Club Notes

AFTER our thrilling match here three weeks ago against Rotherham United, a victory which left us placed nicely in the Table and conjured great hopes of improving on that position with two fairly easy, so we thought, away matches where we fully expected to at least avoid defeat we go and lose both of them and so find ourselves to-day unexpectedly nearly half way down the Table. The thought that we should have won both matches comfortably is no consolation. At Bristol chances were missed in the first twenty minutes which should have put the issue beyond all doubt at that early stage, and at Preston last Saturday, it is a long time since we saw our forwards so shot-shy. Some allowance must be made we feel for the fact that Gordon Turner and Tommy McKechnie two of our best scoring forwards were not playing at Preston which undoubtedly affected our scoring power—Turner was also absent at Bristol—but even this handicap should not have resulted in not a goal being scored by us in either match. Turner is progressing very nicely following his cartilage operation giving us hope that we shall see him in action again before the end of January. We certainly could have done with his services in these last two matches. Tommy McKechnie's injury has responded very well and he could play if conditions are suitable to-day. Unfortunately Rolly Legate's injury which was progressing well received a set-back last Monday during training when he accidentally stubbed the ground, so that any thought of his recall to the team for to-day's match had to be dropped.

We extend a warm welcome to the lads from Plymouth, our visitors to-day,

in a League II encounter. After a very indifferent start to the season the Argyle lately have been doing much better and in fact before to-day's match lie only one point behind us in the League Table. Last week's win at home to Southampton by four clear goals emphasize that revival, and so to-day we can expect a ding-dong struggle for those precious points. That win by Argyle last week incidentally against Southampton accomplished their first double of the season for previously they had won at The Dell by two goals to one when they met in the opening match of the season. Wins also at Leyton Orient and Newcastle with draws at Bury and Preston shows they are a team not to be taken lightly. Like ourselves they have lost at home three times this season, one of them against us when we beat them by three clear goals. Dare we hope that we repeat that performance today!

It is regretted we have not been able to arrange for a match at Kenilworth Road on Boxing Day. We have been trying to arrange a South East Counties fixture to be brought forward but of no avail. Enquiries for a Reserve Friendly match have also all ended without any success. Therefore to-day's match is the only one being played on this Ground during the Christmas Holiday.

We still have a few tickets unsold for our F.A. Cup match at Ipswich on January 6th so that any Season Ticket Holder who perhaps is wondering if it is worth while applying is likely to be successful if application is made without delay. We have received a few Tickets at 8/- each from Ipswich so that these are available as well as the 6/6 tickets. Any tickets not taken up by Season Ticket Holders by 1st January will be

David Maclaren (goalkeeper). 6 ft. 1 in. 12 st. 8 lbs. Transferred to Plymouth from Leicester City May, 1960. Was with Leicester for 3 seasons, formerly with Dundee F.C. Born Auchterarder, Perthshire.

George Robertson (right back or centre half). 5 ft. 9 ins. 10 st. 11 lbs. Has been with Argyle for 11 years, coming to Plymouth from Gairdoch Juniors in June 1950. Originally a half back, has given excellent service in other defensive positions. Born Bainsford, Stirlingshire.

Bryce Fulton (left back). 5 ft. 9 ins. 12 st. Joined Argyle from Manchester United in August 1957. Native of Kilwinning, Ayrshire. Has been regular first team performer at left back for two seasons.

John S. J. Williams (half back.) 5 ft. 9 ins. 11 st. 7 lbs. Another local player. Has given the Club excellent service as right half back, and also occasionally, at inside forward. Gained several representative honours whilst on National Service with the Army. Plymouth born.
