SECRETARY-MANAGER'S NOTES

Today I extend a warm welcome to Luton Town's players, officials and supporters for the F.A. Cup third round tie. We have an old score to settle with the Hatters not only for last season's Second Division "double" which they inflicted upon us, but also for the 5-2 fifth round Cup defeat at Portman Road in 1959. In that year Luton were a First Division club and actually reached Wembley only to be defeated by Nottingham Forest in the final. We were then in the Second Division having defeated Huddersfield Town at home and Stoke City away in the third and fourth rounds. This season the tables are turned with Luton in the Second Division, but I anticipate a tough match and know that we will have to be at our best to win. In the past we have been written off by the critics as being "not a Cup fighting side". I hope that we will be able to squash that argument once and for all with a successful run in the competition this season.

We collected two points from our Christmas matches, losing against Manchester City at Maine Road and beating Leicester City by a single Ray Crawford goal at Portman Road on Boxing Day. Our trip to Manchester was disappointing in that we failed to adapt our play to the bone-hard conditions and City duly completed a League double by three clear goals. The match with Leicester, which promised to have been a tremendous game was also rather spoilt by the conditions.

The return game at Filbert Street last Saturday was one of 42 English and Scottish League matches called off because of the weather. We had reached London when we received the message that the referee considered the snow-bound pitch unfit for play. Most of the players returned home and I took the chance to watch the Border League side beat Brantham 2-1 at Westerfield. Our Combination match with Leicester was called off on the Friday afternoon because the pitch here was almost flooded.

It is with deep sorrow that I record the passing of Mrs. Mills who has been responsible for the catering in the Boardroom for many years. She has been a wonderful servant to the Club, one of the staunchest supporters, and she will be very much missed.



History in brief. They were founded in 1885 and were the first Southern club to employ professional players. In the Southern League from 1894 to 1896 and were elected to Division II in the following year. "The Hatters" play at Kenilworth Road and are managed by Mr. Sam Bartram.

Highest positions. Eighth in Division I, 1957-58. Runners-up Division II, 1954-55. Defeated F.A. Cup finalists in 1959.

Ron Baynham (goalkeeper). Has been with Luton since 1951 when secured from Southern League Worcester City. An England international, he has also represented the Football League.

Brendan McNally (right-back). Joined the Hatters from Shelbourne in May 1956, he is an Eire international.

John Bramwell (left-back). One of two players who joined Luton when Billy Bingham, the Irish international, was transferred to Everton in October, 1960. He previously played for Wigan.

Bob Merton (right-half). An England "B" international who has been with Luton since 1948.

Ronnie Cope (centre-half). Signed from Manchester United just before the start of the season. A former England Schoolboy international.

Dave Pacey (left-half). A former England Under 23 international, he joined Luton in 1956.

Harry Walden (outside-right). Joined Luton from Kettering last season and stepped straight into the first team.

Alec Ashworth (inside-right). A danger man in the Luton attack, he has an eye for goal and a fantastic turn of speed.

Robin Chandler (centre-forward). A 17 year old local boy who has just signed professional after playing one Second Division match as an amateur. He is deputising for Gordon Turner who has cartilage trouble.

Tom McKechnie (inside-left). A Scottish boy who joined the Luton staff in May last year and has established himself in the first team.

Fred Jardine (outside-left). Signed in May, 1961 from Dundee after two seasons with the Scottish club. Born in Edinburgh.
