Club Notes

WHAT a grand shot in the arm our visitors to-day Stoke City in particular and the Second Division in general have received since Stoke's commendable action in obtaining the signature of the one and only Stanley Matthews. While undoubtedly still an attraction whenever he played for Blackpool it was nothing like the enthusiasm which has been displayed at the Stoke ground or on opponents' grounds when the maestro has played since leaving the Seasiders. We never thought we would see him in action again at Kenilworth Road but all being well we shall see him to-day and thus many more will be seeing this match who would not otherwise have been here. We hope you all enjoy the afternoon's sport and that it will re-create some if not all the enthusiasm which has been enjoyed in the past at Kenilworth Road. Whenever the name of Stanley Matthews is mentioned we who saw it immediately think of that day in September 1956 when we played Blackpool at Bloomfield Road in a League 1 fixture. Bud Aherne was our left back but Stan that day was absolutely irrepressible. Stan has played many many brilliant games in his long career but never one more brilliant than on that occasion. Thank you Stoke City for giving us the opportunity of seeing this great player in action again. With Jackie Mudie as his Inside Forward who knows just the kind of ball Stan likes we should see some great football here to-day.

Stoke City, one of the original members of the Football League when it was formed in 1888 is the second

oldest Club in the League, having been Founded in 1863, only one year after Notts. County. Despite their long career they have never won either of the major honours of being League Champions or winning the F.A. Cup. They were League 2 Champions in 1932/33, Runners-up in 1921/22 and Division 3 (North) Champions in 1926/27, but the highest position in the Senior League was fourth in 1935/36 and again in 1946/47. This season so far they have not won a match on their opponent's ground but have picked up a point each at Charlton and Scunthorpe. Their position in the League 2 Table at present does not look well, but with only nine points difference between second from bottom and second from top, two consecutive wins for instance could make a big difference to any one of the twenty Clubs between these two positions.

We came back from Liverpool last Saturday with another point in the bag, our first draw of the season in seventeen matches. Without doubt Liverpool had the majority of the play which was not surprising considering all the circumstances. To be a goal down after only six minutes' play against the leaders before their own crowd would have dismayed most teams into merely trying to keep the score down but our lads continued to play their own normal game causing White, the Liverpool right back on two occasions to kick off the goal-line with Slater beaten, so that it was not all one way traffic as some of the Press reports would have us believe.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

J. O'Neill (goalkeeper). 5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. 10 lbs. Born Dublin, this Eire International was transferred from Everton during the close season of 1960.

W. Asprey (full back or wing half). 6 ft. 1 in. Born Wolverhampton. Another product of the Club's Junior Teams, having signed as Amateur 1952. With plenty first Team experience now behind him he is a valuable asset to the Club.

A. Allen (left back). 5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. 12 lbs. A local boy who played for the same school team as Stan Matthews — Wellington Road, Hanley. An England Youth International and has played for the England Under 23 team, is now a full International.

R. G. Howitt (half back). 5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. 7 lbs. Born Glasgow. Signed from Sheffield United as an inside forward but was converted into a half back last season. Was with Partick Thistle before joining Sheffield.

R. E. H. Andrew (centre half). 6 ft. 12 st. 7 lbs. Signed from Ellesmere Port Town, Cheshire League Club in 1954. Became regular First Team centre half in 1958.

E. T. Skeels (half back). 5 ft. 8 ins. 10 st. 7 lbs. Born Eccles, Manchester. a constructive half back, became regular First Team half back last season. Signed for the Club in 1958.

Stanley Matthews (outside right). The best-known name in present-day football. His many years of service to English football were recognised in 1958, when the Queen presented him with the C.B.E.

First played for Stoke City in 1931/32, transferred to Blackpool in 1947 and back to Stoke last month. Was twice on the losing side at Wembley, but in one of his many great games at the mecca of English football won a Cup Winners medal playing against Bolton in 1953. Made his International debut against Wales in 1935 and has altogether made 54 appearances for England, the last in the Qualifying Rounds of the World Cup in 1957.

J. K. Mudie (centre forward or inside forward). 5 ft. 6½ ins. 11 st. 2 lbs. Born Dundee. Signed from Blackpool in March of last season. Has played for Scotland many times and has many goals to his credit.

P. L. Bullock (centre forward). 5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. 7 lbs. A local boy. Schools and Youth English International. Made his First Team debut when only just 16 years old. A natural two footed player.

T. Thompson (inside forward). 5 ft. 7 ins. 10 st. 5 lbs. Born Co. Durham. Also signed during close season from Preston North End. Has played for England on a number of occasions.

D. Ratcliffe (wing half or forward). 5 ft. 8½ ins. 10 st. 6 lbs. A local boy who graduated through the Club's Junior Teams, having signed as amateur in 1952. A utility player has played for the Club in all positions except goal and centre half.

J. Adam (outside left). 5 ft. 8 ins. Born Blantyre. Signed from Aston Villa during close season. Joined the Villa from Luton Town.




