

Club Notes

AFTER our very disappointing show here last Saturday when we suffered our biggest defeat for many a long day, certainly since the War, we are hosts to-day to Newcastle United and have much pleasure in receiving them once again at Kenilworth Road. When we played at St. James' Park last September 30th, we lost by four goals to one, our goal being scored by Alwyn McGuffie.

Last Saturday the game at St. James' Park was almost put off because of several players of the Newcastle team during the week having the 'flu but fortunately all was well in the end, the Goordies winning 3-2, two of Newcastle's goals were scored by their recent signings, Barrie Thomas from Scunthorpe United and Jimmy Kerray from Huddersfield whom it is reported have cost the Newcastle Club £68,000 between them. Both players have already played at Kenilworth Road this season and no doubt the goal scored by Thomas for Scunthorpe ten minutes from the end which won the match for them when here last October will still be remembered. To overcome a team of Southampton's calibre after being two goals in arrear is a very fine performance and shows that the Newcastle forward line have found some power. We should have a most interesting match here to-day.

With Alec Ashworth not fit the Manager has given the matter of team selection more than usual thought for this match, especially with regard to the forward line. He decided to leave the defence intact but to change over the wingers who have played in these positions successfully on previous occasions, bring in Mark Lownds who had

quite a successful debut in the Inside Left position against Swansea when he also scored a very nice goal, and to give Tommy McKechnie an opportunity to show his skill in the centre forward position, Gordon Turner to resume his inside right position where he has made his success. It is an attempt to bring some enthusiasm and effectiveness into the forward line and to help us back on the goal-trail again.

We have received some disquietening news this week in that David Brogan after receiving the best medical attention possible since his injury which happened in November, 1960, has been told by the Hospital that he will not be able to play football again as a professional. This news coming on top of the other three youngsters, Leslie Spencer, Jackie Walker and Tommy Brice whose careers as professional players have all been ended during these last twelve months or so has been as big a disappointment to the Club as to the players themselves. We are pleased to note that Tommy Brice and Jackie Walker are able to play in minor football but Leslie Spencer is just able to walk and therefore football for him is definitely out. We have therefore arranged a Testimonial Match for Spencer and Brogan with the International Club XI. on Wednesday evening, March 21st, kick-off 7.15 p.m.

It is too early yet of course to say what the International side will be, but Stanley Matthews has promised to play if at all possible, together with Ted Ditchburn, Ron Burgess, Sam Bartram, Laurie Scott, Wally Barnes, Tommy Docherty, John Carey, Billy Wright, Eddie Bailey, Jackie Milburn, Tom Finney, Jessie Pye and Len Duquemin.

Dave Hollins (goalkeeper). Signed from Brighton & Hove to make the headlines in a great debut against Spurs. A young and capable custodian, having his second season with the Club.

Bill McKinney (full back). Another strong defender of top class. A local discovery.

Alf McMichael (full back). Irish International also secured from Linfield. Born in Belfast. Has been with the Club for 13 years.

Duncan Neale (half back). Born at Ilford and joined Newcastle as a junior from his local club Ilford. Has taken over the position held by Scouler, now with Bradford.

John McGrath (centre half). Signed from Bury for £30,000 plus Bobby Stokoe. Under 23 International. Manchester born. Hefty and strong in the tackle. Rated one of the best pivots in the game.

Jackie Bell (half back). Only 18 when selected as reserve for the Football League against Ireland in the 1958-59 season. Then cartilage trouble and an operation. Local boy who came up through the Newcastle nursery side.

Gordon Hughes (outside right). Was playing for Fatfield Juniors when he had a trial at St. James Park. Showed promising form and was signed in August, 1956. A great-hearted player.

Jim Kerray (inside forward). Signed from Huddersfield Town within the last fortnight at a substantial fee. Formerly with Dumfermline and Raith Rovers, with whom he scored 32 goals in 87 matches.

Barry Thomas (centre forward). Recently signed from Scunthorpe United for a fee reputed to be £45,000. Was one of the Second Division's leading marksmen last season. Gained an England Youth cap while with Leicester and later joined Mansfield Town.

Ivor Allchurch (inside forward). Joined Newcastle from Swansea in October, 1958 in exchange for Reg Davies plus a fee of about £18,000. Swansea was his only Club until the transfer, comparatively late in his career at the age of 28. He played a star part for Wales in the World Cup. He is Captain of the side.

Liam Tuohy (outside left). Eire International. Signed from Shamrock Rovers for a £9,000 fee.


