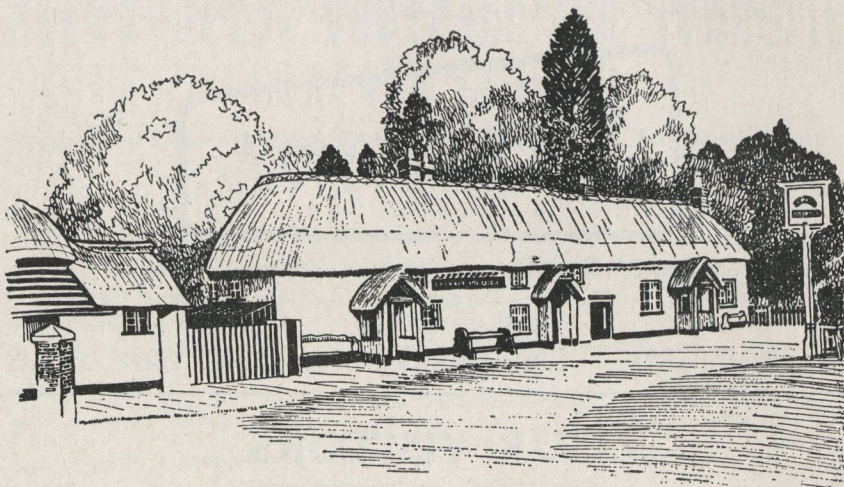

GOSSIP

In case you fancy a flutter you may be interested to know the odds against England winning the World Cup are 18 to one. Argentine, Hungary and Bulgaria who are in the same group as England are rated at 11 to two, 25 to one and 50 to one respectively. So if form—and the odds—work out England at least have a sporting chance of reaching the Semi Final. The favourites are Brazil, the holders of the Golden Jules Rimet Trophy, at three to one.

In all 16 Countries have qualified to go to Chile and to clear up misunderstandings it may not be out of place to clarify how the tournament is run. The 16 Countries have been split into four groups and each group play on a League basis with the two top teams going through to the Quarter Finals. From then on the competition is "Death or Glory" affair on the same principle as our own F.A. Cup competition.

This means then that if, say, England and Argentine, as expected, finish in the two top places in their group they will play off and the winners will qualify for the Semi-Final and meets the winners of the group composed of Switzerland, Chile, West Germany and Italy. In the other Semi-Final the winners of the Brazil, Mexico, Spain and Czechoslovakia group meet the winners of the Russia, Yugoslavia Colombia and Uruguay group, with the Final played at Santiago on June 17th.

One thing that must please all Britishers is that however remote may be England's chances of winning the Trophy our players will go to Chile much better organised and prepared than in any of the previous World Cup series in which we have entered.

They will probably have at least a fortnight in which to get acclimatised in pleasant contrast to 1958 when the players arrived in Sweden only three days before they met the Russians in the opening game of that series.

And that's not all. Toward the end of this month (February) Walter Winterbottom, the England team Manager, will make a 16,000 mile air flip to South America to spy out the land. His ports of call will include Santiago, Montevideo, Buenos Aires and Rio where he hopes to run the rule over Chile, Uruguay, Argentine and Brazil.

It will be the first time the England "Boss" has made such a pre-tour inspection which in itself is indicative of the seriousness with which the F. A. regard the venture.

Another satisfactory feature from an England point of view is that travelling will be reduced to a minimum once the team arrive in Chile as Argentine, Bulgaria and Hungary will all be met on the same ground at Rancagua which, judging by the fact that the government have spent 350,000 Dollars on ground improvements, should be in first class fettle. The players, too, should find the temperature much more to their liking than on some previous excursions to South America.

On second thoughts I'll have an 18 to one shot on England myself!

FROM THE BOARDROOM

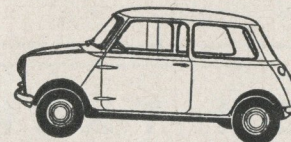
