exception of McGuffie having replaced McKechnie. This one change however was certainly not the cause of the lack of cohesion in our forward line, they just seemed to have one of those days when little would go right.

While up in the North Jim Fleming took the opportunity to arrange for his wedding which took place last Monday at Denny, Stirlingshire. We wish him well in his new life, Good Health and Happiness, and that his bride will soon settle down in her new surroundings.

Last Wednesday evening we met Rotherham United in the Second Round of the Football League Cup. The Manager had quite a worry in selecting his team for he was deprived of the services of Turner, Cope, McKechnie, Walden through injuries as well as Fleming not yet returned from his wedding. Considering that six of our lads who were playing in the Reserve team last Saturday played against Rotherham we did well to keep them to a draw, but even then if a chance had been taken in the early stages when the ball was flashed just the wrong side of an upright with the goalie well beaten, and again later when the same upright was hit, the Rotherham lads would have been hard put to have avoided defeat. The Re-play will take place next Tuesday, October 10th, kick-off 7 p.m.

**John Heath** (goalkeeper). 6 ft. 11 st. 7 lbs. Joined Bury three seasons ago after a short spell with Blackburn Rovers. Played consistently with the Central League side.

**Brian Gallagher** (full back). 5 ft. 9 ins. 11 st. 2 lbs. Took over from Eddie Robertson towards the end of last term. Born Oldham and joined the Club from Ashton United in the Lancashire Combination at 18.

**Bobby Conroy** (full back). 5 ft. 8 ins. 11 st. 7 lbs. From near Glasgow Bob joined Bury as junior from Ashfield and has played consistently for four seasons.

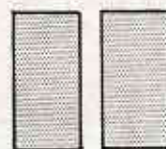
