Club Notes

WE extend a warm welcome to Charlton Athletic on their visit to Kenilworth Road this afternoon in a League 2 fixture. The lads from the Valley have found the going very hard this season and very disappointing for they have been in bottom place of the Division almost the whole season and still occupy that position to-day. They have however closed the gap to only one point from those Clubs occupying second and third places from the bottom but it is noticed that Charlton have three games in hand on Bristol Rovers next to bottom and a game in hand on Middlesbro' in third place so that if the recent improvement in our opponents of to-day continues they should soon be handing over the wooden spoon. Their successes to date in the F.A. Cup have certainly helped to build moral and they will we feel be a much harder nut to crack to-day than when we met them at the Valley last September when we won by an only goal. Charlton's successes in the F.A. Cup have against Scunthorpe United in the Third Round by one goal to nil and against Derby County in the Fourth Round when the score was two goals to one. Charlton had the advantage of playing at home for both Ties and if they can at least hold their own in the Fifth Round when they have to visit Villa Park, then they will have just cause for believing they can look forward to the future with confidence.

Our visit to Southampton last Saturday resulted in the first double being scored against us this season. If the several chances we had had been accepted a different story would have been told but that last effort was always just that much short on top of two miraculous saves by

Reynolds the Saints' goalie which of course had they registered would have almost assured us of a victory which we fully deserved on the run of play. On the three occasions when the goals were scored we had been in possession of the ball and had built up a dangerous position with good midfield play but on each occasion the ball was eventually cleared and in the next few seconds the ball was in our net from long clearances down the field. Freddy Jardine played at Inside Left in an attempt to bring more incisiveness into the forward line following his very good turn-outs in practise matches as well as the splendid game he had at Walsall on Boxing Day in that position when pressed into service due to injuries did not exactly fill the bill although it was not for the want of trying. Tommy McKechnie rested last week is recalled to-day when we hope the short break he has had will have been long enough for him to recover from the many knocks he has suffered lately so that he faces this game to-day rarin' to go. PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Willie Duff (goalkeeper). 5 ft. 11½ ins. 13 st. 13 lbs. An Edinburgh man who gained Scottish League and Scottish Cup winning medals with Hearts before joining Charlton in December, 1956.

John Sewell (right back). 5 ft. 7½ ins. 11 st. 7½ lbs. Played for England at rugby as a schoolboy and was a sprinter with Blackheath Harriers. Signed for Charlton in 1955.

John Hewie (right half). 6 ft. 1½ ins. 11 st. 3½ lbs. South African born, but has many times played for Scotland. His parents are of Scottish descent. Signed in 1949 and has occupied eight different positions for Charlton.

Brian Tocknell (centre or wing half). 5 ft. 11½ ins. 10 st. 8½ lbs. Played for Berea Park, Pretoria, before coming to England to play for Charlton in August 1959. A South African International.

Marvin Hinton (right half or centre half). 5 ft. 10½ ins. 11 st. 11 lbs. Comes from Norwood and captained Charlton's Colts before signing professional in April, 1957. Made League debut at right back, October 1957 at the age of 17.

Michael Bailey (wing half). 5 ft. 7½ ins. 10 st. 12½ lbs. Nineteen year old. Signed for Charlton straight from school at Gorleston in May 1958. Made League debut at Plymouth, December 27th, 1960.

Sam Lawrie (outside right). 5 ft. 5 ins. 10 st. 7½ lbs. A Scotsman who was secured from Middlesbrough in November, 1956.

Roy Matthews (inside forward). 5 ft. 7½ ins. 10 st. 6 lbs. Born in England, but was developed at Arbroath, Scotland, signed for Charlton fours years ago.

Stuart Leary (centre or inside forward). 5 ft. 9½ ins. 11 st. Joined Charlton with Eddie Firmani from Capetown in 1950. Has since made over 300 first team appearances. Played for Young England, 1954. Kent County cricketer.
