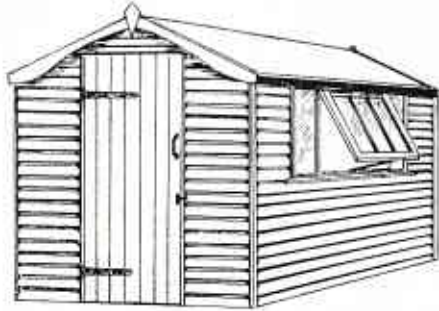

Club Notes

TO-DAY we have the pleasure of the visit of the prospective Champions of League II for Season 1961/62, and extend to them a cordial welcome. At the moment with a lead of seven points over Leyton Orient in second place with two games in hand and only eight to play their return to the premier Division next season is practically assured, but there is many a slip as Southampton found to their cost in Season 1948/49, when at Easter time they were enjoying a lead of 6 points over Fulham with only 6 matches to be played and yet failed to gain promotion to the First Division. Liverpool have been so very near to gaining promotion these last few seasons that it is felt all round they are well worthy of the honour. It is a remarkable record. They were relegated to the Second Division at the end of season 1953/54. In 1954/55 they finished in eleventh place but in 1955/56 in third place as also in 1956/57. In seasons 1957/58 and 1958/59 they finished in fourth place, but in the last two seasons, 1959/60 and 1960/61 they have finished in third place each time. With such a record and a Ground capable of holding over sixty thousand spectators they will certainly be welcomed by the First Division Clubs. Ralph Hunt has been honoured this week by being chosen to play for England against Austria at Wembley next Wednesday, and the other Inside Forward Jim Melia chosen as Reserve. Having Scotland's centre forward Ian St. John also in the side with two fast raiding wingers in Ian Callaghan and Alan Acourt it is no wonder success has come to the Merseysiders this season. Ralph Hunt incidentally scored his 37th goal of the season against Rotherham United last Thursday night, a Liverpool

Club record. We should witness a very exciting match here to-day.

It is with much regret that we record the passing during the week of Mrs. Jeyes, wife of the late Mr. Charles Jeyes, who was President and Chairman of this Club for so many years. Mrs. Jeyes always took the greatest interest in the work of her husband particularly as he often said in his speeches when it was in connection with the Football Club. Mrs. Jeyes had continued to live with her married daughter Mrs. Len Hawkins following the passing of Mr. Jeyes sixteen months ago, but passed away at the home of her other married daughter living in Norwich to whom she had recently gone to stay for a week or so following a month's illness. Cremation took place at The Vale, Stopsley mid-day to-day. We express our sympathies to the family in their sad loss.

Also it is with regret that we refer to the sudden passing on Sunday morning last of Mrs. McMullen, wife of the Hon. Secretary of the Bedfordshire Football Association. It is particularly sad in that her daughter was married the previous day and had left for her honeymoon. Within a few hours of doing so Mrs. McMullen collapsed and died. We extend to the husband and family our deepest sympathies in their very great loss.

Next Saturday morning, kick-off 11 a.m. Luton Schoolboys will be playing Watford Schoolboys for the honour of holding the Seaward Trophy for the next twelve months. We trust quite a few of you will attend which will most probably be the last opportunity of seeing the Schoolboys in action on this Ground this season.
