## SPOTLIGHT

**A**FTER the thrills and spills of Tuesday night's F.A. Cup third round victory over Rotherham United Town return to the equally important business of gaining League points this afternoon.

The visit of Luton Town, to whom we extend a warm welcome, provides us with the first Saturday afternoon senior game since December 2nd when Bury were the opposition, and it represents a chance for skipper John Coddington and his team-mates to improve their Second Division position, and complete their first "double" of the season.

If the game matches up to the thriller at Kenilworth Road in September, when we came from behind to win 4-3, there should be another feast of excitement at Leeds Road today.

Derek Stokes scored two of our goals at Luton, and a repeat performance would be very welcome. The "Spotlight" team believe that if Stokes could regain the scoring touch

which brought him six goals in the first five games this term, the team could still have a highly successful season.

At the beginning of December, Luton and manager Sam Bartram, were thinking in terms of promotion. With twenty-three points from twenty games they were fourth in the table, and they had just gained creditable draws at Liverpool and Sunderland. Since then five matches have brought them only two points, however, and their First Division hopes have faded.

Indeed, they have failed to score in any of their last four League outings - three of which have been away from home.

The absence of centre-forward Gordon Turner, who went into hospital for a cartilage operation in November, has undoubtedly affected their in-front-of-goal performances.

Turner has often presented a problem to our boys, grabbing two goals which earned Luton three

points against us last season. In six of the last eight campaigns, he has topped Luton's scoring list, and again this time he was proving their most consistent marksman.

Before the injury to Turner, Luton were scoring quite freely. Their attacking ability is underlined by the fact that they are credited with four goals on six occasions, and three four times.

The Town defence must beware of slipping into the casual attitude they adopted with very nearly serious consequences against Rotherham. A goal by nineteen-year-old Robin Chandler in the F.A Cup third round game at Ipswich last Saturday earned Luton a replay and ended their goal-less spell.

A lapse by Town could provide the Londoners with just the encouragement they need. Let's hope that the lesson from Tuesday has been taken to heart in the Leeds Road camp.

Whatever else happens, there should be plenty of chances for the attack to underline their new-found finishing power. Besides ourselves, Southampton and Newcastle have scored four against Luton, and the visitors defence has been operating on a two-goals per match basis over the last five games.

Incidentally, congratulations are due to Kevin McHale, whose goal in the thirty-first minute against Rotherham was his first in F.A. Cup football. Previously he had played in thirteen Cup games without scoring.

Town's next two games are on grounds, the names of which conjure up memories of stirring First Division encounters. A week today they travel to St. James's Park to tackle Newcastle United, and in a fortnight Villa Park is the venue for the fourth round Cup tie with Aston Villa.




