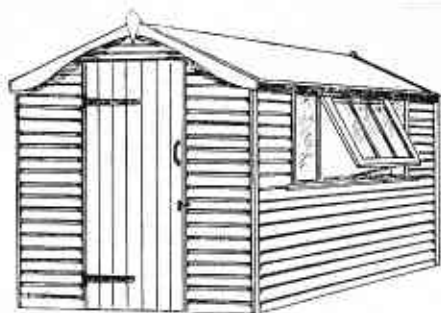

Club Notes

"THE Team of all the Talents" comes to Kenilworth Road for this afternoon's League II fixture, and a very warm welcome is extended to them. Lying in fourth place they still have an outside chance of regaining their position in the First Division, but to do this they must win this match today. Although they have a team of outstanding merit, as a perusal of the Pen Portraits will show, is asking a lot to clinch the deal with us to-day for having in previous years been beaten most decisively by such margins as 7-1, 6-2 and 8-2 (although last season holding us to a 3-3 draw) such defeats must be at the back of their minds as they enter the field this afternoon. The stage is therefore all set for a real ding-dong struggle, a situation which we expect has whetted the appetite of many of our lost fans and whom we hope will be with us to see the struggle for themselves. Certainly if the football produced at the Liverpool match a fortnight ago and that in the second half against Walsall last Wednesday evening could be relied upon then we have no doubt many of those fans of the past who have been missing lately would make sure of seeing the team in action whenever they could. When there is a lot of negative football such as when teams adopt a defensive system comprising of four or five Full Backs and three or four Half-Backs football becomes tedious to watch and the fans just will not spend their time watching it. In Sunderland we know we shall be seeing a game played with attack as the main ingredient for as proof of this they are second only to the leaders in the matter of "goals for" column, with an average

of almost two per match. They have however only three 'away' wins to their credit—Bristol Rovers, Middlesbrough and Preston North End, and five draws away from home. If their away record had been better only Bristol, Swansea and Leeds have won fewer matches away) then Sunderland would most certainly be knocking at the door for entry to the First Division next season.

We gathered two points at home to Walsall last Wednesday evening which have lifted us nicely in the Table. The Walsall lads played very well, particularly in the first half, and we were fortunate to reach lemon time with a clean sheet. Two goals by Gordon Turner however in the second half sealed the Midlander's fate and it became a question towards the end whether or not Turner would get his hat trick. Alan Clarke brought in at Outside Right, his debut in the senior side, proved quite a successful move and we shall see him again in that position this afternoon.

Just recently our playing staff has been increased by three new players, all youngsters who have impressed and whom we hope will soon be knocking at the door for first team duty. First was Barry Scott, wing half or inside forward, from Hatfield Town, 18 years old last Thursday, who has already had three games in the reserves side, then Allan Ross, goalkeeper, from the Scottish Club Petershill Juniors who will be twenty years old in May, and Jim Goldie, from the Scottish Club Kilsyth Rangers, also an inside forward much on the Tommy McKechnie lines. We welcome them all to Kenilworth Road, trusting their stay will be as successful as it is happy.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

James Montgomery (goalkeeper). A young local boy who this season ousted Wakeham from this position. Gained International Caps both as a schoolboy and Youth teams.

Cecil Irwin (right back). This is another local boy who after making two appearances last season, has this season been playing very well and made this position his own.

Len Ashurst (left back). Has been the regular First team choice at left full back for several seasons. Last season he made 40 appearances in the League and has missed few matches this Season.

Martin Harvey (right half). Only gets occasional games owing to the brilliance of Stan Anderson who is today playing for England against Scotland. His outings last season were limited to five in number.

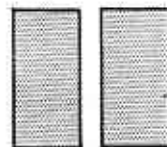
