CLUB NOTES

This afternoon Luton Town are our visitors in what should be a close, keen, exciting match if the two clubs' positions in the League Table are any indication. To the "Hatters," Directors, Officials, players and supporters we extend a hearty welcome to Carrow Road. They are successfully managed by our old friend Sam Bartram the ex-Charlton goalkeeper and York City Manager and although we are long standing rivals, apart from the Cup semi-final in season 1958-59, we have not met on many occasions and this is only their second visit to Carrow Road since the war. Last season the lads took four points from the Hertfordshire Club and may they continue the good work today.

On Saturday last at Southampton a very good point was gained and from all accounts the team at times played some most polished football and in the end could so easily have left The "Dell" with the two points, after a convincing second half display. It would be unfair to single out any individual player for special mention because I am lead to understand it was a real team effort. Our goals were scored by Terry Allcock and Bill Punton.

The Reserve team at home to Notts County did well to draw one all with a strong Notts County team which included several first team players at the last minute owing to the fact that their first team fixture with Hull City was postponed. An encouraging aspect of the game from City's point of view was the most successful debut by one of our young ground staff boys Colin Worrell at full-back. Our goal scorer was Derrick Lythgoe.

The "B" Team suffered an unexpected reverse at Harleston losing by 4 goals to 2, but we were unfortunate in losing the services of our goalkeeper Peter Applegate who had to leave the field with a thigh injury in the second half.

After playing so well at Southampton our form against Peterborough last Wednesday was somewhat disappointing. However, we must not take from Peterborough the credit for a good win as on the night's showing were worthy winners by 3 goals to 1. On this form they must be considered serious contenders for promotion to the Second Division.

"I" IS FOR CANARY ALPHABET

Willie INGHAM who holds the distinction of being the only Norwich City first-team player whose name has begun with that letter!

Ingham joined City from Rossendale United in 1910 as an inside-forward whom, it was said, a novice could play outside. He stayed until 1914, when he went to Darlington, making 131 appearances and scoring 32 goals, 15 of which, in 1910-11 made him that season's leading scorer for the club. The "I's" are too short for one edition, so here's a first look at . . .

"J" IS FOR . . .

The Jones Boys! There have been enough of them on City's books to fill one edition. First was A. T. JONES, a full-back who joined Norwich in 1907-8 from Notts County. He had played for Wales against England when with Nottingham Forest in 1905-6, but he made only six appearances for City.

Goalkeeper ORMOND JONES made four more appearances than that. He was signed in May 1934 (he had been with Yeovil and Port Vale) and left for Watford in 1936. After retiring he ran a boarding house at Gorleston.

SID JONES had a much better appearance record. He came from Bolton and between 1945 and 1948 had 48 League and Cup games, scoring 10 goals. A winger, he later went to March as player-manager.

Best known of the City Jones' was BRYN, one of the best known footballers of all time. He made his name as a youngster with Wolves, whom he joined in 1932-33 and it is a commentary on the rising scale of transfer fees that the £14,000 that Arsenal paid for this inside-forward genius in 1938 was then a record. Bryn Jones was capped 17 times for Wales. He joined City in 1949-50 as player-coach and made 26 appearances, with three goals to his credit.

But ill health overtook him and he was given a free transfer.

Last of the Jones' was DENYS, yet another Welshman. He was on City's books as an amateur, but went to Yarmouth, where he turned professional, and the Canaries had to pay a fee for him when he rejoined them in 1951. He had only six first team games but he goes down in the record book as one of the few Canaries who scored on his debut.

The first of his two goals for the club came in his first League match, on the right wing against Walsall, whom City beat that day by eight goals.

TODAY'S VISITORS

To the average Norwich City supporter, the name of Luton Town has only one association—F.A. Cup semi-final defeat at Birmingham in March, 1959.

Although the Canaries gained some measure of revenge last season by completing a double over the Kenilworth Road club, the memory of that defeat at St. Andrews still rankles and for that reason if for no other this afternoon's game takes on added interest.

Yet a lot of water has flowed under a lot of bridges since those memorable semi-final ties of three seasons ago. City have jumped from the Third Division to the Second. For Luton fortune has not been so kind.

Last season, after dropping out of Division One, they found themselves, for a time, struggling to avoid a drop even further down the League ladder.

The manager's job at Kenilworth Road was a tough assignment for Sam Bartram, the goalkeeper who in his heyday was synonymous with the name of Charlton Athletic; but he has tackled it in a realistic way, and this season the Hatters are a far more dangerous proposition than when they visited Norwich a year ago.

Home defeat by Scunthorpe last Saturday meant that Luton fell below City in the Second Division table. But the Hatters had a hard luck story to spin, especially as they were without leading scorer Gordon Turner—one of the few survivors, by the way, of that famous Cup run. Also by the way, another of them was at Carrow Road only on Wednesday, for Hawkes, the Peterborough full-back who had the misfortune to be carried from the field, was signed from Luton last close season.

There are a lot of new faces in this Luton side, however. Apart from Hawkes, gone are such players as Syd Owen—the man who above all others blocked the Canaries' path to Wembley—and Billy Bingham, whose goal won Luton the right to meet Nottingham Forest in the 1959 Cup Final.






