Club Notes

WHAT a tonic we received last Saturday as the news kept coming through from Norwich that our lads were going forward to a most decisive victory. It is a long time since we enjoyed such a victory on an opponents ground and it is a long time since we could boast an away record as good as our home record with more than a third of the season behind us. Now of course we are regretting more than ever those points lost at Kenilworth Road, each one of which should have been avoided for if they had not been lost we would now be in a very strong position in the League Table. We cannot do anything about that now except to be determined that we must not lose any more points at home except possibly to a better team.

The lads from Leeds are our visitors to-day and we extend to them once more a warm welcome to Kenilworth Road. So far this season they have found the going rather tough and before today's match hold the unenviable position of second place from the bottom. They have obtained eight points at home, the same as ourselves, but their away record with only a win at Brighton and a draw at Plymouth is the reason for their present lowly position. They are managed by Don Revie, who took over mid-way through last season on the retirement of

Jack Taylor, and with Syd Owen as Chief Coach much was expected of this combination. That it has proved disappointing in so far as results are concerned is surprising, but youngsters introduced are taking time to settle into the pattern, and that we feel is the position here. However we can be sure of a very hard game from them this afternoon in their effort to get away from the bottom of the table.

We had been hoping that our efforts to procure the signature of Brian Walsh from Cardiff City in time for to-day's match would have been successful but at the time these Notes were being prepared the dotted line was still blank. In all fairness to Walsh we must say the snag is in no way due to any awkwardness on his part or his present Club but difficulties in sitting for a Final Professional Examination. The matter is still under consideration.

We played the Bolivian team from La Paz here on Thursday night last in a Friendly match before a very disappointing crowd. Unfortunately it was not possible to advertise the match very much as the final confirmation was not received until exactly a week before the match, due to the person with the authority to grant permission not being available as he had been called to another country. We advertised as much

as we could however in the local papers which was adequate for those interested. There were not three thousand people present, a fact which will be borne in mind when other offers for Friendly Matches at Kenilworth Road are being considered. Having won so handsomely at Norwich only the previous Saturday we did expect a bigger crowd especially following that victory. The opposition with their record of victories on the Continent looked a good proposition, but they have found English football played under our own particular conditions quite an unsurmountable problem. The Bolivians after their long Tour are finding the mounting injuries position quite a problem. We are quite sure that

if they had commenced their Tour here in England we would have seen quite a different display from them for undoubtedly they are clever ball players and their shooting at times was very good. Our defence however was much too strong for them and so we won the match quite comfortably. We were asked by the President of the Club to thank those supporters who attended the match for their very sporting interest in the game—a very nice tribute, and to say that he is sorry his lads did not play as well as he knows they can. They all enjoyed their visit to Luton and remarked that we have a very good team. Certainly as our lads played last Thursday they would have beaten most teams.

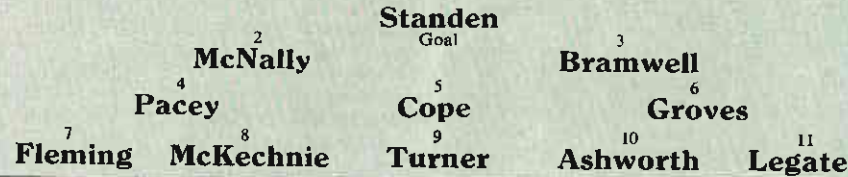

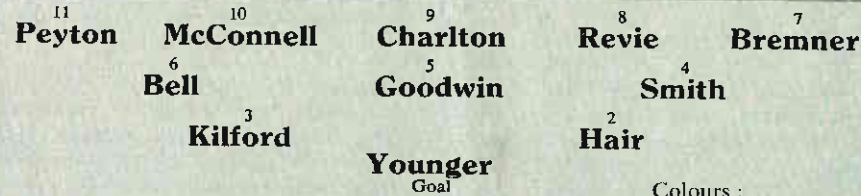
