Club Notes

YET another two points which should have been in the bag were allowed to slip by last Saturday when we played at Brighton. We had been enjoying a one goal lead for about two-thirds of the match which should have been improved upon for there had been good chances of doing so but which had been missed. In the last fifteen minutes or so Brighton began banging the ball down the field hoping for slips to occur as all their approach work until then had failed. Two chances occurred which the Brighton forwards took full advantage of, and so we allowed two more points to pass us by. To have enjoyed so much superiority throughout the match and yet to return empty-handed was most disappointing, but that is football. We hope our lads will make up for that loss to-day with a resounding victory which will enable us to stay up with the leaders.

We welcome Scunthorpe United to our Ground to-day in a League 2 fixture, trusting to see an entertaining struggle. Scunthorpe, elected to the League in 1950, gained promotion to the Second Division after only eight seasons in the Third, a performance of some merit. So far this season they are unbeaten at home, but they have also yet to win their first match away, in fact in the six matches played on opponents' Grounds so far their only reward was obtained at Norwich when they held the Canaries to a draw of two goals each. Mr. Duckworth their Manager says they are due for an away win. We hope the day is delayed a little longer.

We shall be without the services of Gordon Turner for a week or two, for

since Monday night he has been in the Radcliffe Infirmary, Oxford under treatment for suspected pneumonia. He complained of a chill before our friendly match with Oxford City last Monday evening but thought that by playing he would be able to fight it off. Half way through the match however he had to leave the field and was taken to the Infirmary. He was still there when these Notes were being penned last Thursday evening, but it was hoped he would be allowed to return home yesterday. We all sincerely hope he makes a quick and complete recovery. Bob Morton, who has also been out of action lately, is hoping to be fit for to-day in which case he resumes yet again the centre forward position. Always willing to play in whatever position he is chosen Bob has been and still is a wonderful Club man and an example for any youngster to follow. His efforts for his Club we do assure him are very much appreciated.

The Charity Match played here last Monday evening was a success in every way apart from the attendance, which was just over the two thousand mark. Some good football was enjoyed from Jesse Pye, Wally Barnes, Bernard Stretton and Co., and the Show Biz XI. The Pipe Band of H.M. 1st Battalion Scots Guards, the kick-off by Luton's Beauty Queen and a display by the Army Physical Training Corps., made an entertaining evening.

Our youngsters were drawn to play Chelsea at Stamford Bridge in the South East Counties Floodlit Cup, the match taking place last Wednesday. Everyone thought it would be a matter of just how many would the Chelsea lads win by, but lo and behold we were leading by

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Ken Jones (Goalkeeper). Former Welsh under 23 International, was signed from Cardiff City in 1958. A native of South Wales, and a keen cricketer in the summer. Was in the official Wales party for the last World Cup series.

Barry Horstead (centre half). Was regular first team centre half last season. Born in Brigg, he signed for Scunthorpe from Brigg Town after completing national service. Has also played well at full back.

Jack Brownsword (full back). A veteran service player, who joined the club from Frickley Colliery in 1947 and has missed few games, apart from when injured. Had a spell with Hull City before going to Frickley. A native of Bentley, near Doncaster, and a former collier.

A. Gibson (wing half). Joined Scunthorpe for a big fee from Leeds United at the start of last season. A fine ball playing wing half, and very strong in the tackle. Another Scot, who went straight to Leeds from Scottish junior football.

Peter Neale (centre or wing half). Was successfully converted to centre half last season, but is best known as a wing half or inside forward. Joined Scunthorpe four years ago from Oldham Athletic. A native of Derbyshire.

Ron Howells (wing half). Signed in the close season from Portsmouth, in an exchange deal involving centre forward

Harry Middleton. Has played Under 23 international football for Wales. Previously with West Bromwich Albion.

Jack Marriott (wing forward). A most experienced player, who started out with Scunthorpe, his birth place, before going to Sheffield Wednesday and Huddersfield, returning to Scunthorpe in 1957. Can also play on the left wing. A keen golfer.

John Kaye (centre or inside forward). Signed from Goole Town last season, and became a full time player this season. Had several first team games last year, and showed promise. Born at Goole.

Barry Thomas (centre forward). One of the Second Division's leading marksmen last season. A go ahead leader, who likes nothing better than taking chances. A native of Leicester, he joined Scunthorpe from Mansfield. Was previously with Leicester, where he gained an England youth cap.

Brian Godfrey (inside forward). Signed from Everton as a winger at the start of last season, but was an immediate success as an inside forward. A native of Bangor, North Wales, and is considered among Scunthorpe's brightest young players.

Andy Wilson (wing forward). Signed for a fee in the close season from Sheffield United. A Yorkshireman and a fast and direct winger.


