

**Club Notes**

AFTER all the hopes we had of doing well in the F.A. Cup Competition this year following our two draws with First Division Ipswich Town we really did come a cropper at Highbury last Monday in the second Re-play. There has been more conjecture over our decision to play against the wind in this second Re-play upon winning the toss than we can remember on any other point. On the face of it the decision of not taking advantage of the elements in the first half when they were available to us seems a wrong one, but the lads had worked on the theory that if we could hold the Ipswich forwards during the first half we would be in a very strong position for the second half. The same decision had been made at Huddersfield last Saturday and on previous occasions which had proved successful, and therefore it seemed feasible to try the same tactics last Monday. Perhaps if those tactics had failed at Huddersfield we might still be in the Cup! We have however had a good run for our money, and who will forget that match here a week last Wednesday when we saw a wonderful game of football played in the very best tradition of the F.A. Cup. Both sides thoroughly deserved the ovation they received as they walked off the field that night.

Our lads brought home the points with them last Saturday on their visit to Huddersfield, a very good performance indeed. To win such a match with an important Cup Tie only two days ahead is certainly good going, and especially when we had another of what we consider a very harsh penalty kick decision against us which had brought the scores level. With only twelve minutes to go a really

first class piece of co-operation between Dave Pacey and Bob Morton left Bob with an opening and from fully thirty yards out he hit the ball with such force that the Huddersfield goalie just could not do anything about stopping it entering the net. A wonderful goal and well worth going a long way to see. This win registered our fifth away victory of the season.

We welcome once again Swansea Town to Kenilworth Road in a League II fixture. Last Saturday the Swans lost at home to Southampton, their third of the season. They have, it is rather surprising to note, yet to register their first away win of the season, but they have drawn on no fewer than five occasions. In the twelve matches played on opponents' grounds they have scored only 14 goals, conceding 36. It is noticed that Mel Nurse is still with this Welsh side despite announcements in the National Press on several occasions of his imminent transfer at a very high fee. We are informed that he is now playing as well as he ever did, welcome news no doubt to the Welsh Selectors.

This week has been a week of woe, commencing with our defeat in the Cup and ending with seven of our professional players not fit for duty to-day. Having a playing staff of only 30 in an effort to keep expenses at a minimum the Manager is at times hard put to to field three teams. To-day is the worst we have ever known for players with first team experience in Ashworth, Chandler, Cope, Groves, Legate are not available together with Brogan and Riddick, which means that we have only 23 professionals to call on, three of them goalkeepers. In addition, as if the position was not bad enough, Bob Morton after being examined by the Club Doctor yesterday morning was

reported to be not fit enough for first team duty. He should of course not play but the position is so desperate that Bob, the great player he is and always has been, offered to turn out for the Reserves and so he is playing at Leicester this afternoon. What a great club man. Fortunately Gordon Turner has been considered fit to resume playing, and while the Manager would have preferred to have given him his first match in the Reserves side circumstances have forced him to put Turner straight into League football. We trust his return is a successful one. We wish here to express our thanks once more to the Doctors and Staff of the Luton & Dunstable Hospital for the splendid job they have done on

Turner's knee for he has been got fit in the minimum of time.

As we have not a League fixture for January 27th, we have arranged a Friendly Match with the Scottish First Division Club Falkirk. There is a friendly connection between our two Clubs and for some time we have been waiting an opportunity to invite them to play at Kenilworth Road. That opportunity now presents itself and so we trust a very nice crowd will come to watch them in action. It will be their first visit to this Ground and so we look forward to receiving them. Kick-off will be at the usual time of 3 p.m. and as it is a Friendly Match Season Tickets will not be usable that day.
