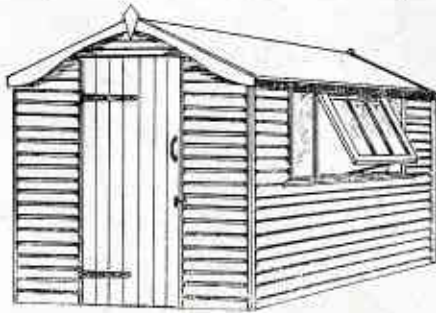

Club Notes

DESPITE our efforts lasting many weeks to sign new players all has ended. not exactly in failure for much ground work for the future has been carried out, but nothing much to show at present for all the endeavour. There are not many Clubs in the land that have not been contacted in some way but it is unfortunately a seller's market and the Fees placed on the various players' heads whom we feel would improve our prospects have all been priced out of our reach. This we do assure you is just not paper talk, for just a few of the players discussed in recent weeks are Collins and Lill of Everton. Wilkinson and Ellis of Sheffield Wednesday. Hauser and Horne of Blackpool. Many people say to us 'Why did we not get Bobby Collins? He is just the man we want.' We most heartily agree that he is a player we want at Kenilworth Road, but when the Fee is £30,000 for a player at over 30 years of age then we say we just cannot afford such money. It is all a matter of finance.

If by obtaining the signature of a player, no matter what his Fee, we could be assured that our income would justify such expenditure then the cheque would be made out. But our financial resources are at present very limited and we just cannot afford to put all our eggs in one basket for if the attempt did not succeed we would do irreparable harm to the future of this Club. As we see it, and it is the conclusion reached after much discussion, we will have to build from Youth by very careful selection in the first place. We have already the nucleus of a promising side in such lads as Leslie Ker, Graham Caleb, Bobby Scott, Mark Lownds, several promising youngsters in the Youth side, as well as the more

experienced players on the books who have youth on their side. As the opportunities arise we shall of course enter the market for experienced players, and as an example of this we only this week made a bid for a very promising Outside Left. We hope it comes off for this lad is the type we are looking for. In addition we were in negotiation with a Second Division Club yesterday (Friday) in a straight exchange. Whether or not the transaction was completed will be known by you all before you read these Notes.

To-day's match revives those great clashes we had with the Norwich Club only three years ago when the winner went forward to Wembley. In those two matches at White Hart Lane and St. Andrew's one hundred and eighty minutes of pulsating football was witnessed, and it was a great pity one of us had to be a loser. Much has happened to both Clubs since those exciting days but the memory lingers on, and our meetings since then have always been eagerly awaited. We trust we witness another exciting match to-day. All the ingredients are there for just such a match for no doubt the Canaries will be all out to avenge that four goal defeat they suffered at our hands at Carrow Road last October as well as to show their new Manager Mr. Willie Reid the Canaries are chirping again. May the best team win.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

'Sandy' Kennon (goalkeeper). South African pop singer-goalkeeper. Came to Norwich on a month's trial from Huddersfield in February, 1959. His month was almost up when injury to regular keeper Ken Nethercott meant first-team debut for Kennon—in sixth round F.A. Cup-tie replay against Sheffield United. From then until the end of last season he missed only one match.

Bryan Thurlow (right back). Norfolk born player who has graduated through Norwich's junior teams to become recognised, last season, by the F.A. for their tour of the Far East. Thurlow gained a regular first team place during the Canaries' Cup run to the semi-final in 1958-59.

Ron Ashman (left back). One of the game's longest serving and most popular players. Joined Norwich just after the war, has played in pretty nearly every position afield, and is now the skipper. Finished last season with 555 League and Cup appearances and was the club's joint overall top scorer with Allcock, on the 55 goal mark.

Ollie Burton (centre or wing half). Signed from Newport County last March for £10,000. Welsh Under-23 star and tipped for Welsh World Cup honours, was born at Chepstow. He can play at centre half, wing half or inside forward.

Barry Butler (centre half). A native of Stockton-on-Tees, signed from Sheffield Wednesday when a Forces member of their staff. Has already set up a record at Norwich for consecutive appearances. Of the 201 with which he ended last season, nearly 200 had been "on the trot."

Joe Mullett (full back or half back). Joined Norwich from Birmingham City, his birthplace, a few seasons ago. Had to

wait "in the wings" for his chance in the first team, but when called on has proved a very effective deputy.

Ray Savino (outside or inside right). Norwich-born discovery whose chances have been limited by the established reputation of the men he has had to understudy. A clever player with a ready shot, he has impressed City followers on his rare first team appearances.

Brian Whitehouse (inside forward). Joined Norwich in March 1960 from West Bromwich Albion (he was born at West Bromwich). Has played at centre forward and outside right but prefers the inside position. Has had plenty of First Division experience and possesses a talented right foot shot.

Terry Allcock (inside or centre forward). "The Count" as he has become known—he's one of the best-dressed men in football—came to Norwich in March, 1958 from Bolton. Born at Leeds. Has twice been City's joint top scorer. A fine wicketkeeper-batsman, he has been capped for Norfolk at cricket.

Jimmy Hill (inside left). Irishman Hill, "Tiger" to his colleagues, came to Norwich from Newcastle as a right winger. A switch to inside left put him in a position in which he has three times been capped by Northern Ireland. His intelligent ball play and quick football brain have helped to create many of the defence-splitting moves that have made the Canaries so attractive to watch.

Derrick Lythgoe (inside forward). City beat the transfer deadline by a few hours in March 1958 when they signed Bolton born Lythgoe from Blackpool. The goals he scored in the few matches that remained helped to keep the Canaries out of the Fourth Division and since then Lythgoe has proved himself a valuable player to have in reserve.
