Club Notes

WHAT a great pity there were not more of our supporters at the Portman Road Ground last Saturday to see our lads worthily hold the Ipswich lads to a draw and so bring about this match here tonight. The greatest credit must go to our lads for making this evening's match necessary. First of all due to the atrocious weather we experienced all last week the support we had at the match was well below standard, but the six hundred or so who made the trip certainly made their presence felt as our lads came onto the field but the point is that that surging enthusiasm which is so encouraging to a team playing away from home especially in a Cup match was not there. This is indeed no reflection on the few who did attend, and the roar which they mustered when Robin Chandler most efficiently for one so young put the ball into the net almost made up for the missing thousands. Second point is that we could not have got off to a worse start, for with the game less than a minute old we were already one down, scored by the ever-menacing Ted Phillips with a clever flick of the head passed the advancing Ron Bayham. It was a splendidly taken goal which of course

put the Ipswich lads right on their toes. Five minutes later however we could have been on level terms if Tommy McKechnie had been just a couple of feet nearer the Ipswich goal from a cross from the right by Alec Ashworth but the ball crossed the bye line just a few yards beyond the far upright, with Tommy making desperate efforts to connect. And so the match went on, first one side nearly getting that now very important second goal and then the other. Ipswich began the second half with the slight slope in their favour as if they were going to put paid once and for all to the cry that they were not good Cup fighters and at the same time to wipe out the two defeats they have suffered at Portman Road at our expense in recent years. But our lads weathered the storm and gradually began to come more into the game and were in fact most dangerous when on the attack. The second half was twelve minutes' old when some nice play on the right between Harry Walden and Alec Ashworth left Robin Chandler in possession on about the penalty spot but covered by the centre half. Robin coolly beat his opponent and as the goalie came out put the ball past him into the net. A very fine effort indeed which, as has been already stated, sent the few supporters present into great exhilaration

to make their journey all worth while. We had one or two chances after that to be on the winning side, Ipswich had one splendid chance in particular near the end to ensure victory but Ron Baynham brought off an excellent save, and so we left the field very satisfied with the day's work. Every one of our lads played his heart out in this match, and great credit must go to them for holding this very accomplished Ipswich side to a draw especially when considering all the circumstances

A victory to our lads this evening is no foregone conclusion, but if they play as well as they did last Saturday we will we feel certain be making a journey to either Norwich or Wrexham on Saturday, January 27th in the Fourth Round of the Cup. As Norwich have Ground advantage in their Tie with Wrexham being played to-night, postponed from last Saturday due to the pitch at Norwich being unfit for play, we could be making our second consecutive battle with an East Anglian Club in the

F.A. Cup as we did in our Wembley trial three years ago. We wonder if there is any significance in this observation.

If victory is ours to-night we shall of course be playing away on January 27th. There is so much uncertainty however due to the fact that the match between Norwich and Wrexham tonight could end in a draw as also could our own match that it is most difficult to announce in this Programme arrangements for the 27th. We should know our position by Thursday, January 18th and so we hope to advertise in that day's "Luton News" the arrangements agreed upon for January 27th. We shall of course be pleased to give what information we can to anyone ringing us on Luton 3151.

We can most certainly look forward to a very entertaining as well as exciting match this evening, so we hope bringing back some of the old enthusiasm which unhappily has been missing lately.


